## LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

STATE OF NEVADA, DEPARTMENT OF STATE,  
CARSON CITY, December 31, 1930.

*To His Excellency, F. B. BALZAR, Governor of Nevada.*

SIR: I have the honor to transmit herewith my fourth biennial report of the Office of Secretary of State for the years 1929-1930. In the several statements submitted will be found sufficient data to show the business of the office.

The total receipts for the years 1927-1928 were \$738,552.66 and for 1929-1930 the sum of \$917,547.63 was realized; an increase over the last biennium of \$178,994.97, or a gain of more than 24%.


Under existing laws certain corporations are required to qualify through three State Departments. State banks and building-loan associations obtaining a yearly license through the office of the State Bank Examiner, while insurance and surety companies, together with their agents, obtain a yearly license through the office of State Controller. The above companies are required to file annual lists of officers with the Secretary of State, and if such list is not filed on or before July 1 of each year the corporation becomes delinquent and forfeits its right to do business in this State, while at the same time it is qualified in another department. The law should be amended so as to correct this situation.

Owing to the compilation of the session laws up to and including 1929, I recommend a reduction in the price of session laws on hand, including Volumes 1 and 2, 1912, and Volume 3, 1919, Revised Laws, recent compilation making these volumes of little value.

Owing to the revenue produced by the four-cent per gallon tax on gasoline, I would recommend automobile licenses be reduced from thirty cents (30¢) per hundred pounds or major fraction thereof, said weight to be the factory advertised weight, to twenty-five cents (25¢).

I take this opportunity to gratefully acknowledge the many courtesies extended this Department by you and other State and county officials.

Salary, \$10 per day, not to exceed \$600, and 15 cents per mile for each mile actually traveled in going to and returning from the place of meeting, which said mileage shall, however, be computed, in all cases, upon the shortest practical routes to the said place of meeting. Also, \$20 for newspapers and stationery.

The contract system having proven unsatisfactory and detrimental to the interests of the State, the Legislature of 1879 reestablished the office under the name of "Superintendent of State Printing" (Stats. 1879, p. 138), and made an appropriation to purchase necessary materials.
