CATCHING UP AREAS NEWEST MAYORS

e are so excited to speak with two of our region's newest mayors, North Las Vegas Mayor Pamela Goynes-Brown and City of Henderson Mayor Michelle Romero.

Mary Beth Sewald: We talk a lot about the strength of females in our communities and you two are just at the pinnacle of your careers. Tell us about your journey as a female and woman leader and where you are now.

Pamela Goynes-Brown: My journey began with a strong foundation. I was lucky to be surrounded by strong women in my life. I look at my mother as a role model in my life. In her journey, she took on an administrator role with the Clark County School District. That's how my journey began as well and that's where I learned to lead. My time in city council consisted of various leadership roles. I was able to lead from many aspects and that really tailored my journey to becoming Mayor. It was a natural progression to use my leadership skills and elevate.

I started as a City of Henderson employee and made my way up the professional ladder. I had some great female mentors along the way. This really gave me the opportunity to spread my

wings. After I retired from the city, I ran for office and became a city councilwoman, and now I am the city Mayor.

Mary Beth: What led you to want to be Mayor?

Pamela: I want to see changes under my leadership. Mayor John Lee was a great leader, a great teacher, a great mentor. He wrote "chapter one" and I'm working on "chapter two."

Michelle: I worked for the city for 25 years so I had great examples of great leaders. Working for the city, I gained some perspective on what works what doesn't, along with what still needs to be done. I think the best way to do something about it is to lead the way.

Mary Beth: There are so many exciting things going on in both cities. Let's talk about economic development and diversification. Tell us about some of the big projects going on in North Las Vegas and Henderson.

Pamela: Focusing on open, public spaces, restaurants I like to boast about, Apex industrial park which comprises 70,000 acres of land, and we're bringing in higher quality companies and higher paying jobs. I like to refer to them as careers because we want our residents to not only have great jobs but long-lasting careers. It's a great opportunity to diversify our economy as well. We are also working on bringing green spaces, micro businesses, housing, retail, restaurants, open spaces, public spaces. Our medical campus is another I like to highlight which is a 125-acre campus that will have a medical research component with green spaces, and open spaces as well. We're really excited about these and I look forward to seeing these projects through as mayor.

Michelle: Haas Automation is probably the biggest project in progress right now with two million square-feet of advanced manufacturing. We are creating 2500 jobs with that project alone. Our downtown water street district is also booming right now. If you haven't been there recently, you wouldn't recognize it today. It really has every kind of option for all residents from family entertainment to dining and also outdoor activities. We have something going on downtown all of the time. We also have our residential communities that are booming such as Inspirada and Cadence. Both are ranked in the top 10 in the entire United States for best/safest communities.

Mary Beth: Workforce is something that is very near and dear to our hearts here at the Vegas Chamber. Our members tell us their biggest challenge is finding a qualified workforce and developing that talent pipeline. Tell us a bit about what you're doing in the city of Henderson around workforce needs.

Michelle: We recognized that people need a great education and they need to start work early so we started our own preschool in the city of Henderson. And we are actively involved through our Community Education Advisory Board so we can work closely with our schools. We also take 30% of our marijuana funds in the city and

any other available funds to use directly for our schools. Separate from that, we partnered with College of Southern Nevada to create our Center for Excellence which is a training facility for advancement which helps develop our workforce talent.

Mary Beth: That program sounds excellent. Did the city of Henderson come up with this program or see it from another model?

Michelle: There are several cities in the country that have a similar program, but we partnered specifically with Cox to develop this program.

Mary Beth: Same question to you Mayor Goynes-Brown. I know workforce development is important for businesses in North Las Vegas as well.

Pamela: We reach out to our businesses to find out what kind of workforce they are looking for. We discuss this with the College of Southern Nevada and Workforce Connections as well. Last year we developed an Education Advocacy Committee. Partnering with our schools is also very helpful. We talk with principals to learn not only about the education but the training as well.

Mary Beth: Mayor Romero, what are some things that attract businesses to the city of Henderson?

Michelle: We have a very friendly business environment. We try to make sure that anyone who comes to the city to start a business has all of the information necessary and the right setup to succeed in doing so.

