Legislature Provides Funds for School Bus Transportation to Nevada State Museums By Peter Barton

Education is at the foundation of, and is the primary goal for all museums. Incubating, stimulating, and curating memory is central to achieving engagement with our audiences, regardless of age. We use objects and artifacts as windows to tell stories of the past and make them relevant to today. Without a constant focus on education a museum will lose relevance and turn back in time to when museums were perceived as attics or warehouses for old "stuff."

Despite our investments in effective education, what if the audience can't get to our door? Well, over the last decade the Nevada State Museums have witnessed a double-digit decline in attendance by students from K-12 schools. When we probed for the reason for the decline, educators and parents almost universally cited that schools could no longer afford the cost of transporting students outside the classroom and to our museums. Field trips and museum

visits were becoming a thing of the past as school district budgets tightened and transportation costs escalated. How could we reverse the trend?

In a pre-session hearing leading up to the 2017 Nevada Legislative session this issue was raised by the Division of Museums & History. District 19 Assemblyman Chris Edwards spoke up and questioned what it would cost if the State were to offset transportation costs to bring K-12

students to one of the seven State Museums. Determining that was no small task as there is no consistency between school districts as to how transportation costs are calculated and assessed to a particular classroom. Nonetheless we persevered and provided the requested information, to the best of our ability. Then — nothing — silence — up until our budget closing hearing when the issue came up again.

Without any further input from the Division, the budget committees moved to include new funding in the Division's budget, to pilot a school bus transportation reimbursement program for all public, private, and charter schools in Nevada. \$250,000 was provided in each year of the 2018-2019 biennium to pilot the program.

On November 7, 2017 the Division launched the new bus transportation reimbursement program and began to aggressively market it to educators across the State. While the program provided funding for the transportation reimbursements, it did not provide for additional staff to manage this complex agenda. So we turned to technology via a web-based application to manage the program logistics.

Educators can request a museum tour and school bus transportation reimbursement via a single transaction on each of the State museum websites. Internal procedures to support the program, encumber funds, and authorize payments to school districts is largely automated as well.

While we are only about 100 days into the program, we thus far have close to 5,000 students from 64 schools in 81 buses who have visited or are scheduled to visit as a result of this new opportunity this calendar year. We anticipate those numbers will skyrocket as we get close-in on the Spring and the time of the school year

when most museum visits occur.

One way you can help us is by getting the word out that the cost of transportation to our museums is no longer an impediment to having every Nevada school student visit a Nevada State Museum. The result for the student is lasting – new, enduring memories, and an appreciation for the trailblazing spirit of Nevadans over time. .

Sabbatical Renews Priest's Spirit

After 32 years of ministry as a Roman Catholic priest, I was granted sabbatical time for renewal. Besides time for study and spiritual practices, I was encouraged to devote some time to my avocations. As someone who has been fascinated by trains and steam power from childhood, to be able to spend time learning, working, and experiencing the NSRM as part of a sabbatical was a great opportunity.

Working in the restoration shop was a fascinating trip through railroad history. The careful research of materials, paint schemes, and colors was far more detailed than most would expect. The historic Virginia and Truckee Coach #17 was

a lesson in just of few of the techniques of preservation and restoration. This coach started its life on the Central Pacific as a business car and carried the golden spike to Promontory. Later it came to the V&T who converted it to a coach. It finished its life in Hollywood as a movie prop. The conservation of such an artifact seems much like peeling an onion layer by layer. Each newly revealed layer raises new questions. There are also guestions as to which period the car might be restored, as well as the careful examination of the many layers of paint to learn what might be the original colors and so many more historical details of its construction.

The museum is especially fortunate that its collections are not merely static. Without the operation of some equipment, it is very difficult to properly interpret the artifacts in the collection. The museum is fortunate to have an expert staff to maintain and volunteers to operate the equipment. Having some experience in the operation of steam locomotives, it was a great thrill for me to have my hand on the throttle of the Glenbrook narrow gauge engine. I have long admired Dan Markoff's "Eureka", another Baldwin engine built in 1875. That locomotive gave me a real love of wood burners and the narrow gauge. It is awesome to think that the Glenbrook, the Invo, and the Eureka, all built by Baldwin for Nevada's railroads, first shared space on the factory floor in 1875. It is a tribute to the State of Nevada that all three of these locomotives are restored and operational and two of them share a home at NSRM!

Besides these activities, I had some time to work on a more personal project. Several years ago, I purchased the wheels and axles and some rough plans to build a rail rider. A

rail rider is something on the order of a speeder built on a simple frame. With a lot of direction and help from the guys in the shop, my project moved forward slowly. The project provided an opportunity to learn some machining skills in the shop in order to make or adjust parts. The project came together near the end of my time at the museum. The finished rail rider can seat two or three people and is powered with either human effort via bicycle pedals or a gasoline engine. We quickly learned that uphill is much more fun with the engine! She was christened "The Marvelous Melba" to honor the memory of my mother. Kevin Owens secured permission for a test run on the rails of the historic Virginia and Truckee Railroad. She performed flawlessly all the way up to Virginia City and back!

I am grateful to the museum director, staff and the Friends of the NSRM for their gracious hospitality. I am especially grateful to Chris DeWitt and all of the restoration shop staff for sharing their extensive knowledge and experience.

working with the kids, so I thought, 'Why don't we do a program of our own,'" Kapahee said.

So Adam Michalski, the museum's curator of education, museum attendant Cristol Digangi and Kapahee put their heads together and a new program was born.

"Story Time," made its debut on February 24 with about a dozen youngsters hearing the story of "The Little Engine That Could." The program will continue every other Saturday in the Jacobsen Interpretive Center. As the weather gets warmer, the program is likely to switch from inside to on board one of the museum's trains.

For Kapahee, the combination of children, reading and trains is a delight. After working in the library system in Washoe County, she and her husband, George, retired and moved to Carson City from Reno last year.

"I was with the library system in Washoe County for a number of years," she said. "I was the marketing coordinator over adult programming and also got involved with the children's librarians. I loved the kids and their love of reading. I saw how it changed lives. We would bring in these school children for reading and doing crafts. I just saw what a difference it made with the kids." After moving to Carson City, Kapahee became involved with the railroad museum through a longtime friendship with Dr. Rebecca Bevans and the Friends of the Nevada State Railroad Museum.

"I love trains," she said. "I al-

ways have. At Disneyland, that was my favorite thing to do." Kapahee volunteered with the museum's Harvest Train program in the fall and Santa Train program during the holiday season.

She sees great potential for the Story Time program. The museum has a number of train-related children's books, including the home-grown "The Legend of Whistlin' Billy," written by museum volunteers Loren Jahn and Jane O'Cain and published by the Friends of the Nevada State Railroad Museum.

"This is a coloring book and we'll be adding that in for the kids and I expect to start doing some crafts eventually as well," she said.

The Story Time program is free for children and admission is \$6 for adults.
