## ACTIVITY AND ACHIEVEMENTS

### September 2007

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#### ADMINISTRATION (ALAN)

1. Met with Ralph Watkins concerning a playa mining site north of Fallon.
2. Interviewed by the Arizona Republic of Phoenix concerning the AZ AML accident.
3. Conducted field interview with Channel 2 news at AML sites near Painted Rock along I-80 east of Reno. Story aired on the news at 5:30 pm, 6:30 pm and 11:00 pm.
4. Participated in the backfills at Ruhestroh and Jumbo. Conducted interviews with all three major TV stations on September 20 at Jumbo and received coverage on all three evening news programs.
5. Discussed the Spruce Mountain AML project with Gary Johnson, BLM Deputy State Director for Minerals.
6. Met with representatives of ORMAT concerning coordination of drilling plans.
7. Provided production information to Ken Brook, Desert Ventures.
8. Spoke with Tony Selig concerning the Manhattan mill.
9. Completed the review of the Major Mines 2006.
10. Completed the review of the NBMG Nevada Mineral Industry 2006.
11. Participated in interview concerning the social responsibility of Newmont being conducted by a third party contractor at the request of the Newmont Board of Directors.
12. Provided information to the Western Governor's Association concerning the Rahall mining law reform bill.
13. Met with Lance Taylor to discuss the Geotemps AML contract.
14. Attended the NvMA annual convention at Lake Tahoe with Commissioners Bryan and Mudge. Assisted the Governor with the Reclamation Awards at the Saturday luncheon.
15. Attended the Governor's Tin Cup Tea with Commissioners DeLong, Parratt, Bryan, and Mudge.
16. Attended the monthly GSN meeting.
17. Attended the Interstate Oil and Gas Compact Commission annual meeting in New Orleans. The decision was made to keep the headquarters in Oklahoma City.
18. Attended the Arizona Geological Society Ores and Orogenesis Symposium in Tucson, AZ. Manned the agency booth and met with many mineral exploration geologists from the US and overseas.
19. Completed work programs for the proposed office expansion and increased funding for out-of-state travel.

#### RECLAMATION BOND POOL (DOUG)

1. Issued 6 notice level bonds for AuEx, Inc., Kinbauri Gold Corp., Western Energy Development Corp., Redstar Gold USA Inc., Cypress Development Corp., and Gold Summit Corporation U.S.A. There are now 122 notice level bonds totaling \$1,062,693.
2. Released one notice level bond for Gold Summit Corporation U.S.A.
3. Issued a notice level bond for Fred Hurt, an individual.
4. Prepared a notice level bond for Mexivada Mining Corporation.
5. Updated the bond pool regs in a nutshell for notice level bonding to reflect the 100% deposit and 3% annual pro-rated premium.

6. Responded to a Canadian auditor about the status of AuEx, Inc.'s reclamation bonds, at the request of AuEx, Inc.
7. Received a call from Tom Nicholas of Precious Metal Recovery Systems (operator of the Bovie-Lew Mine). PMRS is in the bond pool. After the mine actually started producing, the financial partners ousted the operating partners. The operating partners have filed a suit in the Third Judicial District Court (Lyon County).
8. Art Wilson reported the dirt work portion of reclamation is nearly completed at Silverpeak. Art was dismayed about the high cost of seed for the revegetation. Seed costs have risen due to statewide wildland fire rehabilitation requirements.

