Title: Commission Regulation CR24-13

Description: The Commission will review and may take action to approve the Department's recommendations identified in CR24-13 Draft Review for upland game and furbearer seasons and limits for the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 seasons.

Presenter: Wildlife Staff Specialist Justin Small and Russell Woolstenhulme

Summary:

CR24-13

The Department's Game Division has prepared recommendations for Commission Regulation CR24-13 for upland game and furbearer seasons for the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 seasons. Some notable changes compared to previous years include the following:

Youth Seasons

- Youth seasons will extend for their normal 9-day period (e.g., September 28 – October 6th, 2024); however, we have elected to split chukar and Hungarian (Gray) partridge seasons into their own species groups and limits will no longer be considered "in the aggregate". The daily and possession limit for chukar will remain at 6 and 18 respectively while the limits for Hungarian (Gray) partridge are recommended to be 4 and 12. These limits are also reflected in the normal general season as well.

Sage-grouse

- We are recommending a 9-day season in certain hunt units in Elko County (062, 064, 067, 071-076, 101 and 102) and in Eureka, Lander and Nye Counties (161, 162, 172 and 173), with a daily

- limit of 2 and possession limit of 2.
- We are recommending a two-day season for hunt units 012 and 013 in western Nevada and hunt units 031 and 051 in north central Nevada, with a daily and possession limit of 2 sage-grouse.
 - These units, or groups of units, have sage-grouse populations estimated to exceed 1,000 birds and where harvest was estimated to be 5% or less of the estimated fall population.
- No special sage-grouse season is being recommended for the Sheldon National Wildlife Refuge.
- These recommended changes represent the additional opening of 3 hunt units compared to those that were open last season.

Dusky, Sooty and Ruffed Grouse

- No changes

Snowcock

- No changes

*Chukar**

- Recommend October 12, 2024 – February 2, 2025
- Recommend October 11, 2025 – February 1, 2026
- Daily limit of 6 with a possession limit of 18

*Hungarian (Gray) Partridge**

- Recommend October 12, 2024 – February 2, 2025
- Recommend October 11, 2025 – February 1, 2026
- Daily limit of 4 with a possession limit of 12

*Partridge species will no longer be considered “in the aggregate” as specific daily and possession limits are applied to each species.

California Quail

- No changes

Gambel’s Quail

- No changes

Mountain Quail

- No changes

Pheasant

- No changes

White-tailed Jackrabbits and Cottontail Rabbits

- No changes
- No hunting season for pygmy rabbit remains.

Junior Wild Turkey

- Recommendation to expand the junior season one additional week on the frontend of the season structure (e.g., March 22 – May 4, 2025).
- Tag numbers will be held constant with last season.

Wild Turkey Spring Limited Entry Hunt

- Some modifications to tag numbers are being recommended.
- We are recommending closing Hunt Unit 101 in Elko County due to low turkey populations and reducing the chance of a hunt season having an additive effect to population stability.

Falconry Seasons

- No changes

Furbearer Seasons

Bobcat

- Recommending change to bobcat sealing dates. Change would allow an individual to have a single bobcat per year for taxidermy or tanning purposes to be sealed at any of the NDOW Regional Offices (Elko, Las Vegas and Reno). Dates open for regional office sealing are from the Season Opener until the first regularly scheduled sealing date (mid-January).

Recommendation:

The Department recommends that the Commission **VOTE TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS PROVIDED IN CR24-13 FOR THE 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 SEASONS AS PRESENTED.**

Taxidermy Pelt Sealing: From the opening day of the bobcat season (November 1) until the first regularly scheduled bobcat sealing date in January, any person who wishes to have a single bobcat (1 per person per season) sealed for the purpose of tanning or taxidermy may personally present the lawfully taken pelt to any Nevada Department of Wildlife Regional office (Elko, Las Vegas, Reno) and request to have the Departments seal affixed to the pelt. All requirements of NAC 502.347 apply.

Pelt sealing, other than a single exception for taxidermy sealings, will be done only on the dates and during the times specified. Sealing locations will be at Department offices unless otherwise noted.
