


WELCOME TO NEVADA!

Nevada stands apart from other states. Here, you'll find the quintessential tourist experience of Las Vegas as well as the scenic rural towns of Ely, Panaca and Tonopah, and everything in between. From the growing downtown scene in Reno — the town recently chosen by Tesla Motors as the site of its future gigafactory — to the cowboy traditions of Elko, home of the National Cowboy Poetry Gathering, Nevada offers its guests a wealth of diversity.

Road trips are at the heart of the Nevada experience. I've traveled the state's highways and byways, both with my family and while promoting

TravelNevada's Discover Your Nevada campaign. Every trip, I've been enriched by the people I've met and the sites I've seen. I encourage you to embark on your own Nevada adventure, and this guide, packed full of travel itineraries, is the perfect place to start.

You may already know that Nevada is the most mountainous state in the lower 48 states, but did you know that several hundred mountain ranges cross its landscape, including the Sierra Nevada in the west and the Ruby Mountains in the east? Drive the Interstate 80-U.S. 50 loop from Reno and you'll pass over many mountain ranges while taking in spectacular sites along the way, including Great



Basin National Park, historic mining towns along the Loneliest Highway and the California Trail Interpretive Center near Elko.

Nevada is known for the engineering marvel that is Hoover Dam, dedicated in 1935, which harnessed the power of the Colorado River to generate hydroelectric power for use in Nevada, Arizona and California. Just 26 miles from Las Vegas, it's one of many day trips to take when making the city your base camp.

Among the many scenic byways you'll find in Nevada is Pyramid Lake Scenic Byway on Pyramid Lake Paiute tribal land in northern Nevada. The desert lake is a remnant of ancient Lake Lahontan, a colossal inland sea that once covered most of

Nevada. Along the byway, you'll find the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Museum and Visitors Center, a great place to learn about the area's cultural history.

There's so much to do and discover in Nevada, as you will see in this guide. Welcome to our state, and enjoy your adventure!

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



NEW IN NEVADA

Blue Genes Jam, a music/lifestyle festival celebrating the invention of blue jeans in Reno, will debut Oct. 2-4, 2015. In addition to rock and country music concerts, there will be a retail marketplace for vintage and designer jeans; a mini-film festival; denim fashion shows; scholarly presentations on the history of blue jeans; and more.

The historical **Cal Neva Resort & Casino**, once owned by Frank Sinatra, is set to reopen in December 2015 following an extensive renovation project. The 10-story, 191-key Lake Tahoe resort will have a non-smoking casino, a spa and pool. The Cal Neva's signature Circle Bar will remain, as well as the resort's theater, The Showroom.

The 188-room **Cromwell**, a boutique hotel on the Las Vegas Strip, opened in spring 2014. The Cromwell features modern and vintage design, with Parisian-themed rooms outfitted with hardwood floors and plush furnishings. The hotel is home to Giada, the first restaurant helmed by Emmy-award winning celebrity chef Giada De Laurentiis; Drai's Beach Club-Nightclub; and a casino.

The **Delano Las Vegas**, formerly The Hotel, opened September on the Las Vegas Strip with rooms redesigned in the Delano's iconic South Beach style and an emphasis on personalized service. The property's 43-story tower includes Franklin, an eclectic lounge featuring up-and-coming DJs; 2940 Coffee + Tea; Della's Kitchen; and BATHOUSE Spa, which infuses soothing elements of locally sourced ingredients.

Gilley's Restaurant and Nightclub opened its doors in June at the Nugget in Sparks. Mechanical bull riding, offered every night of the week, is a top draw, along with line dancing, live music and DJs. Gilley's menu features barbecued steaks, pork and chicken. Gilley's also has a Trading Post store carrying Western and logo wear.

Set to open in early 2015, **Grand Bazaar Shops** outside of Bally's on the Las Vegas Strip boasts 150 shops on a two-acre site, as well as food, dining and bar venues. The shopping mecca is designed to reference the world's greatest open-air markets, among them Istanbul's Grand Bazaar, Jerusalem's Old Market and London's Portobello Road, and features a vibrantly colored rooftop design.

Hard Rock Hotel & Casino, formerly the Horizon in Stateline, is slated to open in January 2015 — in time for the Reno-Tahoe ski season. In addition to a 25,000-square-foot casino, the property will include more than 500 renovated hotel rooms, new restaurants and bars and an outdoor pool, as well as an assortment of live entertainment venues, both indoors and out.

Heavenly Mountain Resort in Stateline, known for world-class skiing, expanded its summer options in 2014 when it rolled out the 3,300-foot-long Blue Streak Zip Line and three ropes challenges courses at the top of the Heavenly Gondola. Families and first-timers may appreciate the Boulder Cove ropes course, while the Black Bear course presents a more challenging option. The Forest Canopy course is set among the trees.

Heritage restaurant, an enterprise of celebrity chef Mark Estee, opened in May inside the Whitney Peak Hotel in Reno. The 4,000-square-foot dining room sports a clean, clever design, with an open kitchen and a bar that serves craft beers and local wines. The Heritage menu draws heavily on locally inspired cuisine and features a seasonally driven menu.

Jetpack America, which offers the experience of flying over water with a jet pack, opened a flight center Oct. 16 at Spring Mountain Motorsports Ranch in Pahrump. At the center, first-time pilots can learn to operate the jet packs from certified pilots in 15-minute to 60-minute flight packages.

Lex nightclub opened its doors in July at the Grand Sierra Resort in Reno. The 25,000-square-foot club has an indoor pool partially covered by a glass dance floor, three bars and 33 VIP tables. Nine skylights plus a \$2 million lighting system add to the atmosphere at this nightspot.

LINQ Hotel & Casino — formerly the Quad — opened in October on the Las Vegas Strip with 2,256 brand-new rooms and suites. The LINQ sports a signature lobby bar, all-new retail and spa amenities and a new pool deck. The property is connected to the High Roller observation wheel and LINQ retail-dining-entertainment promenade.

SLS Las Vegas Hotel & Casino reopened in summer 2014 on the former Sahara site on the north end of the Las Vegas Strip. The hotel's 1,600 rooms and suites are spread over three hotel towers — Story, Lux and World — each with its own personality; there's also two expansive pools, several restaurants and nightclubs.

Tonopah Brewing Company opened its doors in September in Tonopah. The brewery, tap house and pub serves up craft brews, including India and American pale ales, pilsner, hefeweizen, Irish red ale and seasonal brews. The pub menu features barbecue items.

And the town of Austin along U.S. 50 opened the **Austin Visitors Center** in June. Outdoor interpretive panels tell the story of this mining town formed in the 1860s after the discovery of silver ore in the area.

BASE CAMP: LAS VEGAS — FOUR DAYS, MILEAGE VARIABLE



Day 1

RED ROCK CANYON: Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area is a popular hiking and rock climbing destination. There are several trailheads along the 13-mile scenic loop drive.

BONNIE SPRINGS RANCH: This family-friendly destination offers a rootin' tootin' taste of the West with horseback rides, a zoo, a replica of a Western mining town circa 1880, mock gunfights in the streets, shops and dining.

GOODSPRINGS: Goodsprings' claim to fame is the Pioneer Saloon, favored by motorcyclists and history buffs. This is where Clark Gable sat for three days waiting to hear of the fate of his love, Carole Lombard, after her airplane crashed in the rural mountains of Nevada. The saloon is filled with decades of memorabilia, and rumor has it that there are still bullet holes in the walls from gunfights a century ago.



Day 2

LAUGHLIN: Large hotel-resorts line the Colorado River in this small gaming town off U.S. 95. Visitors can lounge by the river, rent boats or Jet Skis, or explore the numerous outdoor destinations, including Big Bend of the Colorado State Recreation Area, Black Mountains, and Lake Mohave.

Day 3

BOULDER CITY: Founded in the 1930s for the builders of the Hoover Dam, Boulder City is one of two towns in Nevada where gaming is illegal. The Nevada State Railroad Museum, Boulder City, offers a look at Nevada's locomotive past, as well as rides aboard the Nevada Southern Railway.

HOOVER DAM: Hoover Dam is a world-famous man-made wonder. Allow a little extra time to walk across the Mike O' Callaghan-Pat Tillman Memorial Bridge, which will give you the best, unobstructed views of the dam.


VALLEY OF FIRE: If you packed your hiking shoes, now is the time to take a scenic drive along Lake Mead from Hoover Dam to Valley of Fire State Park, one of southern Nevada's natural wonders, deeply carved rock formations in fiery hues.

LOST CITY MUSEUM: This state museum is dedicated to the history of Nevada's indigenous tribes. The museum features artifacts from Pueblo Grande de Nevada, a tribal settlement excavated nearby, and a reconstructed adobe village.

Day 4

DEATH VALLEY: Gas up the car, buy food and water and sunscreen in Pahrump, and then venture into the unparalleled landscape that is Death Valley National Park. Some of the park's highlights easily visited in one day are Dante's View, Badwater Basin, Devil's Golf Course, Artists Palette, Zabriskie Point, and Furnace Creek. The park is open year-round, but some services are limited in the summer months.

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

BASE CAMP: RENO — FOUR DAYS, MILEAGE VARIABLE

Day 1

Arrive in Reno by plane, train or automobile and get ready for your adventure!

PYRAMID LAKE: Spend the day exploring this ethereal lake about 51 minutes from Reno. The Pyramid Lake National Scenic Byway is the only national scenic byway entirely within an American Indian reservation. To the northwest is the trout hatchery at Sutcliffe.


If you head southeast, you can follow the highway around the bottom half of the lake and see Anaho Island, which is one of the largest nesting areas for pelicans in North America. Watch the

diving birds of prey before continuing on to Nixon. Here you can visit the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Visitors Center and Museum. Learn about the tribe and hear traditional folk stories, including how the rock formation called Stone Mother got her name.

Day 2

VIRGINIA CITY: Step back in time - 150 years to be exact - when you enter Virginia City, only 26 miles from downtown Reno. Wooden sidewalks, saloons, Mark Twain artifacts and memorabilia, and a whole lot of fun await in this town best known as the home of the Cartwrights in "Bonanza." A trolley ride is the best way to learn the history of the town and see the sights before spending the day shopping, taking old-fashioned photos, and sidling up to a genu-wine saloon bar. There are plenty of restaurants and B&Bs, as well as a large hotel, for those who wish to forgo the serpentine mountain road back to Reno in the dark.

Day 3

CARSON CITY: The state capital is only 31 miles south of Reno, making it an easy day trip from the Biggest Little City. Some highlights along main street include the Capitol building, the Nevada State Museum, and the Nevada State Railroad Museum, which often runs diesel or steam trains for visitors.