#### **MINING, LAND AND OTHER ISSUES (DOUG)**

1. Allocated how the \$60,000 in BLM Assistance Agreement money for AML was spent.
2. Helped Alan with the media advisory for the backfill project at the Jumbo Grade area and helped take down fences around the hazards immediately prior to being backfilled.
3. Called Art Wilson about trying to get some old conveyor belting for the backfilling project by Lida/Goldpoint. The dozer will need to cross the highway during the backfill project and we need to protect the highway. Art didn't have any, so I donated twenty 8' x 1.5' pieces of particle board.
4. Attended the Interim Finance Committee (IFC) meeting and received authority to accept \$303,243 in SNPLMA funds for continued AML inventories in Clark County.
5. The Board of Examiners approved the contracts for the Great Basin Institute – Nevada Conservation Corps for the SNPLMA funded AML inventory in Clark County, and Geotemps for 2 people to log and secure AML sites in various areas. Chris Warner of GBI – NCC and Scott Hall of Geotemps were notified of the approval.
6. Helped Alan with the narratives for the reclamation awards and attended the Award Luncheon at the NvMA's Convention at Lake Tahoe.
7. Sent historic opal production information to Cecilie Hewitt, a granddaughter of an opal mine owner.
8. Supplied Jo Rendulic of the Nevada State Bank with mineral production, employment, and reserve information for Elko County and surrounding areas. This is background information for a general obligation bond Elko County is planning to issue to fund a new or remodeled county courthouse.
9. Figured out the cumulative gold production in Nevada. From 1859 to the end of 2006, Nevada's mines have produced 169.53 million ounces of gold.
10. Reconciled mineral production values with NBMG. Reviewed proof of Major Mines – 2006.
11. Met with the building manager about our proposed expansion. Checked the new area to map out existing electrical and computer outlets.
12. Spoke with Jeanie Smithson of Enviroscentists about the Atlanta Mine.
13. Referred a person needing brucite to Premier Chemicals at Gabbs.
14. Called Premier Chemicals near Gabbs for approval to store the steel for building the bat gates for the Downeyville project. Coeur Rochester is contracting out this project.
15. Helped Wanda with 2 work programs; one for out of state travel, and one for the possible office expansion.
16. Signed geothermal permit #716 for TG Power LLC.

#### **AML / PUBLIC AWARENESS - NORTH (MIKE)**

1. Answered questions from the media regarding AML issues in response to the recent Arizona AML incident.
2. Contractors bidding on Downeyville closure work, as part of Coeur's SEP, asked for some additional mitigation requirement information which was supplied to them.

3. Participated with Chris Ross (BLM-NSO) in the PUF closure of orphan hazard WA-270 near Perry Canyon. This is a fully timbered shaft that could not be backfilled due to its timbered collar and required foam closure instead. More than seven feet of foam and approximately one foot of dirt fill now occupy the timbered framing and secure this feature. The PUF material was supplied by BLM and the framing materials and PPE equipment were supplied by DOM.
4. Kris Urquhart (NDOW) requested and received a spreadsheet containing hazards inventoried by DOM and found to contain water.
5. Spoke with Amber Fortner (URS Corp. - SLC, UT) regarding their interest in performing AML inventory and securing work in Nevada as a contractor. Also added The Xcavation Company (Kamas, UT) to our contractor list as a bat gating contractor.
6. Received requests for additional hazard location information from two claimants in Storey County. Maps and photos sent to claimants.
7. Provided photos of hazard inventory and securing work to reporter Shari Adams (Humboldt Sun newspaper) for an article on AML work in Humboldt County.
8. Provided hazard inventory numbers to Deb McFarlane (BLM-Elko) for use in AML reconnaissance efforts in the Contact region.
9. Reviewed Downeyville hazard mitigation proposals by bidders for Coeur's SEP and provided comments to Coeur. Coeur Rochester selected Rob Cordtz (Richland, Oregon) as their contractor for the abandoned mine hazard securing work at Downeyville. As part of the contract, 17 hazards will be backfilled and five hazards will be secured with bat-compatible closures. Based on the previously accepted SRCE-generated closure costs the total for these 22 closures is \$52,809.11, which according to Casey Kiel (Coeur) would fulfill their obligation to the State.
10. Communicated with Kelley Chamberlain (Miner's Contracting) regarding securing work being performed on the behalf of Canyon Copper in Mineral County.
11. Discussions were held with Jenni Jeffers (NDOW) and Jennifer Newmark (NV Natural Heritage) regarding the exclusion and closure of several sites of concern at Jumbo and New Washoe. Paul Buffington and I erected exclusion netting at three sites needing such work 72 hours prior to backfilling.
12. With NvMA's inability to secure a dozer for the planned backfill work in northern Nevada, three equipment rental companies were contacted. Coan Equipment (Sparks) was the only company with suitable equipment available for use beginning September 17<sup>th</sup>. A visit with Dustin Coan to discuss details and review the rental contract, allowed Paul Buffington the opportunity to inspect and operate the Caterpillar D-5N dozer. Arrangements were made with SRT Transport to mob/demob the Cat to/from each of three backfill locations.
13. Supervised the northern Nevada backfill program with 27 abandoned mine hazards secured by backfilling in Douglas and Washoe counties.
14. Met with TV media at Jumbo backfill site and provided background information, interviews and transportation to media personnel.
15. Backfilling of five (low hazard) sites at New Washoe was postponed until later this year due to dozer mobilization issues.
16. All photographs documenting the backfill work at Ruhestroth and Jumbo were downloaded and archived. Once the files have been properly named, copies of the images will be provided to BLM-CC for inclusion in the proper paperwork to the SHPO.
17. Communicated with Scott Hall (Geotemps) to provide a contractor to help with the northern backfill efforts and plan for additional contractor for planned Lida/Gold Point backfills.
18. Communicated with Geotemps regarding contractor work schedules for upcoming Lida/Gold Point backfills and thereafter.

