



After over ten years of planning and work, Douglas County in cooperation with ten other governmental agencies is moving forward on completing the first phase of the Stateline to Stateline Bikeway Project. This aggressive project approved by the Legislature with State Question One money is now in the final environmental review process. Construction is expected in 2011 and 2012, completing Phase 1 of the Stateline Bikeway Project from Kahle Drive road to Roundhill Pines. It is estimated from use analysis studies that once completed, this bike path will be the most popular bike path in America.

Douglas County is excited about being the first phase of this important project and supports its construction. Douglas County Parks & Recreation Department believes that this project will go a long way to stimulate the economy in Douglas County adding to the recreation elements which already contribute to the tourism industry within the state of Nevada. With the competition in the gaming industry it is important for Douglas County to take a leadership role in developing outdoor recreation opportunities that add to the quality of life for its residents as well as add to and stimulate our economy.

We look forward to updating the public as this important project takes off. In time it is envisioned to have a bike path from the casino core all the way to North Shore, uninterrupted and for recreational use. This first step to Roundhill Pines shows Douglas County's leadership in the State of Nevada and the tourism industry.





The site was the central property of the Dangberg Land & Live Stock Co., at one time one of Carson Valley's largest ranches.