For those who are interested in the city's history, the Kit Carson Trail Walking Tour is a self-guided walk to many of the historic homes in downtown. The downtown district is lined with shops and award-winning restaurants ranging from Thai cuisine to English pub fare.

Carson Valley is just a short drive farther south on U.S. 395 and is marked by its vast ranches, quaint antique shops and Victorian homes. One of Nevada's four wineries has a tasting room and restaurant in Carson Valley - a perfect place for a wine-tasting break during your shopping.

Day 4

LAKE TAHOE: Described by Mark Twain as "the fairest picture the whole earth affords," Lake Tahoe is a jewel in Nevada's crown. The north shore is anchored by the town of Incline Village, which boasts two golf courses, a ski resort, and a lakefront hotel. The town of Stateline holds court on the south shore and is known for its large-scale casino-resorts, Heavenly Mountain Resort, and Edgewood Tahoe Golf Course.

In the summer, the lake is abuzz with water and beach fun, hiking on the Tahoe Rim Trail, and bicycling. The winter months turn Tahoe into a skiers' paradise. Tahoe has the highest concentration of skiable terrain in North America, and resorts that are easily accessible from Reno via car or shuttle service. One could easily spend a week at Lake Tahoe, so if one day doesn't do it for you, use this guide to plan your next trip too!

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
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HIGHWAY 95 — SIX DAYS, 477 MILES/767 KM

Day 1

RENO: U.S. 95 cuts north-south through western Nevada, linking Reno to mining towns and ghost towns to the bright lights of Las Vegas.

FALLON: One of the largest cities you'll encounter on this stretch of highway, Fallon is where you can restock your road-trip essentials. If you spend time here, commune with nature at the Stillwater National Wildlife Refuge. Or fill up on authentic Basque cuisine at the Overland Hotel in downtown Fallon.

Day 2

HAWTHORNE: The glassy surface of Walker Lake beckons water-sports enthusiasts and nature-seekers. In town, visit the (free!) Hawthorne Ordnance Museum, which boasts an impressive collection of wartime memorabilia and vintage U.S. weaponry.

Day 3

TONOPAH: Learn why this town was once called the "Queen of the Silver Camps" at the Tonopah Historic Mining Park behind the Mizpah Hotel and the Jim Butler Inn and Suites. These two hotels are right in the middle of the action, and the Mizpah even boasts its own resident ghost, the Lady in Red!



Day 4


GOLDFIELD: Slowly approaching ghost-town status, this formerly booming mining town still has a spark of mystery and is steeped in Nevada history. Visit the Goldfield High School where the famous Nelson-Gans fight was held, and peek in the windows – if you dare! – of the uber-haunted Goldfield Hotel. And yes, those are dozens of automobiles planted in the desert you see; that’s the International Car Forest of the Last Church, a larger-than-life art installation on the outskirts of Goldfield.

Day 5


BEATTY/RHYOLITE: Get yer cowboy on in Beatty, a lively little town on the eastern edge of Death Valley National Park. With watering holes like the Happy Burro Chili and Beer, KC’s Outpost, and the Sourdough Saloon, you can find a drink or bite to eat. Be sure to take the short detour to Rhyolite, one of the most photogenic ghost towns in the West. Catch the light just right as it reflects off the 50,000 bottles that compose the Bottle House, and wander through the Goldwell Open Air Art Museum.

Day 6

BIG DUNE/AMARGOSA VALLEY: Feel like getting some grit in your teeth? Pull over at Big Dune, a 1.5-square-mile sand dune that reaches 300-feet high above Amargosa Valley. Watch out for dune buggies, and proceed with caution in the shifting sand.



SOUTHERN NEVADA — WILD, WEIRD & WONDERFUL FOUR DAYS, 564 MILES/907 KM

Day 1

DISTANCE: 160 MILES/258 KM: Rev your engines in Las Vegas and take off for the open road. Your first stop will be Valley of Fire State Park. Only an hour from Sin City, it feels like another world. Movie makers think so too, and that's why this valley of red and orange sandstone was featured in such movies as "Star Trek: Generations" and "Transformers."

On U.S. 93, we suggest parking at the Pahranagat National Wildlife Refuge office and taking a short walk across the highway to view the Pahranagat Man, an ancient Indian drawing on the rock face.

Your stop for the night will be in the town of Alamo. Luxury accommodations can be found at A Cowboy's Dream Bed and Breakfast. Just up the road is Windmill Ridge, which boasts a cluster of cabins behind a family-run restaurant, and is in the price range of most travelers.







RACHEL, DISTANCE: 160 MILES/258 KM: Spend the morning exploring if you want to arrive at your next stop, Rachel, around lunchtime so you can enjoy the famous Alien Burger at the Little A'Le'Inn. Rachel is on the Extraterrestrial Highway and is the center of many otherworldly encounters. You may see a spaceship hovering over the famed Black Mailbox, where aliens reportedly pick up their mail. If you arrive too early for lunch, the Little A'Le'Inn offers a variety of dishes and refreshments, served with a heaping side of extraterrestrial lore.

TONOPAH: Keep watch overhead as you near Tonopah, because you may just see some military air maneuvers as you skirt the famed Area 51 to the south.

Tonopah was once called the Queen of the Silver Camps, and your first stop should be the Tonopah Historic Mining Park. Another must-see is the Central Nevada Museum, voted the Best Rural Museum in the state by Nevada Magazine readers.

The Jim Butler Motel and the Mizpah Hotel both are located in the heart of town within easy walking distance to shopping and dining. The Mizpah is a historic gem that was renovated and reopened in 2011, and like all great Nevada landmarks, is rumored to be haunted.





Day 3

GOLDFIELD, DISTANCE: 94 MILES/151 KM, AND ANY EXTRA EXPLORING YOU DECIDE TO DO: You'll begin heading south on U.S. 95 toward Las Vegas, but don't worry, your adventure is far from over. Take your time driving through Goldfield, about 30 minutes south of Tonopah, and stop at the Goldfield High School, where the famed Nelson-Gans boxing match of 1906 took place. This changed the face of boxing in the West and put the then-booming town of Goldfield on the map.

BEATTY: Your next stop is only an hour away in Beatty, and this will be your base camp for the next 24 hours. Beatty is the eastern gateway to Death Valley National Park; from here you can access such iconic sites as Zabriskie Point, Badwater Basin, Devil's Golf Course, and Artist's Drive. Return to Beatty at your leisure and sidle on up to the bar at the town's old-fashioned saloons and restaurants.

Day 4

PAHRUMP, DISTANCE: 150 MILES/241 KM: On your way out of town, take the short detour to Rhyolite, one of the most photographed ghost towns in the West. It's well worth the 10-minute drive from Beatty on your way to Pahrump.

Pahrump is a bustling bedroom community to Las Vegas and home to two of Nevada's four wineries. We recommend staying long enough to eat some lunch and taste some wine before continuing on to Las Vegas.

You've come a long way, and now it's time to end your trek in Las Vegas. But the fun doesn't have to stop: you are in the Entertainment Capital of the World, after all!

INTERSTATE 80 AND HIGHWAY 50 LOOP — FIVE DAYS, 788 MILES/1,268 KM

Day 1

LOVELOCK, DISTANCE: 288 MILES/463.5 KM: From Reno, Lovelock is your first stop headed east on Interstate 80, and this little town is the perfect place to surprise your loved one by “locking your love” at Lovers Lock Plaza behind the Pershing County Courthouse. Keep the lock’s key as a token of your love or throw it away to observe the ancient Chinese custom that says as long as your lock remains on the chain, your love will endure.


As you continue east, take the time to appreciate Nevada’s western heritage by driving through Winnemucca rather than bypassing it on the freeway.

ELKO, DISTANCE: 288 MILES/463.5 KM: As you near Elko, you’ll see the California Trail Interpretive Center on your left. This is a superb study of the explorers who headed west on the California Trail and the trials they endured. It’s situated right on the trail within view of the Hastings Cutoff, a supposed shortcut to California taken by the doomed Donner Party.

You’ll spend the night in Elko, where there are plenty of hotels, and countless restaurants. The Star Hotel is a Basque restaurant that is a must-see during your stay in Elko.


Day 2

Elko is a bona fide cowboy town, host to the annual National Cowboy Poetry Gathering held in January and a vibrant hub of ranching and mining in eastern Nevada. Spend some time downtown at the Western Folklife Center or venture out to Lamoille Canyon and the Ruby Mountains.

At the end of your trip, mail your guide to TravelNevada, and you will get a certificate commemorating your travels as well as an "I Survived Highway 50" pin. Day 3

ELY, 180 MILES/289.7 KM: Say goodbye to Elko as you venture eastward toward Wells and then south toward Ely. On your way, be sure to visit the McGill Drugstore Museum, a drugstore frozen in time, complete with a 1930s soda fountain. Call ahead to arrange a tour.

Hotel Nevada in Ely is a perennial favorite, with its movie-star theme rooms and taxidermy trophies scattered throughout the casino. As you explore Ely, you'll find a fascinating Renaissance Village with reconstructed homes decorated to honor the nationalities and cultures of people who settled the area, including Chinese, Italian, French, and Greek. Also scattered throughout town are murals depicting Ely's history, larger-than-life images of the railroad, a Basque shepherd, the Pony Express, and miners.

Day 4

GREAT BASIN NATIONAL PARK: Don't check out of your hotel; Ely will be your home for one more night. Today you'll want to take the hour's drive to Great Basin National Park. The naturally ornate Lehman Caves are open year-round, while the park's high-elevation trails are weather-dependent. In the summer months, a hike to the ancient bristlecone pine trees – some of which are more than 3,000 years old – will be an unforgettable experience. Other outdoor recreation can be found at Cave Lake State Park.

This is also a good day to visit the East Ely Depot Museum and take a ride on the Ghost Train. Railroads are a big part of Nevada's history, and the Ghost Train is one of the iconic steam engines of the West.

Day 5

EUREKA & AUSTIN, 180 MILES/289.7 KM: 320 MILES/514.9 KM: Your return to Reno will take about five hours if you don't stop, but we don't recommend that! Head west on Highway 50, also known as the "Loneliest Road in America," and stop in Eureka to tour the Eureka Opera House, the Eureka Sentinel Museum, and the courthouse. About an hour farther west is Austin, a quintessential American town with small shops lining the main street and a historic saloon anchoring the west end of town. Check out the St. Augustine's Catholic Church, which was built in 1886 and recently renovated and turned into a cultural center.