19. Cashman Equipment donated (via NvMA) the use of a D-6 dozer for the Lida and Gold Point backfills, which were then scheduled for October 1-12.
20. Two contractors for Geotemps (John Morley and Ken Wilson) began work on the \$50,000 Fall Work Program to assist the AML Program with inventory and securing work. They covered 12 abandoned mine openings requiring bat exclusion netting in the Lida/Gold Point area prior to the initiation of the backfill program, scheduled for October 1<sup>st</sup>. During the 6-8 day backfill program they will assist with fence and/or netting removal and perform inventory work as time allows.
21. Arranged for DAT training for Paul and Geotemps contractors with Susan McCabe (BLM-CC).
22. Lyle Lehman, American Borate, informed NDOM that they intend to blast closed the two remaining openings at the Anniversary Mine (Clark Co.) the week of October 8<sup>th</sup>. They have also notified Bryan Moore (NPS-Lake Mead) that they will be transporting heavy equipment and explosives across the Park property to accomplish this securing.
23. Arranged travel plans for trip to NAAML (National Association of Abandoned Mine Land Programs) Annual Conference in Bloomington, Indiana in October. DOM is interested in becoming a member. Membership is determined by a vote of existing members and our request will be added to the Conference agenda.
24. Two Rocks/Minerals/AML presentations provided to two 5<sup>th</sup>-grade classes at Grace Warner Elementary School, Reno. (2 presentations – 57 students)
25. AML presentations provided at Dayton Valley Days, Dayton. (1 presentation – 50 people)
26. Communicated with Frank Self (Barrick-Ruby Hill) regarding his request for AML education and outreach materials for their upcoming participation in the Eureka Health Fair. A variety of materials was shipped to him for their assistance in our Stay Out, Stay Alive outreach program.
27. Drove agency vehicle with display booth and outreach materials to Tucson, Arizona and attended the Arizona Geological Society's Ores and Orogenesis Symposium. The display was shared with NBMG and promoted the geological, educational and public safety work performed in Nevada to approximately 900 attendees. Publications, including the 2006 AML Report and 2006 Major Mines, were made available along with the usual outreach materials (pens, pencils, stickers, and magnets).
28. A request for an AML Eagle Project was received from a scout in Elko, which makes two for Elko. Suitable sites will need to be researched and will require reconnaissance visits soon before winter-like weather sets in.

#### **AML / GIS (PAUL)**

1. Worked on Cultural Resource Avoidance Certification forms. Printed pictures for each corresponding hazard and checked each form for missed information and mistakes.
2. Mike Visher and I went to the storage units and loaded supplies for a project at Perry Canyon. We inventoried what we had and made a list of the supplies we needed for the project then went to Home Depot and purchased the needed supplies.
3. Mike Visher and I met with Chris Ross at the Reno BLM office at 8:00am and headed out to Perry Canyon to foam shut a timbered shaft, hazard ID number WA-270. After building a false bottom we poured approximately five feet of foam in 18 inch lifts. Between lifts we waited 20 minutes monitoring the temp of the foam with an infrared thermometer. It was decided that the last lift would be poured on Friday by Mike and Chris to allow the lower lifts of foam to cool overnight.
4. Mike Visher and I checked some hazards that had been previously backfilled in the Perry Canyon area. Mike wanted to make sure that the fill had not settled or been compromised in any other way.

