




Part Time Employment In Nevada

Nevada Part Time Employment (12 Month Moving Average)



- In June 2012, 31.0 percent of all workers in Nevada were classified as part time.
- Part time work is defined as 1 to 34 hours of work per week.
- Part time workers for economic reasons, sometimes referred to as involuntary part time, are workers who want and are available for full time work but are working part time due to slack or unfavorable business conditions, inability to find full time work, and seasonal declines in demand.
- Part time workers for noneconomic reasons include those working 1 to 34 hours per week due to medical limitations, childcare/family obligations, school, partial retirement, and those who do not want or are unavailable for full time work.
- In June 2012, 38.8 percent of all part time workers in Nevada were working part time due to economic reasons compared to 30.4 percent for the U.S.