Mary Beth: Mayor Goynes-Brown, what are some things that attract businesses to the city of North Las Vegas?

Pamela: People obviously have a choice when they decide to move to Southern Nevada. People continue to choose North Las Vegas because we offer everything they need. We have great schools, amazing parks, community events and people want to do business in North Las Vegas as well.

Mary Beth: Great answers. There's so much to look forward to in both cities. Thank you for being great Vegas Chamber partners.

THE FIRM CELEBRATES 30 YEARS OF SUCCESS IN LAS VEGAS

he Firm Public Relations & Marketing recently commemorated 30 years in business with a party themed "30 is a Beach." The group celebrated the anniversary by inviting current clients, past clients, media, vendors and graphic designers to the gathering.

"It was heartwarming to see everyone in the building," said Solveig Raftery, The Firm's President and CFO.

The beach concept included a lifequard station and surfboard, while the milestone earned proclamations from the governor's office and the Clark County commissioner.

Raftery, who grew up in Las Vegas, has spent the past three decades taking the organization on a successful ride.

"We've had slow and steady growth the whole time," she said, giving credit to Senior Vice President Jasen Woehrle and her "amazing" staff. "I'm Impressed every day by what they do."

She said the company offers a good work/ life balance, making sure employees can have personal time. People tend to stay at The Firm for a long time.

Raftery began this journey 30 years ago out of a spare bedroom in her home. Before that she worked for several public relations agencies in Las Vegas, doing some "eye-opening jobs" in which she had a lot of different responsibilities. But she planned to strike out on her own.

"I always knew I was going to start my own business," she said. "I like to be in charge of things. I'm a bad employee."







Working out of her home, Raftery had one employee. By the next year she had moved into an office and hired two more people. She got her own space 17 years ago with a 5,000-square-foot office building. Before the recession forced her to downsize, The Firm had 17 employees. It currently runs "pretty lean" with 13 people on staff.

The Firm, a Women Business Enterprise (WBE) through the Women Business Enterprise National Council, offers organizations a range of strategies for media relations, social media content, corporate training and event management.

While doing business in Las Vegas, the company has worked with a variety of clients, including nuclear scientists, casino moguls and stars of comedy and entertainment.

"We're so fortunate to deal with so many amazing clients," Raftery said.

Working with social media is the industry's most significant change since she has been in the business, Raftery said.

"It's the immediacy today," she said. "It can happen immediately.

> While doing the social media content creation for many clients, Raftery said it's a matter of keeping up the pace, but the platform is a blessing.

> "It's one more avenue to let our clients get their message out there," she said.

The Firm has been a member of the Vegas Chamber for all 30 years and Raftery is an alumni of the Chamber's Leadership Las Vegas program.

"It's a great program to go through, she said. "I'm still friendly with many cohorts."

STRONG CONVENTION YEAR ON TAP FOR LAS **VEGAS IN 2023**

fter the Las Vegas tourism industry experienced a strong 2022, 2023 is poised to be a year of continued growth and recovery for Las Vegas and its all-important meetings and conventions sector. Business travelers help fill rooms mid-week. They also tend to spend more while in town and often attach a leisure trip before or after their work.

In 2022 the Las Vegas Convention and

Visitors Authority (LVCVA) saw tradeshows and convention attendance levels greatly improve, 2022 was the first full calendar year of hosting shows, and every show that was scheduled to return to the Las Vegas Convention Center (LVCC), did. Approximately 850,000 attendees visited the LVCC for 56 events. which included 14 brandnew shows. Throughout the destination's 14 million square feet of meeting and event space, more than 4.9

million visitors had attended a meeting or convention by the close of 2022.

Las Vegas kicked off a strong 2023 calendar year by hosting CES in January, the most influential tech event in the world, which exceeded expectations with an estimated 115,000 attendees from 140 countries. Seven international airlines even added routes specifically for CES. Soon after, Informa Markets hosted World of Concrete and reported pre-pandemic attendance numbers of 60,000. This month will also see the return of CONEXPO-CON/AGG, the tri-yearly show held at the LVCC that typically welcomes

This year, the LVCC will welcome 54

scheduled shows and a projected 1.3 million attendees, including four new shows. 2023 also marks

the start of the LVCC's \$600 million, three-year rolling renovation of its legacy

campus to further grow business travel to Las Vegas. Mandalay Bay has also announced a \$100 million remodel of its 2.1 million-square-foot convention center, which is expected to be completed by the end of 2024.