5. Gave two Rocks/Minerals and AML presentations to two fifth grade classes at the Grace Warner Elementary School in Reno.
6. Made maps with the ARCGIS software of hazards ST-71 and ST-72 as well as maps for the backfill sites at Jumbo, New Washoe, and Ruhenstroth.
7. Received boundary maps via e-mail from Ken Maas of the USFS for the Humbolt-Toiyabe Ranger Districts.
8. Downloaded some missing segments of our NAID30Min maps. Eric Warmath of NDOT provided a link to an FTP site where the maps could be acquired.
9. Accompanied Mike Visher to Coan Equipment where we met with Dustin Coan to discuss leasing a D-5N dozer for the use in backfilling the Jumbo, New Washoe, and Ruhenstroth sites. Got acquainted with the machine and its controls.
10. Mike Visher and I installed exclusion netting for possible bat habitat on hazards in the New Washoe and Jumbo areas.
11. Copied maps from our Maxtor hard drive to a passport drive and mailed to Dave Brickey of TerraSpectra. Dave wanted these maps to update the GIS system in the NDOM Las Vegas office.
12. Met with Mike Visher, Susan McCabe a BLM Archeologist, Chris Ross of the AML program for the BLM, and John Morley of Geotemps.
13. After receiving delivery of the D-5N dozer, I started backfilling hazards at the Ruhenstroth site under direction of Mike Visher, Susan McCabe, and Chris Ross.
14. Finished the backfill projects at the Ruhenstroth and Jumbo sites and decided to postpone backfilling the five low hazard sites at New Washoe until later this year due to issues with mobilization of the dozer.
15. Mike Visher and I communicated with Bill Durbin over the telephone about the proposed Goldpoint/Lida backfill sites. We discussed a timeframe and order for the backfilling.
16. Received a call from Rich Starkweather who was calling on behalf of Aladdin Sweepstakes Consolidated concerning a letter that they had received from us about hazard number EL-16. The claim name of EL-16 is Maggie 24. Rich stated that although they owned a claim named Maggie they were not the owners of Maggie 24. He also said that all of the claims owned by Aladdin Sweepstakes are south of I-80 and EL-16 is north of I-80. After talking with Rich, I discussed this issue with Linda Wells and changed the ownership for EL-16 to unknown until further research could be done.
17. Called Rich Starkweather back as a follow up on the claim Maggie 24 and informed him of what we had done. Linda Wells sent a letter to Aladdin Sweepstake Consolidated informing them that we had changed the status of the ownership on EL-16 and that we would reinvestigate the ownership.
18. Met with Chris Ross of the BLM AML program and got some bat exclusion netting he had for the backfill jobs at Gold Point and Lida.
19. Met with John Moyer and Ken Wilson of Geotemps and went over the forms and processes used when logging hazards. John had previous experience working with us logging and securing but Ken was new to this. I supplied them with the forms used and the materials needed for the job.
20. Went to the storage unit and picked up the supplies needed for the backfill jobs at Gold Point and Lida. Went to Home Depot and buy more stakes for the bat exclusion netting.
21. Met with the Geotemps Thursday morning and transferred the supplies for the Gold Point/Lida backfills into their pickup. After giving them the supplies needed they left for the backfill sites to install the exclusion netting on the hazards that required it.
22. Made my hotel reservations and purchased my plane tickets for the Northwest Mining Association's annual meeting in Spokane, WA in December.