FALLON: As you continue west toward Fallon, keep your eyes to the sky and you may see military aircraft performing training maneuvers! The famed Top Gun program is at Naval Air Station, Fallon, and fighter jets are a common sight above Highway 50. You may want to stop at Sand Mountain, a two-mile-long sand dune tucked into the base of the mountains on your right. You can also take a short walk to the ruins of a Pony Express Station here.

You'll rejoin I-80 at the town of Fernley, and conclude your journey back to Reno.

HIGHWAY 50 EXPLORE MORE DETOURS - VENTURE OFF THE HIGHWAY TO SEE MORE OF NEVADA'S HIDDEN GEMS...

WARD CHARCOAL OVENS: Just 18 miles south of Ely on a well-graded gravel road that may not be accessible in inclement weather. Ward Charcoal Ovens is a set of six 30-foot-high beehive-shaped ovens used in the 1870s by the nearby silver mines. Visitors still can smell smoke emanating from the 20-inch-thick stone walls.

GARNET HILL: Located just a few miles west of Ely. Visitors can mine their own garnets from the volcanic rock set aside on two square miles of land outside of Ely. There is limited camping space, and access to the area is free.

TOQUIMA CAVE AND PETROGLYPH SITE: Approximately 13 miles east of Austin, 12 miles of which are on gravel road. A half-mile trail to the cave begins at the campground, which offers free parking and camping. The cave entrance is fenced off, but petroglyphs are visible and date to about 600 to 1300 AD.


STOKES CASTLE: On the west end of Austin. This three-story stone "castle" was built as a summer home by Anson Phelps Stokes, a mine developer and railroad magnate. It was completed in 1897 but was only used for a few months before it was abandoned by the family. Visitors cannot enter the castle, but it is easily viewable, and the surrounding valley panorama alone is worth the detour.

COLD SPRINGS STATION: Approximately 50 miles west of Austin and 60 miles east of Fallon. The remnants of an 1860 Pony Express station stand nearby the current restaurant, RV park, and convenience store. This is a great place to rest and refresh, especially if you're hungry! The restaurant serves hearty homemade fare.

SAND MOUNTAIN: Just 25 miles east of Fallon on Highway 50. When you turn off the highway toward Sand Mountain, you will pass the remains of a Pony Express station on the left. Sand Mountain is two miles long and 600 feet high, and known as a "singing dune" because it seems to hum as the wind whips over the sand. Off-road enthusiasts love to zip up and down the sand dune, and dry-camping is welcomed.

GRIMES POINT ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREA: Just a short 10-minute drive east of Fallon. Grimes Point is a collection of petroglyphs left on the rocks by Native Americans more than 8,000 years ago. A self-guided trail takes visitors through the collection with interpretive signs along the way. Hidden Cave is just a mile from Grimes Point and is an important archaeological dig site. Check with the Churchill County Museum for tour information.

CHURCHILL VINEYARDS: Approximately 10 minutes south of Fallon on U.S. 93. Churchill Vineyards and Frey Ranch Distillery is the only Nevada winery producing estate white wines. And in 2014, the Frey family officially launched the first commercial distillery, featuring all estate-produced vodka, gin, bourbon, and single-malt whiskey. Tours are available by appointment only.

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HIGHWAY 93 PARKS – LAS VEGAS TO ELY — TWO DAYS, 367 MILES / 590 KM

Day 1

Some of the best outdoor adventures can be had in Nevada's 23 state parks ranging from the blazing sandstone of Valley of Fire to the cool depths of Lake Tahoe Nevada State Park. Several parks in Eastern Nevada are linked by U.S. 93, creating a perfect route for leaving Las Vegas.

VALLEY OF FIRE: Petroglyphs carved deep into the fiery sandstone reveal messages the meanings of which we can only ponder. Primitive carvings of bighorn sheep, rivers, swirls and shapes decorate the walls of the valley, urging visitors to guess what they may have meant 3,000 years ago and could mean today. Vivid yellow, orange and red rocks stained with a black "desert patina" evoke images of embers escaping the coals of a campfire. This is a must-see escape only an hour from Las Vegas.

KERSHAW-RYAN: Nowhere is the contrast of wild and tame so stark as in Kershaw-Ryan State Park. Visitors are greeted by





a well-maintained RV campground, manicured lawn and roses, picnic tables, and a shallow wading pool. Just beyond this idyllic picnic spot loom rugged stone cliffs carved with hiking trails. This park, about three and a half hours from Las Vegas, is a hidden treasure among Nevada's wildest terrain.

CATHEDRAL GORGE: A short half-hour from Kershaw-Ryan lies yet another gem in the state park system. Cathedral Gorge is easily missed by drivers along U.S. 93 because its clay spires and towers are hidden in a valley carved by eons of erosion. Volcanic ash settled hundreds of feet thick and then, through the wonder of millions of years of erosion and tectonics, great spires, bluffs, and slot canyons were carved into the clay. In 1935, it became one of Nevada's first state parks, captivating visitors from around the world.

We recommend you spend the night in the historic Overland Hotel in Pioche or in the modern-yet-rustic cabins of Windmill Ridge in Alamo before continuing your journey through Nevada's eastern state parks.

Day 2

WARD CHARCOAL OVENS: Six beehive-shaped stone ovens 30 feet high stand sentinel at the base of the Egan Mountain Range about a half-hour south of Ely. These ovens were used in the 1870s to slowly burn wood and transform it into charcoal, which was used by the nearby silver mines. Visitors still can smell a hint of pungent smoke seeping from the 20-inch-thick stone walls.

CAVE LAKE STATE PARK: A glistening high-elevation lake in the middle of the Schell Creek Range beckons hikers, anglers, and adventure junkies all year long. Just far enough off the main highway to get away with a little mischief, the lake is also home to some seriously offbeat events, including bathtub races affectionately called “Cocktails and Cannons” for the drinks and random cannon-firing that happens throughout the July weekend. The lake freezes in winter and hosts the White Pine Fire & Ice Show in January. This ice-sculpture competition is punctuated by fireworks in the evening hours.

When you arrive in Ely, only 20 minutes from Cave Lake, you’ll have a wide selection of hotels and restaurants to help you refresh from your journey through eastern Nevada. From here, you can plan a side trip to Great Basin National Park, only an hour from Ely. Great Basin is the only national park entirely within Nevada, and boasts wonderful hiking trails, ancient bristlecone pine trees, and all-season access to the Lehman Caves.

MORE STATE PARKS

Nevada's network of 23 state parks spans all corners of the Silver State and all types of adventure and activities.

BERLIN-ICHTHYOSAUR: Located near the center of the state and about two and a half hours south of Austin, Berlin-Ichthyosaur is a curious blend of history. Berlin was a 1890s mining town that happens to be adjacent to an ancient ichthyosaur fossil site. Visitors can tour the ghost town, mill, and mine, then venture to the fossil site to view North America's largest concentration of ichthyosaur fossils.

FORT CHURCHILL: Ruins of an 1860s U.S. Army fort near U.S. 50 and U.S. 95 in northern Nevada are a fascinating backdrop for hiking, biking, camping, and touring the fort. Across the highway is Buckland Station, a former Pony Express

station and ranch that supplied emigrants, travelers, and the soldiers at Fort Churchill.

MORMON STATION: Tucked into the base of the eastern Sierra Nevada about 45 minutes south of Reno is Genoa, the site of Nevada's first permanent settlement. Mormon settlers built a trading post that later was used by the Pony Express and future travelers. Visitors can tour the museum, stockade and wagon shed, and surrounding park.

RYE PATCH RESERVOIR: Just north of Interstate 80 near Lovelock is the 22-mile-long Rye Patch Reservoir, used for camping, fishing, boating, swimming, and of course, exploring.

SPRING MOUNTAIN RANCH: This western ranch home once owned by eccentric millionaire Howard Hughes gives visitors a peek into ranching life as it was in the early 20th century. The park is just 15 miles west of Las Vegas, but seemingly in another world backed by the vivid red cliffs of Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area and the lush green grounds of the ranch. Tours are available year-round.

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HOT SPRINGS

Soak your cares away, warm your bones, and just forget about the world when you dip into one of Nevada's natural hot springs. There are many hot springs open to the public throughout the state, but here are some of our favorites.

SPENCER HOT SPRINGS – South of U.S. 50 near Austin: A hot-tub-sized dipping pool has been created at the upper spring and is lined with flat stones, offering a very primitive version of a hot tub. The lower spring offers a smaller metal dipping pool where you can regulate the temperature of the water flowing through a small pipe. The water flowing out of the tub continues on its path downhill, creating several smaller pools, giving unique life to the desert. A couple dozen goldfish live in the springs' runoff, calling the warm water home year round.

Several metal fire pits near the springs create primitive camping areas. There is room to park trailers or set up tents; however, if you camp, set up a good distance away from the soaking pools to avoid infringing on others' ability to enjoy the springs.

Getting there: From Austin, travel approximately 12 miles east on U.S. 50 to the intersection with Nevada state Route 376. Turn south on S.R. 376, and after 0.3 miles, take an immediate left onto a dirt road (marked by a road sign for Toquima Cave). Travel on the dirt road for approximately 6 miles. The springs will be on your left.


LEACH HOT SPRINGS – SOUTH OF INTERSTATE 80 NEAR WINNEMUCCA: Located south of Winnemucca via Grass Valley Road, Leach Hot Springs is a great destination for amateurs. With a very large area to soak, the springs are the perfect starting point for those looking to test the waters. A well-maintained dirt road allows most vehicles access. Visitors should be advised that although the swimming portion of the springs is on public property, the source of the springs is not, and is very dangerous to approach. The springs offer no campground amenities.

Getting there: From Winnemucca, travel south on Grass Valley Road for approximately 13 miles. When the pavement ends, continue on Grass Valley Road for another 15 miles. The springs will be on your right.

SOLDIER MEADOW HOT SPRINGS – NORTH OF GERLACH NEAR BLACK ROCK DESERT: North of the Black Rock Desert and Gerlach lies a remote soaking area, Soldier Meadows Hot Springs. The springs at Soldier Meadows form a hot creek in which man-made dams cause hot-tub-sized dipping pools to form. According to Bureau of Land Management, the area includes seven semi-primitive camping facilities (parking areas and fire pits), a vault toilet, and walking trails that lead to the springs. The area also includes a primitive cabin available for public use on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Because of approximately 60 miles of dirt road between the Black Rock Desert and the springs, a four-wheel drive vehicle is recommended. BLM suggests people making the trip carry two spare tires. The area is very remote and can be difficult to find.

