2011 Legislative Session Wrap-Up

The Nevada Legislature ended its 2011 biennial session on June 7. Few bills were introduced that would effect the board and the licensing of the design professions.

The bill with the biggest impact on the board was [SB251](#), which created the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission. Under the new law, most state boards and commissions will undergo a review to determine whether the board or commission should be terminated, modified, consolidated with another agency or continued. The boards must undergo a review at least every 10 years.

Other bills amended the state's Open Meeting Law and will require minor changes to how the board notices and conducts its meetings.

Disciplinary Actions (March 17 – June 15, 2011)

Inquiries are routinely sent to both registrants and non-registrants for alleged violations of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Nevada Administrative Codes (NAC). There were six cases this period that were submitted for board consideration and approved. Additionally, six cases were closed because there was no basis for the allegations or the complaint did not fall within the board's jurisdiction.

The following cases were closed by means of settlement agreement. As part of the agreement, respondents agreed to assure compliance with Chapter 623. Should the respondent be involved in a subsequent case and found to have again violated a NRS or NAC, the case may be used as an aggravating factor.

Holding Oneself Out and/or Putting Out Any Sign, Card or Other Device: NRS 623.360.1(a)(b)

Case No. 11-017N

The allegations against *Scott Theobald, Kent Craven, Dennis Adderley* and *Architectural Design West* were that they held themselves out as being qualified to provide architectural services without having a certificate of registration issued by

the board. The matter was resolved through a settlement agreement incorporating an administrative penalty of \$2,500 and investigative costs of \$1,500.

Holding Oneself Out and Engaging in the Practice of Architecture, Interior Design or Residential Design: NRS 623.360.1(a)(b)(c)

Case No. 09-004N

The allegations against *Kris Londahl, Edward Elbers and King Retail Solutions, Inc.* were that they held themselves out as being qualified to provide services that fall under the practices of architecture and registered interior design, and practiced as architects and registered interior designers, without having a certificate of registration issued by the board. The matter was resolved through a settlement agreement incorporating an administrative penalty of \$20,000 and investigative costs of \$2,300.

Case No. 09-010N

The allegations against *Lionel Ohayon and ICRAVE* were that they held themselves out as being qualified to provide services that fall under the practice of architecture and practiced as architects, without having a certificate of registration issued by the board. The matter was resolved through a settlement agreement incorporating an administrative penalty of \$29,000 and investigative costs of \$2,000.

Case No. 11-026N

The allegations against *Chris Layton and Chris Layton & Associates, Inc.* were that they held themselves out as being qualified to provide services that fall under the practice of architecture and practiced as architects, without having a certificate of registration issued by the board. The matter was resolved through a settlement agreement incorporating an administrative penalty of \$10,000 and investigative costs of \$1,500.

Case No. 11-030N

The allegations against *Amy Kim and AK Design Network* were that they held themselves out as being qualified to provide services that fall under the practices of architecture and registered interior design, and practiced as architects and registered interior designers, without having a certificate of registration issued by the board. The matter was resolved through a settlement agreement incorporating an administrative penalty of \$12,500 and investigative costs of \$1,800.

Engaging in the Practice of Architecture, Interior Design or Residential Design: NRS 623.360.1(c)

Case No. 11-031N

The allegations against *Curtis Miner* and *Curtis Miner Architecture, LLC* were that they practiced as architects without having a certificate of registration issued by the board. The matter was resolved through a settlement agreement incorporating an administrative penalty of \$5,000 and investigative costs of \$1,000.