## **AML / PUBLIC AWARENESS - SOUTH (BILL)**

1. As follow-up to the Arizona abandoned mine fatality, gave the following interviews on Nevada's AML program: KLAS TV Channel 8 (in the LV office), KLAS TV Channel 8 (in the field at AML sites near Nelson), KVVU Fox 5 (in the field at AML site south of Henderson), Las Vegas Review-Journal (in the field at AML sites south of Henderson), Call-in to the Fox 5 "Rant" – responded to a caller who claimed that nothing was being done in Nevada about AML (the "Rant" is part of the morning news show where callers air their views).
2. Inspected and photographed the five backfilled AML sites on the Best Bet claims off of West Warm Springs Road. The work is of excellent quality and the hazards are permanently closed.
3. Claimants near Nelson have been notified by letter that two hazards on their claims are in serious need of re-securing – one hazard is ranked HIGH.
4. Las Vegas office is continuing to review Clark County topographic maps to identify and count un-logged AML hazards and prospects in preparation for the Nevada Conservation Corps field investigations program.
5. Investigated and ranked 14 hazards and logged 36 non-hazards in Clark County.
6. Met with NDEP staff regarding the Three Kids Mine in Henderson and possible AML public safety issues. The site will be visited on Sept. 11 by NDEP, NDOM and staff of the environmental contractor.
7. Visited the Three Kids Mine in Henderson with NDEP staff and environmental program contractor/coordinator for the Three Kids remediation project. Discussed AML securing issues for three of the Three Kids open pits and one mine shaft. One of the open pits and one shaft are on BLM lands – one open pit is within the boundaries of private land, Bureau of Reclamation land and BLM land. More work is needed to complete the AML inventory at the site – we have the complete cooperation of the environmental contractor as he is concerned with trespass by ATV operators. ATV tracks were observed within 4' of a 175' tall open pit high wall at the Hulin pit on BLM land.
8. Conducted a reconnaissance tour of 17 AML hazards in the Goodsprings area proposed for bat gate or PUF closure with staff from the Bureau of Reclamation construction crew (SNPLMA Round 5 mine closure project).
9. Toured AML sites near Nelson with David Brickey of Terra Spectra Geomatics to observe and gain familiarity with GIS equipment and automated site inventory techniques.
10. The Las Vegas office was notified by the Las Vegas BLM Field Office that an official re-survey of the Ruby Silver and Galena patented claims (MS 1853) at the Argentina Mine shows without question that NDOM-investigated hazards CL-1286 through 1307 are all within the boundary of the claims. This includes CL-1302-1306 which NDOM had listed as "orphans". Some were found to be just a few feet inside the claim boundary by the surveyor. The survey was contracted by the law firm representing the Argentina Consolidated Mining Company.
11. Request for authorization to fence two sites on the BLM portion of the Three Kids Mine complex prepared and sent to BLM-Las Vegas.
12. Investigated and ranked one hazard near Indian Springs – Clark County – response to citizen call.
13. Assisted Bureau of Reclamation staff with site inspection and discussion of closure methods for three large, interconnected hazards near Goodsprings.
14. Contacts were made with two local heavy equipment companies in search for a dozer for the Lida/Gold Point AML backfill project.
15. Met with Cashman Equipment to arrange for a D-6 dozer and transportation for the Lida/Gold Point AML backfill project. Cashman will contact DeLong Heavy Haul for dozer

transport. The equipment will be available from October 1 through 12. Round Mountain Gold has committed a dozer operator for the week days during the two-week period. 63 hazards are cleared for backfill.

16. Received confirmation from Cashman Equipment on the use of a D-6 dozer for the Lida/Gold Point backfill project; transportation will be provided by DeLong Heavy Haul; Round Mountain Gold Company will furnish equipment operator Troy Hawkins. The team is scheduled to meet on Monday, October 1 at the Lida Junction turnoff at 9:30 AM.
17. Met with Chris Warner of Great Basin Institute – planning session for the Nevada Conservation Corps AML inventory project in Clark County.
18. Arranged to meet with the lead man for the Nevada Conservation Corps Clark County AML inventory project on September 27-28.
19. Met with Nevada Conservation Corps lead-man Daniel Nielson to discuss the Clark County AML inventory project and worked two days in the field investigating and ranking hazards and logging non-hazards.
20. Conducted project reconnaissance trips for Eagle Scout candidates Jacob Trotter (#84) and Daniel Baird (#92). Daniel's project is scheduled for September 30.
21. Attended the Las Vegas Hard Assets Investment Conference.
22. Attended a Nevada Mining Association Education Committee meeting – Reno. Planning meeting for 2008 earth science education workshops.
23. Attended a meeting of the Clark County School District School Naming Committee – McCaw Board staff and others petitioned to have an elementary school named in honor of former McCaw Foundation Board member, the late Dale Schiedeman.
24. Working with McCaw School of Mines staff and other Board members on the 2007 Gala event.
25. Chaired a McCaw School of Mines Foundation Board meeting.
26. Taught minerals/commodities, AML and “Birdseed Mining” for 4 classes of 5<sup>th</sup> graders at McCaw Elementary School (4 presentations – total of 120 students).