Getting there: From Gerlach, travel north on County Road 34 for approximately 13 miles. Take a slight right on to Soldier Meadows Road, and travel approximately 47 miles. The springs will be on your left.



HIGHEST PEAKS

Nevada has more than 300 mountain ranges and peaks, which is a lot of ground to cover. But there are only a handful of peaks so high, so breathtaking, that summiting them is more than an accomplishment, it's a test of personal fortitude. Here are the top peaks to cross off your summit list in Nevada.

BOUNDARY PEAK: Boundary Peak is Nevada's highest point (13,141 feet), towering over the California-Nevada border almost directly west of Goldfield. On U.S. 6, traveling west, you pass the ghost town of Mount Montgomery. You also can explore a few abandoned mining camps after turning southeast on Queen Canyon Road. In the winter months, how far you get up this dirt road via a four-wheel-drive vehicle is going to determine how long the trip takes. Trail Canyon Saddle (about 10,800 feet) is an ideal base camp before setting out for the summit, which will likely take a full day. Given our four-hour drive from Reno to Queen Mine, the trip took two full days.

If you're making a winter ascent, dress in layers, bring something to melt snow for drinking water, and be prepared for a wide range of conditions (in a normal or high snow year, crampons, an ice axe, rope, and snowshoes are essential). Water is scarce, meaning you will need plenty if you prefer summertime conditions. So figure the weight you save shedding the winter gear will be made up in H₂O.

WHEELER PEAK: Great Basin National Park is like a recuperative little pocket of Zen, uncrowded, peaceful, and totally yours for the taking. The night sky blazes with galaxies

and stars that you never imagined existed, and babbling brooks lull you to sleep as you prepare for a full day of exploring in the morning.

As Nevada's second tallest peak and crushing the threshold of 13,000 feet, altitude sickness can be a concern. But the Summit Trailhead is at 10,160 feet, meaning you're only gaining 2,900 feet over the course of 4.3 miles. Be prepared for wind gusts, but take heart in the 360-degree views you'll glimpse as you make your way to the top. Afternoon storms are common, so it's best to start this hike early in the morning.

MOUNT MORIAH: Despite being Nevada's third-highest peak, Mount Moriah is not well-known, perhaps due to its location on the far eastern side of Nevada near Great Basin National Park. From Great Basin, you'll weave in and out of each sweeping bend for about 30 minutes before peeling off to the north on Spring Valley Road, and another turnoff called Fourmile. The drive is slow-going, but about 90 minutes later you'll get your first glimpse of the beast that lies ahead. Try not to get distracted by the vibrant aspens all around and the bugling elk that frequent the area. You also will wander through bristlecone pine trees as you traverse the 45-degree slope toward the 12,067-foot summit.

AMERICAN INDIAN SITES

Nevada is rich with Western culture and heritage. Whether you have one day or a few, you'll find fascinating people, places, and adventures that represent the 32 active American Indian reservations and colonies in the Silver State.

Pyramid Lake, 50 miles northeast of Reno, is an ethereal desert oasis with mysterious rock formations that can only be explained by tribal legend. The Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe welcomes visitors to its museum, adventure seekers to its sandy shores, and anglers to its trout-rich waters.

The Stewart Indian School in Carson City operated from 1890 to 1980 and was initially a military-style school. In the early 20th century, with the blending of American Indian staff, there was a cultural resurgence. The school is about to enter a new era as the Stewart Indian Cultural Center. It is envisioned as a complete museum that will highlight not only the students, athletes and artists who were educated at the school, but also the cultures of the Washoe, Paiute and Shoshone.

Just east of Fallon on U.S. 50 are Grimes Point and Hidden Cave, two remnants of early American Indian life. Grimes Point features a collection of petroglyphs along a self-guided trail. Just a mile past this point is Hidden Cave, a storage site used by native inhabitants more than 2,000 years ago. The cave is only open to the public on the second and fourth Saturdays of the month, when the Churchill County Museum conducts tours to the cave.

In southern Nevada, there's the Lost City Museum in Overton, about 60 miles northeast of Las Vegas. Built in 1935, the museum exhibits artifacts excavated from Pueblo de Nevada, which at the time were under threat of being submerged by Lake Mead, created when Hoover Dam was constructed.

Nevada's Indian Territory encompasses the entire state, with examples of this vital piece of the state's culture scattered throughout the mountains, deserts, valleys, and lakes. Wherever you go, you'll be right around the corner from the native experience.



BURNING MAN AND THE BLACK ROCK DESERT

No doubt you've heard of Burning Man, the event celebrating art, self-expression and self-reliance held the week before Labor Day in the Black Rock Desert, about 100 miles northeast of Reno. Every year, as summer turns to fall, tens of thousands of people descend on the desert playa to form Black Rock City, to create and enjoy large-scale art installations and to participate in a grand experiment in creating community.

For those interested in attending, preparation is key. Tickets are slated to go on sale early in the year; visit the Burning Man website, www.BurningMan.org, for more information. You'll need to bring everything you will need to survive a week in the desert, including water, food and shelter. With the exception of ice and coffee, nothing is available for sale at Burning Man. More information, including the Survival Guide — mandatory reading for all Burners — is available on the Burning Man website.

The Black Rock Desert also can be visited at other times of the year. The Black Rock Desert-High Rock Canyon Emigrant Trails National Conservation Area draws visitors to its playa — an enormous, flat, dry lakebed that once was the bottom of ancient Lake Lahontan. The area, managed by the Bureau of Land Management, also has mountain ranges, volcanic tablelands and the longest intact segments of the historical emigrant trails to California and Oregon.

The Black Rock-High Rock NCA is very rugged, and high-clearance vehicles with off-road tires are recommended. Visit the Friends of Black Rock High Rock website, www.BlackRock.org, for more information. The BLM also operates a visitor center from April to October just west of Gerlach, at the entrance to Black Rock-High Rock NCA.



Forget the History Channel. Nevada's seven state museums are the place to see and feel history come to life. From piping hot steam locomotives to scintillating showgirl costumes to recreated adobe huts, Nevada's museum displays reveal a history as diverse as its landscape.

Northern Nevada

NEVADA HISTORICAL SOCIETY:

For serious history buffs, this museum adjacent to the University of Nevada, Reno, is a gold mine of historical manuscripts, artifacts, and collections. Make this your first stop if you want to set the foundation for understanding Nevada's past and future.

NEVADA STATE MUSEUM:

An underground mine exhibit, a life-size ghost town, the silver service from the USS Nevada, and a working coin press from the historic Carson City Mint. Yeah, you could spend some time here. The State Museum is in downtown Carson City, an easy walk from the Capitol, the Governor's Mansion, and the Kit Carson Trail walking tour. The coin press fires up once a month and on special occasions, providing a glimpse into early American coin making and the Comstock boom.

NEVADA STATE RAILROAD MUSEUM:

Only a mile south of downtown Carson City is the Nevada State Railroad Museum, a fascinating collection of locomotives, passenger and freight cars, and artifacts from Nevada's railroad past. A working railway encircles the site and provides train rides on select weekends throughout the year. Don't miss the historic McKean Motor Car or the newly restored Glenbrook steam engine.

Southern Nevada

NEVADA STATE MUSEUM:

Nowhere is the range of Nevada personalities more prominent than at the Nevada State Museum in Las Vegas.

Here you can walk by a sound wall of native animals, muscle a handcar along a virtual track, and round a corner into a room of showgirl costumes and Rat Pack relics. See items from Howard Hughes' residency at the Desert Inn, or listen to the detonation of nuclear bombs that were tested in the Nevada desert.

NEVADA STATE RAILROAD MUSEUM:

All aboard! The highlight of this railroad museum in Boulder City is the 45-minute ride aboard the Nevada Southern Railway. Restored Pullman cars trek over the tracks that were laid to transport supplies to nearby Hoover Dam. It's truly a trek through time.

LOST CITY MUSEUM:

The Lost City Museum was built in 1935 by the National Park Service to exhibit artifacts excavated from Pueblo Grande de Nevada, which was soon to be flooded by Lake Mead, created with the construction of Hoover Dam. While the museum tells the story of our American Indian ancestors, its very existence is a testament to the forced migration of people, water and land as immigrants moved farther West.

Eastern Nevada

EAST ELY DEPOT MUSEUM:

The state's industrial development through mining and transportation are on full display here in the Depot Building and Freight Barn adjacent to the Nevada Northern Railway. After perusing the mining and railroad exhibits in the museum, buy a train ticket and ride the historic Ghost Train.



ODE TO THE ARTS

Art lives in Nevada, from larger-than-life outdoor installations to highly coveted exhibits in museums and galleries.

Check out the Nevada Museum of Art in downtown Reno, Nevada's stage for traveling exhibits featuring the likes of Maurice Sendak, Frida Kahlo, Toulouse-Lautrec, Andy Warhol, and Picasso. Permanent collections follow thematic lines - Altered Landscape Photography, Art of the Greater West, Contemporary Art, and the Work Ethic - offering a wide range of art and media to even the most casual museum-goer.


Some of the most robust art collections in southern Nevada are found - where else? - in casino resorts. The Fine Art Gallery at Bellagio brings world-renowned names like Fabergé, Warhol, O'Keefe, and Monet to the glitzy Las Vegas Strip. Picasso can be found at the restaurant of the same name in the Bellagio, and Leonardo Da Vinci's life and work is on display at the Venetian.

Nevada and neon just naturally go together, which is why the Neon Museum in Downtown Las Vegas has become one of the most visited art collections in Nevada. Neon signs from Nevada's yesteryear are on display in an outdoor gallery that takes visitors along a tale of the rise of gaming in the Silver State.

Near the eastern entrance to Death Valley sits the ghost town of Rhyolite, a collection of wood and stone ruins... and a brilliant outdoor art gallery. The Goldwell Open Air Museum was created by a group of prominent Belgian artists and is anchored by the haunting "Last Supper" sculpture.

Only 72 miles to the north of Rhyolite is the town of Goldfield, where a few holdout residents keep it from becoming a bona fide ghost town. One local artist is putting Goldfield back on the map with his installation of art cars planted in the desert. This exhibit is known as the International Car Forest of the Last Church, and is a photographer's dream.

GOLF NEVADA




With more than 100 golf courses in Nevada, and nearly 60 in and around Las Vegas alone, let's just start with the fact that you don't have to travel far to get in a great round on the links. Now let's break that down.