While leisure travel has fully recovered and visitors continue to fill Las Vegas' 150,000-plus hotel rooms at record levels thanks to the area's worldclass resorts, sizzling entertainment, and major

sporting events, the success of the meeting and tradeshow industry is critical to keeping our great city buzzing year round.

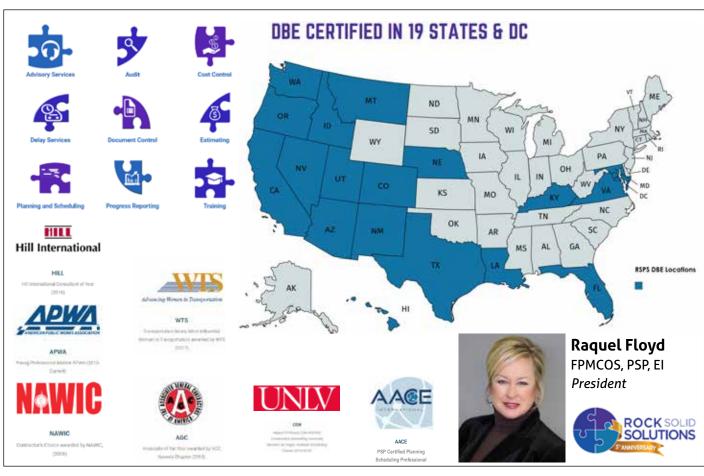

BUSINESSES ENCOURAGED TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF

LANDSCAPE IREBATE WHILE IT'S AVAILABLE

Southern Nevada businesses, HOAs and multifamily properties have until the end of 2026 to replace nonfunctional grass with drip-irrigated plants and trees to comply with a new state law that prohibits use of Colorado River water to irrigate decorative grass. The Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) offers a cash incentive to help defray the costs of landscape upgrades, but SNWA encourages property owners to act now while the current rebate is in effect.

"Some may be putting off the inevitable replacement of their nonfunctional grass for the future, but we're encouraging them to upgrade sooner rather than later," said Zane Marshall, SNWA Deputy General Manager of Water Resources. "Our rebates are uncertain, and we may not fund these mandatory conversions over the full four years."

Currently, the SNWA's Water Smart Landscape Rebate (WSL) awards up to **\$3 per square foot** for grass replaced with water-efficient landscaping (some restrictions apply). Complying with the law now allows qualifying properties to take advantage of the current rebate and also reduces the community's water footprint sooner than if properties wait until a time closer to the deadline.

"The more sustainable we are as a community, the more capacity we have to diversify and grow our economy. Conserving water is more important than ever as we continue to respond to the ongoing drought impacting the Colorado River Basin and federally-mandated shortages that reduced our water supply by 8 billion gallons this year," Marshall said.

The new law – which prohibits decorative grass in streetscapes, medians, parking lots and other areas where it is used for aesthetics and not recreational purposes – will save about 10 percent of the community's water supply when fully enacted.

"The community can reap additional water savings when recreational areas that have cool season grasses are retrofitted with warm season varieties like Bermuda, and our WSL rebate helps defray the cost of those upgrades as well," Marshall said.

In addition to the WSL rebate, the SNWA Water Efficient Technologies (WET) rebate offers financial incentives to commercial and multifamily property owners who install water-efficient devices and technologies. The amount of the rebate depends upon the technology and where that savings occurs – indoors or outdoors.

The WET incentive for evaporative cooling system upgrades was recently increased to cover **50 percent** of the entire project cost – not just equipment replacement – up to **\$500,000** per project. Other WET incentives help off-set the costs for water smart irrigation controllers, ice machines, and almost any technology proven to save water.

"If you're not sure how you can save water, our staff will meet with you to conduct an on-site review and provide suggestions for ways to save, and how our rebates can help cover some of the costs of watersaving upgrades," Marshall said.
