




Top 50 Industries Showing Employment Growth

Number of Nevada's Top 50 Industries Showing Employment Growth Relative to 2007



- The national recession officially began in late-2007.
- The following 10 industries showed growth in every year since 2007: Corporate, Subsidiary, and Regional Managing Offices; Discount Department Stores; Federal Government-Civilian (Excluding Postal Service); Federal Government-Military; General Medical and Surgical Hospitals (Private); Gold Ore Mining; Offices of Dentists; Offices of Physicians (except Mental Health Specialists); Scheduled Passenger Air Transportation; and Warehouse Clubs and Supercenters.
- Between 2007 and 2011, the three industries which experienced the highest percentage growth were Janitorial Services, 28% (2,390 jobs added); Discount Department Stores, 25% (1,367 jobs added); and Federal Government-Civilian (Excluding Postal Service), 24% (2,816 jobs added).
- Full-service restaurants added the most jobs between 2007 and 2011. In 2011, industry jobs totaled 50,917, up from 45,907 jobs in 2007. The 5,010 additional jobs was a 10.9% increase.
- After bottoming out in 2009, the number of industries showing job growth relative to 2007 has slowly increased.
- These trends offer further evidence that Nevada's labor markets have turned the corner.