In northern Nevada, you can golf lakeside at Edgewood Tahoe, home of the American Century Celebrity Golf Championship. American sports and TV celebrities strut the greens every July and vie for top billing at this nationally televised event. The rest of the year, Edgewood Tahoe is the most scenic course overlooking

the deep blue water of Lake Tahoe. There's nothing better than swinging your personal best, then wrapping up the day at Brooks' Bar and Deck with an icy mango mojito in hand.

Golfers who like a taste of the not-yet-discovered-by-the-masses will like Dayton Valley Golf Club, an Arnold Palmer Signature course and home to a PGA Tour qualifier since 1995. It's one of the best-kept secrets in golf in Nevada, a sleeper course with some seriously challenging holes and breathtaking views of the eastern Sierra.

The casual weekender who enjoys a cold buzz with his birdie will love LakeRidge Golf Course in Reno. The signature Hole 15 will take your breath away with sweeping views of downtown Reno.

Perhaps the best way to sample northern Nevada golf is to try the Divine Nine, a collection of nine courses in and around Carson City. Play one course per trip, or book several courses together for a seriously tee-rific golf vacation.

Venture to Southern Nevada to find the mecca of desert golf in Mesquite, about 80 miles northeast of Las Vegas. There are nine courses in this quiet oasis, and the mild desert climate makes it a year-round recreation destination.

Las Vegas doesn't do anything small, and its golf courses are no exception. From the top-rated Bali Hai Golf Club on the Strip to the uber-exclusive Wynn Golf Club, golf is more than a pastime in Las Vegas.

If a family getaway is your excuse to golf, check out Primm, about 45 minutes southwest of Las Vegas near the California border. Primm boasts two desert courses within an easy drive of the Fashion Outlets and the Primm Valley Casino Resorts. Why is this important? Because your family can shop, lounge by a pool, order room service, and ride roller coasters while you swing your clubs in serenity. Win-win!

FOODIE

Reno

Local chef Mark Estee is shaking up the dining scene in Reno, and a visit to one of his restaurants is a must for any self-respecting foodie.

Campo - The menu highlights local ingredients and changes depending on what's available and in season. Try the house-cured salami or finish your meal with the Caramel Budino and find out why Esquire Magazine listed this among its top new U.S. restaurants in 2012.

Chez Louie - Housed on the first floor of the Nevada Museum of Art, Chez Louie presents works of culinary art in its French-inspired fare.

Heritage - This newest addition to the downtown culinary scene celebrates Reno's history, crafting a menu around local harvests and American Western tradition.

Midtown Reno's recent gentrification has brought with it a surge in new restaurants sure to impress any foodie in your circle of friends.

Great Full Gardens opened in 2013 with a wholesome menu that caters to those with special dietary needs and those who just want great, fresh food.

Süp keeps it simple with soups, salads, and sandwiches made from scratch daily, using ingredients sourced from local farms and ranches. Vegetarian and vegan options abound.

Midtown Eats serves up rustic and comfort food for lunch, dinner, and Sunday brunch. Hearty dishes like the bison burger or the falafel flatbread sandwich don't disappoint the hungry patron, while unique starters like fried avocado slices and deviled eggs with kalamata olive tapenade are sure to whet your appetite. Wash it all down with a choice of creative cocktails (lavender gin, honey syrup and lemon? Yes please!).

Las Vegas

Minimalist in style with maximum flavor, Mochiko Chicken is an Asian fusion café a short 15-minute drive from the Las Vegas Strip. Dive into the spicy with the Srirachi chargrilled chicken bowl, or keep it light with the coconut curry chicken bowl.

There are several burger joints in Las Vegas that can claim to be the best, and we won't even try to decide between them.

Instead, here are several that will not disappoint, whether you're looking for a simple old fashioned burger or a gourmet patty. Bachi Burger, with three locations in the Las Vegas area, puts an Asian twist on the classic burger, while BLT Burger inside The Mirage allows you to choose your own selection of gourmet toppings and sides. The king of culinary mean, Gordon Ramsay, opened his own gourmet burger restaurant, Burgr inside Planet Hollywood.

Whist Stove and Spirits at The District at Green Valley Ranch is an affordable neighborhood restaurant whose price point belies the exquisite caliber of its food. Open 24 hours, diners can try the signature Spanish octopus served with chimichurri, jicama and cilantro, or try the seafood hot pot with crab, shrimp and mussels. Craft cocktails shaken (and stirred) by in-house mixologists seal the deal as a true foodie find.



Basque

Traditional Basque restaurants dot the Nevada culinary landscape and are concentrated more heavily in the northern end of the state. A Basque meal usually is served family style, so make friends with your neighbors or they won't pass the salad or beans your way. The fare may vary, depending on whether the restaurant leans more Spanish-Basque or French-Basque, but you can be sure there will be at least five courses leading up to your main dish.

JT Basque Bar and Dining Room in Gardnerville is about as down-home authentic as it gets. The large bar welcomes patrons into the family before they're ushered into the dining room, which resembles a family farmhouse.

The Star Hotel in Elko is one of the most iconic Basque

restaurants in Nevada, as demonstrated by the always-packed dining room and line of cowboys and ranchers on bar stools tossing back picon punches. Be sure to order your steak or lamb "Basque style," which comes with a heaping helping of roasted garlic.

Louis' Basque Corner and the Santa Fe Hotel in downtown Reno on the Basque map with their authentic cuisine including sweetbreads and roast lamb. Louis' was featured on the Food Network's "Diners, Drive-ins and Dives."

WINE



Nevada is leading a revolution in winemaking, developing desert-hardy grapes that use a fraction of the water that traditional crops consume. That is reason enough to be interested in Nevada's four wineries, so what a bonus that they produce great wine too!

Pahrump Valley was established in 1990 and grows primarily red varietals, including zinfandel, syrah, merlot and barbera. The winery has claimed 400 national wine awards in the last decade, and its upscale Symphony's Restaurant, is rated No. 1 on TripAdvisor.

Sanders Family is planted with zinfandel and petite syrah and imports a gamut of red and white grapes to produce award-winning wines only an hour from Las Vegas. The Tuscan villa-style estate welcomes visitors to its tasting room and vineyards, overlooked by the looming Mount Charleston.

Tahoe Ridge Winery and Marketplace started as a research vineyard in 1990 and spent a decade perfecting the art of desert wine before going public and producing the first commercial wine in Nevada and becoming the first full-production winery in the state. The tasting room in Minden, only 45 minutes from Reno, also features a wide variety of specialty olive oils and balsamic vinegars.

Also anchored in the northern end of Nevada is Churchill Vineyards, which lays claim to the only estate-produced white wines in Nevada. The winery bottles small-production whites and reds. In 2014, Churchill Vineyards began commercial production of distilled spirits under its Frey Ranch label, and opened a new tasting room on-site.




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


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ELKO/LAS VEGAS

Elko

The Ruby Mountains spike upward from the high-desert floor near Elko, cutting the horizon with snow-covered peaks that beg to be explored by the hearty and adventurous. No wonder this is where serious motorheads bring their sleds and cut up the snow with wild abandon.


The tallest peaks in the Rubies top 10,000 feet and are surrounded by national forest, meaning there's plenty of room to spread out and not worry about crowding anyone's exhaust pipe. The glacier-carved Lamoille Canyon cuts through the Rubies and provides even more intricate trails and interesting sites around every turn.

Those pristine mountain slopes are also home to Ruby Mountains Heli-Experience, heli-skiing on 200,000 acres of untouched wilderness. From wide-open bowls to brag-worthy vertical drops, all levels of skiers will have the adventure of a lifetime, which is best relished over hot drinks near the blazing fireplace at Red's Ranch, the heli-ski base lodge.

Las Vegas

Yes, there's snow fun in Las Vegas, or 45 minutes above it to be exact. Las Vegas Ski and Snowboard Resort is a small yet impressive collection of three lifts, 30 runs, and serious double-black-diamond trails. The base lodge sits at 8,510 feet (2,594 meters), collecting all the moisture passing over Mount Charleston and dumping it in the form of sweet, sweet snow.

Make a mountain getaway of it by staying at the nearby Resort on Mount Charleston. But if the bright lights of Las Vegas are just too alluring, the Strip is less than an hour away, and shredding fresh powder is the best hangover cure anyway.



400 INCHES OF SNOW - 300 DAYS OF SUNSHINE Highest concentration of ski resorts in North America

This is Lake Tahoe.

The Nevada side of Tahoe adds 24-hour nightlife, world-class entertainment, easy access to the Reno-Tahoe International Airport, and a wide variety of hotel and resort accommodations.

HEAVENLY MOUNTAIN RESORT: This resort spans the Nevada-California border and boasts the most skiable terrain at the lake and the most vertical feet on the West Coast. The resort is accessible from base lodges on both the Nevada and California sides, as well as by a gondola at the state line.

You could call this the granddaddy of Tahoe ski resorts, but it's not your granddaddy's resort. Three terrain parks and the High Roller Half Pipe welcome hotshot boarders and skiers of all ages. But send the little ones home before hitting the Unbuckle Apres Party at Tamarack Lodge. This is an adults-only weekend slopeside party with killer drink specials, live DJs, and dancers that could melt the ice off the Arctic Circle.

Not a skier? Not to worry. Heavenly has one of the biggest and baddest tubing hills, named the best tubing hill in America by Fox News.


DIAMOND PEAK SKI RESORT: Diamond Peak is perched lakeside just above Incline Village on the north shore of Lake Tahoe and offers breathtaking views of the lake from nearly every corner of the resort. An award-winning ski school, the Burton Learn to Ride Center, and generous mix of greens, blues, and blacks make this a great family destination for all levels of skiers and boarders.

The nearest hotel resort is the Hyatt Lake Tahoe, which has its own ski retail and rental shop. Oh, it also has a casino, a 30,000 square-foot spa (that's big!), and outdoor fire pits. Yes, you can take your hot toddy poolside (heated, with indoor swim-out access!) or lakeside and cozy up around a roaring fire pit and relive your best lines of the day.

MT. ROSE-SKI TAHOE: Always trust the locals! Mt. Rose is the locals' favorite with 1,200 acres of terrain only 25 minutes from Reno. Many Reno hotels offer ski shuttles to Mt. Rose with their ski-and-stay packages. With the highest base elevation at the lake, Mt. Rose towers high above Incline Village on the north shore and offers sweeping views of both Lake

Tahoe and Reno.

Mt. Rose's real claim to fame is The Chutes, double-black-diamond runs with some of the longest vertical in North America. For years, skiers risked their season passes by sneaking into this previously closed terrain because it is THAT good. Mt. Rose officially brought the Chutes into its groomed terrain in 2004 with designated gate entry only.

DON'T FENCE ME IN: Hey, not all fun has to be found within the confines of a ski resort. Lake Tahoe is encircled by the Tahoe Rim Trail, 165 miles of trails that can be trekked by snowshoe in the winter months. If a DIY adventure isn't your speed, tour companies located in and near Reno offer guided snowshoe tours throughout the season.

Want to create your own Norman Rockwell-esque memory? Book a sleigh ride with Borges Sleigh Rides, which runs tours on the south shore of Lake Tahoe and at Sand Harbor State Park on the north shore.

Need a faster pace? Zephyr Cove Resort on the southeast corner of Lake Tahoe runs snowmobile tours into the mountains 9,000 feet in elevation. Tours depart from Zephyr Cove, where you can rent snowsuits, and include free hotel shuttle transportation.



The greater Tahoe region includes Squaw Valley USA and Alpine Meadows, both approximately an hour from Reno. Southeast of Lake Tahoe is Kirkwood Mountain Resort, and northwest is Northstar California, both of which are sister resorts to Heavenly and offer complementary lift tickets to one another.

RIDE THE RAILS OF THE SILVER STATE — SIX DAYS, 838 MILES/1,348 KM

Day 1

RENO TO CARSON CITY: Truly die-hard rail fans can arrive by Amtrak in the heart of downtown Reno. From here you'll drive to Carson City and check into a hotel.

Day 2

CARSON CITY TO VIRGINIA CITY: Buy your tickets early for the Sisters in History train ride from Carson City to Virginia City, which departs most weekends during the spring and summer. When you arrive in the Old West town of Virginia City, you'll have the afternoon to shop, take old-timey sepia photos, or simply wet your whistle at one of the many saloons that line the wooden boardwalk. Return to Carson by train. If you don't have advance tickets for the train, drive up to Virginia City and hop on the V&T shortline, a half-hour excursion tour to Gold Hill and back.

Day 3

RENO TO ELKO: Nevada's dynamic State Railroad Museum in Carson City easily can take a few hours of your day as you peruse the exhibits and walk through the working Restoration Shop. Learn about the Transcontinental Railroad, Nevada's part in taming the West, and the use of locomotives in Hollywood movies. From here you'll return to the Reno Amtrak station for a prompt 4:06 p.m. departure to Elko. You'll arrive in Elko around 9:30 p.m. and check into a hotel.

Day 4

ELKO: Elko is a bustling western town, so take the day to explore. The California Trail Interpretive Center tells the story of miners and families who ventured west on the famed


California and Oregon trails. Get your culture on at the Western Folklife Center and the Northeastern Nevada Museum, then lighten your wallet a bit at Capriola's Saddle Shop (yes, there's more than saddles there).

Day 5

ELKO TO ELY: Drive to Ely, approximately 3 hours south of Elko. Here you'll want to spend the afternoon at the East Ely Depot Museum and ride the Nevada Northern Railway, aka the "Ghost Train." The truly adventurous even can sleep at the rail yard in a converted caboose. The Nevada Northern Railway has been repeatedly featured on the TV show "American Restoration" for work done on equipment in its working restoration shop. Continue to Boulder City, approximately four hours south of Ely. It's been a long day, you deserve a soft bed and a good night's sleep.




Day 6

ELY TO BOULDER CITY: Today it's all about the Nevada Southern Railway, an excursion train that runs weekends at the Nevada State Railroad Museum in Boulder City. Besides being a passenger, you can upgrade to a locomotive cab ride, or spring for the "Engineer for an Hour" package. The museum includes the rail yard and equipment that served Boulder City during the construction of the Hoover Dam. Call ahead for information on the 7.5-gauge model train rides.

GHOST TOWNS

Every boom ends with a bust, turning Nevada's once-great mining towns into ghost towns, preserved in the arid desert in a state of arrested decay.

RHYOLITE: One of the most photographed ghost towns in the West, Rhyolite stands guard at Death Valley's eastern entrance, ushering visitors through the passage of time and space and terrain. The mission-style railroad depot gives the town an almost modern look when compared to the stone ruins of a bank, store, and schoolhouse. The famed Bottle House, constructed of nearly 50,000 beer bottles, has been restored and hints at an eccentricity sown through the "wild west."

BERLIN: Berlin is a ghost town tied by the terrain to its closest neighbor, an ichthyosaur fossil site, and now known as Berlin-Ichthyosaur State Park. The town, adjacent mine, and dinosaur remains are a motley representation of Nevada's vast history. Located near the geographic center of Nevada, the fossils tell a tale of life under the sea, of reptilian beasts that swam over what was then the ocean's floor and is now mountain peaks.

BELMONT: Historical graffiti in this mountain ghost town marks the decades that have passed and gives a glimpse into the visitors - both welcome and unwelcome - that have entered its domain. An eerie autograph is etched into a doorframe at the courthouse, believed to have been left by Charles Manson in 1969 while he and his "family" hid in the deteriorating courthouse. Now preserved as a state historic park, the courthouse stands sentinel over the nearly deserted

town of Belmont, its ruins crumbling down the hillsides and hidden in the high desert of Nevada.

BLAIR: The Desert Lobster Café in Mina and the ruins of abandoned Coaldale are a few of the signs of civilization before you turn from U.S. 95 on state Route 265, headed for Blair. Essentially abandoned by 1920, today Blair is composed of several stone and cement structures. Rusty combinations of artifacts and old trash speckle the surrounding area, while fragments of fine china can be found in the cracked mud floors. An old wood-burning fireplace and chimney act as the optical centerpiece amongst the walls, which, remarkably, still hold strong after nearly a century of withstanding the elements.


SILVER PEAK: Only a short drive south from Blair is Silver Peak, one of Nevada's oldest mining communities, founded in 1864. Although the town is sparsely populated, the streets still are lined with weathered early-Nevada artifacts, including an old post office. Many call this a "living ghost town" because it's not yet completely abandoned. Still operating as a mining district, it is now known for a different type of element. The Chemetall Foote Lithium Operation, just east of Silver Peak, is the only mine of its kind in the country.

GOLD POINT: Referred to as "the friendly ghost town," Gold Point has been restored and maintained to provide creature comforts. With all the amenities of a lodge (bathrooms, hot meals, cabins, and a bar), Gold Point creates a happy medium for explorers looking to experience a historic ghost town, and afterward sleep in a warm bed with a full belly.

HARD LUCK CASTLE: Ten miles south of Gold Point on a dirt road is the Hard Luck Castle, a work of art. As you approach the castle, a cylindrical central granite column is visible, decorated with forest-green roofing and an American flag blowing in the breeze. The structure is impossible to miss against the sagebrush backdrop of the desert. The Hard Luck Mine operated from 1897 to around World War II. Because of looting, the mine could not reopen after the war.

It was purchased by a family who decided to turn it into lodgings. Beginning construction in 2000, They have nearly completed the four-story, 8,000-square-foot castle, complete with a theater, game room, two kitchens, four bedrooms, and two grandiose pipe organs that fill the walls of the castle.

Tours of the castle are available daily from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Visitors also have the opportunity to sleep in an original miner's cabin. The cabin sleeps up to five adults—with space outside for trailers and tents—and includes a kitchen, shower, toilet, and fire ring. Visitors are encouraged to call ahead for availability and road conditions.

COMO: Gold brought miners to the small town of Como near Carson City in 1860s. Now there's only rubble representing what was a thriving townsite with a bar, hotel, newspaper and post office. Visitors can access the site via a 4WD road out of Dayton, and the payoff is solitude among the stone mill and hotel ruins, which are frequented by wild horses and other wildlife.

Nevada is dotted with ghost towns, each settlement telling the story of the miners, railroad workers, explorers and settlers who answered the call to "go west, young man." You may see the signs of their struggles and triumphs as you, too, go west.



ROCKHOONDING

There's gold in them thar hills, and turquoise, opals, and garnets. And much of it is just waiting to be claimed. It just might take some ingenuity and determination... and a sturdy rock hammer.

OPALS: The Virgin Valley deep in the northwestern corner of Nevada is not easy to get to, but the payoff is big. Sage-covered valleys, jagged rock cliffs, and natural hot springs await the rugged adventurer. Commercial opal mines welcome visitors to mine their tailings - for a fee - to dig out luminous opals and the rare black opal, found in only two locations in the world (the other is in Australia).

Amateur rockhounds, intrepid travelers, and memory-making families can be found in the mine quarries poring over rock piles in search for the precious gemstones.

The mines that allow digging are Royal Peacock, Bonanza, and Rainbow Ridge. The digging season typically starts in May, and if you go, be prepared for primitive camping and limited services. This trip has all the makings of a true adventure: gravel roads, spotty cell service, and few people.

TURQUOISE: Nevada is the second-largest producer of Turquoise in the United States, and you can find it for yourself at the Royston Turquoise Mine near Tonopah. Digging sign-ups are at Otteson's Royston Turquoise Mine, conveniently located in the Mizpah Hotel. Group tours are driven out to the mine, and then miners are turned loose with the instruction: "You'll know it when you see it!"

When you return to the Mizpah with your loot in hand, you can pay to have the resident jeweler to turn the brilliant blue stones into one-of-a-kind jewelry. This is the definition of unique... you can bet that no one else on the block will have the same ring!

GARNETS: Just a few miles west of Ely is a small recreation area called Garnet Hill, and it's free to the public, just bring your own hammer. Rockhounds can look for the deep-red gemstone peeking through weather-worn rocks, or break open rocks to look for the gems inside.

Because Garnet Hill is so close to Ely, it's a fun addition to Ely's other attractions such as riding the Nevada Northern Railway, visiting the East Ely Depot Museum, viewing the cultural homes in Renaissance Village, or taking a day trip to Great Basin National Park. And after chasing your fortune (in

fun) at Garnet Hill, you can feel like a real miner when you order a beer at the Historic Hotel Nevada that night with a heavy lump of pay dirt in your pocket.

LAS VEGAS TO HOOVER DAM

The Silver State draws bikers with its wide-open roads, beautiful scenery and moderate weather. So much so, Nevada Magazine produces an annual Nevada Rides Motorcycle Guide for those who prefer to travel on two wheels instead of four. Be sure to check for the 2015 guide this spring. But until then, here are a few favorite Nevada Rides:

Are you ready to see one of the most miraculous construction achievements of the 20th century? Hoover Dam is the highest concrete dam in the Western Hemisphere, and the nearby Mike O'Callaghan/Pat Tillman Memorial Bridge is the second-highest bridge in the United States.

The Ride (70 miles): Take Interstate 15 south to Clark County Route 215 east. Travel east on 215 for approximately 10 miles to the junction of 215 and U.S. 93/U.S. 95. Take U.S. 93 south and continue about 20 miles to Boulder City. In Boulder City, take a left at the second stoplight in town (there are only two of them). Continue on U.S. 93 for about five miles to the turn-off to Nevada state Route 172-the Hoover Dam Access Road. Take SR 172 for about two miles to the dam on the Nevada/Arizona border.



LAKE TAHOE & GENOA LOOP

A ride around Lake Tahoe will confirm why it is considered the jewel of the Sierra. After completing a trip around this gorgeous lake, head for one of Nevada's oldest towns, Genoa, and the biker-friendly Genoa Bar and Saloon, the oldest watering hole in the Silver State.



The Ride (134-149 miles): From U.S. 395 in south Reno, take Mount Rose Highway (Nevada state Route 431) southwest to Incline Village, 28 miles. Turn right on Nevada state Route 28 into California and to Tahoe City, 14 miles. California state Route 89 follows the west shore of the lake past Emerald Bay and to South Lake Tahoe, 27 miles. Turn left onto U.S. 50 and back to Nevada at Stateline, five miles.

To continue the ride to Genoa, from Stateline, there are two options:

1. Follow U.S. 50 over Spooner Summit east to U.S. 395 in the Carson Valley, 22 miles. Turn right on U.S. 395 and follow it one mile to Jacks Valley Road. Another right on Jacks Valley Road leads into Genoa (nine miles).

2. Take Kingsbury Grade (Nevada state Route 207) out of Stateline to Genoa. Riders will enjoy the scenery and the challenging, steep, winding ride down Kingsbury Grade. From Stateline, turn right onto SR 207 and follow for 11 miles to Nevada state Route 206. Turn left on Nevada state route 206 and follow north to Genoa, six miles.

For both variations, follow Jacks Valley Road north from Genoa to U.S. 395, nine miles, and back to Reno, 34 miles. Heading south on U.S. 395 will take you into Carson Valley.






LINCOLN COUNTY

Some of the best-kept secrets in Nevada are the state parks in Lincoln County. Use Alamo as your base camp, and stay at A Cowboy's Dream Bed & Breakfast or Windmill Ridge. Bikers who venture to this area will be rewarded with some of the most varied, scenic riding the state has to offer.

The Ride (217 miles): From Alamo, follow U.S. 93 north and east to Caliente (54 miles) and take a brief three-mile side trip to Kershaw-Ryan State Park. Continue north on U.S. 93 to Cathedral Gorge State Park (14 miles) and on to Pioche (another 11 miles). From Pioche, Spring Valley State Park and Echo Canyon State Park are 32- and 24-mile roundtrips, respectively. Return to Alamo via U.S. 93 south (79 miles).




NEVADA SCENIC BYWAYS

So the closest point from A to B is a straight line. Sure, direct routes are fine if you have places to go, but the roads less traveled in Nevada are the ones that lead to adventure, discovery and rich experience.

Nevada has a clutch of state scenic byways, from verdant Lamoille Canyon in the north to the sandstone sights of Red Rock in the south. Three of the Silver State's byways — Eastshore Drive in north Lake Tahoe, the Las Vegas Strip at night and Pyramid Lake in northern Nevada — are national scenic byways.

Many of the scenic byways listed in the following pages are near state parks or sections of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest, areas that are fun to explore by hiking trails or a trip to a visitor center, so allow time to soak it all in. Most of Nevada's scenic byways are near population centers, so on your next trip to Reno, Las Vegas, Elko or Ely, consider a day trip on Nevada's scenic byways.



PYRAMID/GERLACH/NIXON

One day, 101 miles, 163 kilometers (starting in Sutcliffe and ending in Gerlach), plus mileage to and from Reno

Pyramid Lake lies in the Great Basin desert about 45 miles northeast of Reno. At 125,000 acres, it's one of the largest natural lakes in Nevada and is the focus of three national scenic byways that offer stark desert landscapes, wildlife viewing and interesting geometric formations. The lake is within the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation, which boasts a museum and visitors center operated by the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe explaining the area's cultural history.

PYRAMID LAKE

Start your trip in Sutcliffe, one of three communities within the Pyramid Lake Reservation. As you travel south on Nevada state Route 445 (Pyramid Highway), you'll see rolling hills of sagebrush and interesting tufa rock formations as well as the azure shade of Pyramid Lake to the east. Camping and fishing is popular here — the lake draws sport fishermen out for Lahontan cutthroat trout. Tribal day use fishing and camping permits are required to access Pyramid Lake.


Note: If you're coming from Reno, it's about 37 miles to Sutcliffe.

NIXON

Continue south on Nevada state Route 445 and take Nevada state Route 446 to continue circling the lake. Look for American white pelicans — Anaho Island within the lake is a national wildlife refuge, supporting breeding colonies of pelicans and other birds. There is a wildlife viewing area at Popcorn Rock towards the south end of Pyramid Lake along Nevada state Route 446. Spring is a good time to visit, when the fish-eating pelicans are particularly active, drawn to the spring spawning runs of the Lahontan cutthroat trout and the cui-ui fish. In Nixon (on Nevada state Route 447), you'll find the Pyramid Lake Museum and Visitors Center.


GERLACH

From Nixon, head north on Nevada state Route 447 to Marble Bluff Road, the official start of the area's third scenic byway. Here, you'll find the Marble Bluff Fish Passage Facility,




operated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and open to the public from March through early June. The scenic byway ends in 4.5 miles, at milepost 23, but continue on — this is the road taken by people attending the annual Burning Man Festival in the Black Rock Desert — to check out the tiny community of Gerlach. Hard-core road-trippers may even want to travel a little north of Gerlach on Nevada state Route 34, to see the “art installation” on Guru Road.

Note: Those heading back to Reno will want to allow time — it's 110 miles back to the Biggest Little City.


LAMOILLE CANYON

One day, 24 miles, 39 kilometers (up the canyon and back)
plus mileage to and from Elko

Stunning fall colors and verdant spring waterfalls can be seen in Lamoille Canyon, at the center of the Ruby Mountains in eastern Nevada. The canyon, formed by glacial action thousands of years ago, can be explored through the 12-mile scenic byway (Lamoille Canyon Road) beginning at the base of the mountain. Stop along the way up to view interpretive panels explaining the area's geology and to hike one of the tree-lined trails. Keep an eye out for mountain goats, bighorn sheep and an assortment of birds. The byway ends at an elevation of 8,800 feet at a turn-around area that has a restroom and a trailhead. Lamoille Canyon and the Ruby Mountains are part of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest.

NOTES FOR THE ROAD:

- Plan ahead when visiting Lamoille Canyon — the upper portion of the road typically is closed in the winter months.
- Elko, about 20 miles northwest of Lamoille Canyon, is the nearest major city, although the small community of Lamoille is 1 mile from the byway.
- Photo op: the Lamoille Community Presbyterian Church in Lamoille, also known as “the little church of the crossroads” is a popular subject for photographers.

ANGEL LAKE

One day, 24 miles, 39 kilometers (up and back, starting from Wells, Nevada)

Take in the Great Basin Desert's mountain scenery on Angel Lake Road (Nevada state Route 231), a paved road that starts in Wells and heads west, winding up on the east side of the East Humboldt Range before ending at the Angel Lake recreation area (8,500 feet). Get out and explore Angel Lake, a natural body of water that was dammed in 1900 to create an irrigation system still in use today. Fishing is allowed (rainbow, brook and tiger trout), as well as non-motorized boating. Look to the south for a glimpse of Chimney Rock, a rock spire that serves as a local landmark. Here, you'll also find trailheads to Smith Lake and Winchell Lake as well as a picnic area, restrooms and a campground. Keep an eye out for bighorn sheep, mountain goats, mule deer and pronghorn antelope. Angel Lake and the East Humboldt Range are part of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest.

NOTES FOR THE ROAD:

- Angel Lake Road is closed in the winter months; check with the Nevada Department of Transportation for road conditions.
- Wells, the nearest city, has RV parks, hotels and motels, as well as a history as a crossroads of the American West. During America's period of westward expansion in the 19th century, Wells was the jump-off point for the California-Oregon trail.

LAKE TAHOE, EASTSHORE DRIVE

One day, 28 miles, 45.1 kilometers, starting from Stateline and ending at the Nevada-California border west of Incline Village

Breathtaking views of Lake Tahoe, snow-capped mountains and towering pine trees have earned this National Scenic Byway the title of “the most beautiful drive in America.” The route starts on U.S. 50, once used by riders of the Pony Express – the horseback mail service in operation from 1860 to 1861 – and winds along Lake Tahoe’s east shore before connecting with Nevada state Route 28 and curving around the lake’s north side.

YOU’LL FIND PLENTY OF PLACES TO PARK AND EXPLORE ON THIS ROUTE, INCLUDING:

- Zephyr Cove Resort, about 2 miles north of Stateline. This is where the 520-passenger M.S. Dixie sightseeing boat docks. There’s also a beach, restaurant, lodging and walking paths. Summer parking is \$8 per day.
- Spooner Backcountry, just past the intersection of U.S. 50 and Nevada state Route 28. Also part of Lake Tahoe State Park, this area is popular with hikers and mountain bikers, and features Spooner Lake.
- Sand Harbor, about 7 miles north of the Spooner Backcountry. This popular beach is home of the Lake Tahoe Shakespeare Festival, which offers performances in July and August. Walking trails, a visitors center and a snack bar also are at Sand Harbor.

EXTEND YOUR TRIP:

This drive connects with the Mount Rose Scenic Byway, a Nevada Scenic Byway (see page 75).

MOUNT ROSE HIGHWAY

One day, 23 miles, 37 kilometers, from the junction of Mount Rose Highway (Nevada state Route 431) and Nevada state Route 28 in Incline Village to the intersection of Mount Rose Highway and U.S. 395 in Reno

This Nevada Scenic Byway follows routes taken by centuries of travelers, including the Washoe and Paiute people, Comstock miners and visitors from around the world. Mount Rose Highway reaches an elevation of 8,911 feet, with Mount Rose, north of the highway, cresting at 10,776 feet. Around the highway summit, you'll find multiple trails and recreation areas for hiking, mountain biking and more. Here are a few to check out:

- Tahoe Meadows trailhead, near the highway summit, on the southwest side of the road. The interpretive loop trail also provides access to the Tahoe Rim Trail, the 165-mile trail along the ridges around Lake Tahoe. In winter, this area is popular with snowshoe enthusiasts.
- Mount Rose Welcome Plaza, at the highway summit, on the north side of the road. This rest stop includes interpretive panels about the area, the trailhead for the Mount Rose Summit Trail and toilets.
- Mt. Rose-Ski Tahoe ski resort, just east of the summit, on the south side of the road.
- Galena Creek Visitor Center inside Galena Creek Regional Park, near the eastern base of the Mount Rose Highway on the north side of the road. Information on the area's natural, cultural, historical and recreational resources are at the Visitor Center, as well as trailheads and picnic facilities.

Note: The Mount Rose Highway connects to the Lake Tahoe, Eastshore Drive National Scenic Byway (see page 74).




BAKER ROAD, LEHMAN CAVES ROAD AND WHEELER PEAK SCENIC DRIVE

One day, 29 miles (one way), 47 kilometers. Baker Road (Nevada state Route 487) scenic byway begins at the intersection of Nevada state Route 487 and U.S. 50 and ends at the Nevada-Utah border (11.6 miles). It crosses Lehman Caves Road (Nevada state Route 488, 5.4 miles) at Baker. Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive, 12, intersects Nevada State Route 488.

Baker Road, the main entryway into Great Basin National Park if you are coming from Ely, offers views of the expansive Snake Valley, with the Snake Range (home of the national park) to the west. The Nevada scenic byway continues to the Nevada-Utah border, but travelers may want to detour on Lehman Caves Road (Nevada state Route 488) which intersects Baker Road at Baker and ends at the Great Basin Visitors Center at Lehman Caves. Enjoy views of Mount Wheeler, sagebrush and pinyon-juniper woodlands.

From Lehman Caves Road, take the Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive on the western end of Lehman Caves Road. This 12-mile scenic drive gains 3,400 feet in altitude, displaying a range of habitats, from shrubby mountain mahogany to forests of spruce and Douglas fir. Trailheads and scenic viewing stops dot the drive, which ends at the Wheeler Peak campground. Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive is closed in the winter.

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KYLE CANYON ROAD TO MOUNT CHARLESTON

One day, 13 miles (one way), 21 kilometers from the intersection of U.S. 93 and Kyle Canyon Road (Nevada state Route 157) to the town of Mount Charleston. This route is about 20 miles northwest of Las Vegas off U.S. 93.



Kyle Canyon Road connects the Las Vegas region with the Spring Mountains National Recreation Area, which includes Charleston Peak and the Las Vegas Ski and Snowboard Resort, as well as hiking trails and campsites. Spring Mountains National Recreation Area is part of the Humboldt Toiyabe National Forest.

Kyle Canyon Road begins on the valley floor and heads west to into the mountains, gaining about 3,000 feet in elevation. At the higher altitude, you'll experience cooler temperatures, sometimes a welcome break from the heat of Las Vegas.

Be sure to stop at the Visitors Center just west of the intersection of Kyle Canyon Road and Deer Creek Road (Nevada state Route 158). Learn about the Spring Mountains' seven diverse life zones that support a variety of plants and wildlife, including 26 species not found anywhere else in the world. At the higher elevations, look for Bristlecone pines, possibly the world's oldest living organisms.

Trailheads, campgrounds and picnic areas line Kyle Canyon Road, and at the western end, you'll find the beginning of the South Loop Trail, a popular route for hiking the 11,918-foot Charleston Peak, the highest point in the Spring Mountains National Recreation Area.

Extend your trip: Deer Creek Road, a Nevada scenic byway, connects to Kyle Canyon Road (see page 79).


DEER CREEK ROAD

One day, 8.8 miles (one way), 14 kilometers from the intersection of Deer Creek Road (Nevada state Route 158) and Kyle Canyon Road (Nevada state Route 157) north to the intersection of Deer Creek Road and Lee Canyon Road (Nevada state Route 156). This route is about 33 miles northwest of Las Vegas.

High in the Spring Mountain Range, this byway twists and turns past the pinyon pines and mountain slopes of the Spring Mountains National Recreation Area, a section of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest that includes Charleston Peak and the Las Vegas Ski and Snowboard Resort. The North Loop Trailhead, one of the paths up 11,918-foot Charleston Peak, is accessible from the west side of Deer Creek Road. There's also a couple campgrounds and a picnic area along the byway. Don't forget to stop at Desert View Overlook to take in the sights of the valley below.

If you're traveling from Las Vegas, you may want to access Deer Creek Road via Kyle Canyon Road (see page 78), which connects the Las Vegas region to Spring Mountains National Recreation Area. Deer Creek Road ends in the north at Lee Canyon Road (Nevada state Route 156), which you can take east to U.S. 95. Traveling south on U.S. 95 will take you back to Las Vegas. The Kyle Canyon Road-Deer Creek Road-Lee Canyon Road trip is also known as the Mt. Charleston Scenic Byway.

VALLEY OF FIRE ROAD

One day, 10.5 miles, 17 kilometers, inside Valley of Fire State Park, from the west entrance to the east entrance. (Valley of Fire State Park is 52 miles from Las Vegas.)

Valley of Fire Road cuts through the Nevada state park of the same name, revealing vista upon vista of red sandstone formations, ancient petroglyphs and petrified wood. From the west entrance of Valley of Fire State Park, follow the road — a Nevada scenic byway — past Atlatl Rock to see examples of petroglyphs (ancient rock art), including a depiction of an atlatl, a primitive weapon. You'll also pass a collection of petrified logs and stumps, the remains of a forest that existed about 225 million years ago, before reaching the park's visitor center. Continue east to Seven Sisters, a grouping of red rock formations visible from the road, as well as the trailhead that leads to Elephant Rock, a natural formation named for its resemblance to an elephant.

EXTEND YOUR TRIP:

Valley of Fire State Park has another Nevada scenic byway, White Domes Road, which starts at the visitor center and heads north about 7 miles to White Domes, a collection of sandstone formations with contrasting colors.

RED ROCK ROAD


One day, 13 miles, 21 kilometers, on a loop road that begins at the Red Rock National Conservation Area Visitor Center and ends on Nevada state Route 159, just south of the visitor center. Red Rock National Conservation Area is in Las Vegas, 17 miles west of the Strip.

Red Rock Road, a scenic, one-day drive within the Red Rock National Conservation Area, affords views of red sandstone cliffs and limestone bluffs that formed millions of years ago. Multiple parking areas along the road provide access to trailheads and picnic areas. Visitors also enjoy off-trail exploring on the sandstone, especially at the Calico I and Calico II areas, which are popular with rock climbers.

Before embarking on the scenic drive, visitors may want to check out the visitor center, which has indoor/outdoor exhibits explaining the area's geology, wildlife and recreational opportunities. Entry into Red Rock NCA, which is operated by the Bureau of Land Management, is \$7 per car.

EXTEND YOUR TRIP:

Spring Mountain Ranch State Park, a 520-acre oasis kept green by springwater, is about five miles south of Red Rock NCA Visitor Center on Nevada state Route 159. Walking trails pass by pinion-juniper, black brush and other desert plants. The park's centerpiece is the ranch house, once owned by Howard Hughes, among others. Entry into the state park is \$9 per car.

LAS VEGAS STRIP

One day, 4.5 miles, 7.2 kilometers, from the intersection of Las Vegas Boulevard and Russell Road, north on Las Vegas Boulevard until it intersects with Sahara Avenue

The Las Vegas Strip draws millions every year with its casinos, entertainment, shopping and dining, and thanks to the profusion of LED light displays and neon signs found there, it's considered a nighttime scenic byway by the Federal Highway Administration.

Start your trip on the Strip a little south of Russell Road, so you can view the iconic "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas" sign. There's a parking lot at the sign (accessible from southbound Las Vegas Boulevard) so be sure to stop for a selfie.

The Strip's ever-changing skyline currently includes New York New York, which has a roller coaster snaking through the resort's recreation of the Big Apple; Paris Las Vegas, which sports a 541-foot-tall Eiffel Tower; and the Bellagio, fronted by a lake with water fountains timed to operate in coordination with music and lights. One of the newer attractions is the High Roller, a 550-foot-tall Ferris wheel directly across from Caesars, with its Greek columns and classic statues. Thrill-seekers may want to make a stop at the Stratosphere, a 1,149-foot tower with amusement rides at the top.

The views you take in today are markedly different from what visitors saw in the early 20th century. The first casinos built in the 1940s were smaller than the monoliths that line the famous byway today, but Las Vegas preserves its rich history in a clutch of compelling, interactive museums just off the Strip. Those include the Nevada State Museum, Las Vegas inside Spring Preserve cultural institution on Valley View Boulevard; the National Atomic Testing Museum on Flamingo Road; and the Mob Museum on Stewart Avenue.

EXTEND YOUR TRIP:

The intersection of Las Vegas Boulevard and Sahara Avenue is the north end of the official national scenic byway, but you can continue north on the Strip for another 2.9 miles — this is the state of Nevada's North Las Vegas Strip Scenic Byway. Check out the Neon Museum, which chronicles the history of Las Vegas through its neon signs; the Fremont Street Experience, a five-block entertainment district in historical downtown Las Vegas; and Old Las Vegas Mormon Fort State Park.

Nevada is a big state... a really big state. To help you get around and understand the geography, topography, and history of the state, we talk in terms of territories. The following pages are everything you need to know to find hotels, RV parks, interesting attractions, and contact information for each of the state's six territories.

Cowboy Country: Named for the gritty and gutsy cowboys that still work the ranches in the northern part of the state, Cowboy Country stretches from California to Utah along Interstate 80.

Reno-Tahoe Territory: This is the area in the northwestern part of the state named for Reno and the great Lake Tahoe. This territory includes Carson City, the state capital.

Pony Express Territory: The famed Pony Express Route cuts through the middle of Nevada, roughly parallel to U.S. Highway

50. You'll find Great Basin National Park on the eastern edge of this territory, and Dayton, the first gold discovery site in Nevada, on the western edge.

Nevada Silver Trails: Ghost towns and played-out silver mines dot the landscape in Nevada Silver Trails. This territory is the largest in Nevada, spanning the state east/west and encompassing Area 51 and the Extraterrestrial Highway.

Las Vegas Territory: The eponymous area anchored by Las Vegas also includes the golf mecca of Mesquite and the river city of Laughlin.

Indian Territory: This is the only cultural rather than geographic territory, and it encompasses the entire state. Nevada is covered with significant tribal lands and cultural sites, and it's these gems that make up the Indian Territory.




