### World of Adventure




**WELCOME TO NEVADA!**

You are about to explore one of the most remarkable states in the nation — one that draws visitors from around the world to Las Vegas, while also holding hidden gems such as Great Basin National Park.

Nevada is a state of incomparable beauty, from Lake Tahoe — the largest alpine lake in North America — to Valley of Fire State Park, home of stunning red sandstone formations. This is a state where roadways lead to mining towns brimming with the history of the American West.

Road trips are at the heart of the Nevada experience, and I encourage you to travel our highways and byways. Inside this year’s guide, you’ll find itineraries to help plan your trip — including two that highlight Nevada’s American Indian cultural sites.

One important piece of Nevada’s American Indian history can be found at the Stewart Indian School in Carson City. This former boarding school was in use from 1890 through 1980 and its stone buildings are an icon of education and life for many American Indians in the West. It is now listed on the National Register of Historic Places and managed by the State of Nevada.



While enjoying your Nevada adventure, keep watch for our state-shaped historic markers. There are more than 260 throughout the Silver State and many have been updated in honor of Nevada's sesquicentennial celebration in 2014.

As you travel you're sure to encounter one of Nevada's 23 state parks. These parks are filled with opportunities to fish, explore, and learn about our state's history and wildlife. Make sure to have your passport stamped. The Nevada State Parks Passport is a unique guide to our state, outlining each park to help you plan your adventure.

The Silver State is beautiful and diverse, as you will see in this guide. From Lake Tahoe to Las Vegas to Elko, Nevada is a

world-class destination, no matter what corner of the state you are in. I welcome you to Nevada, and I hope you enjoy your adventure.

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

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## NEVADA PHOTO OPS

Nevada, with its fascinatingly diverse landscapes, just begs to be captured on film (or on digital files)! For inspiration, here are a few suggestions for photo-ops:



**Goldwell Open Air Museum:** This collection of seven large outdoor statues was developed in the 1980s by a group of Belgian artists. Note: The Goldwell statues are protected by copyright, but non-commercial photography for personal use is permitted.



**Lake Tahoe:** North America's largest alpine lake is known for its water clarity and stunning mountain scenery. Photo tip: Sand Harbor State Park has numerous photogenic coves and boulder formations.



**Hoover Dam:** Built in the 1930s to harness the power of the Colorado River, Hoover Dam today is still considered an engineering marvel. Photo tip: Get a full photo of the dam from the Mike O'Callaghan-Pat Tillman Memorial Bridge.

**Pyramid Lake:** The 125,000-acre desert lake located on the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Reservation has tufa formations and Anaho Island, home of one of the largest colonies of American white pelicans in the United States. **Photo tip:** Visit in the spring, when pelicans return to Anaho Island from their wintering areas.

**Sand Mountain:** This 2-mile-long, 600-foot-high sand dune is popular with ATV riders and sand boarders, but also provides an opportunity for photographers. **Photo tip:** Spring and fall are the best times to visit.

**Cathedral Gorge:** This Nevada state park in Lincoln County draws photographers with its siltstone canyons and spires. Camping, hiking and mountain biking also are popular in this area. **Photo tip:** The terrain really stuns after a rainstorm and cloudy skies provide a beautiful contrast to the sand and rock.

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## NEW IN NEVADA

From attractions in Las Vegas to expansions in Reno-Tahoe to developments in rural Nevada, the Silver State continues to evolve. Here's a look at some recent projects:

### LAS VEGAS

**Bear Grylls Survival Academy** opened an Adventure Day Course in September 2015 in Overton, about 64 miles northeast of Las Vegas. Shelter building, high rope work and a navigation challenge in Valley of Fire State Park are among the activities at the academy.

**Casa de Shenandoah**, the 52-acre Las Vegas estate of Wayne Newton, opened September 2015. Tours include an introductory video about "Mr. Las Vegas," a museum area that includes Newton's private jet and classic car collection, an exotic animal collection and Newton's mansion.

**Jennifer Lopez** will begin a headlining residency Jan. 20, 2016, at Planet Hollywood Resort & Casino on the Las Vegas Strip. The show will feature Lopez's hits as well as a combination of ballads, Latin music, funk and more.

**Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino** on the Las Vegas Strip opened a 350,000-square-foot expansion to its convention center in August 2015, and plans a second phase of expansion that transitioned existing space into a 70,000-square-foot carpeted ballroom. That project was completed in early 2016.

**The Park**, an eight-acre outdoor dining and entertainment district between New York-New York Hotel & Casino and Monte Carlo Resort and Casino, is set to open in 2016. The Shake Shack, Bruxie gourmet waffle restaurant and Sake Rok, a theatrical restaurant/late-night lounge, are among the businesses included in the project. The Park will open in conjunction with the **Las Vegas Arena**, a 20,000-seat, \$375 million indoor arena west of the Las Vegas Strip between New York-New York and Monte Carlo Resort and Casino.

**Premium Outlets North**, a retail destination at the intersection of Interstate 15 and Charleston Boulevard in Las Vegas, opened a 25-store expansion in mid-2015. Name brands CH Carolina Herrera, Helmut Lang and Rag & Bone are among the new retailers. In all, the center totals 685,000 square feet and 175 stores.

**Speed Vegas**, a new racecar driving experience on a 1.5-mile track, is set to open March 2016 on Las Vegas Boulevard South, about 11 miles south of the Welcome to Las Vegas sign. Visitors will be able to get behind the wheel of exotic and muscle cars, including Ferraris, Lamborghinis, Audis, Ford Shelby Mustangs and Corvettes.

**Spring Mountains Visitor Gateway**, a 128-acre visitors' center at 2525 Kyle Canyon Road inside Spring Mountains National Recreation Area (also known as Mount Charleston), opened May 2015. About a 45-minute drive north of Las Vegas, this center has an education building, two amphitheaters, group picnic sites and more than 40 miles of adjoining new trails.

The **Moapa Band of Paiutes** expanded its Travel Plaza in Moapa (off Interstate 15 and Valley of Fire Highway) to include an events center/concert venue to accommodate monthly events along with the Moapa Band's annual Fourth of July concert, which featured LeAnn Rimes and Bret Michaels in 2015.

## RENO-TAHOE

Craft brewery **Beer NV** opened in August 2015 at 15 Foothill Road inside the South Creek shopping center in Reno. The tap house, with 60 craft beers and four wines on draft, joins a host of craft breweries and distilleries in the Reno area.

**Edgewood Tahoe** golf course on the south shore of Lake Tahoe in Stateline, will debut a new No. 9 hole in 2015. The realignment of the No. 9 hole and other changes to the course are part of a project to open the spectacular 154-room Lodge at Edgewood in 2017.

**Heavenly Mountain Resort** debuted a permanent climbing wall at its Epic Discovery center at the top of the gondola in September 2015. Also opened in September: a children's ropes course and zip line, which will operate during the summer season. The resort also added an alpine coaster in November 2015 slated to be in operation during the 2015-16 ski season. The coaster is at the top of the gondola and allows guests on individual sleds to descend on a raised track through forest and natural rock formations. Heavenly also plans to open its mid-station zip line canopy tour in summer 2016.

The **Washoe Tribe of Nevada and California** is set to open a Travel Plaza in early 2016 in Gardnerville, part of a larger project that will include a casino. The Travel Plaza will have a 6,000-square-foot convenience store and smoke shop and a fueling station. An 18,000-square-foot casino is scheduled to open in summer 2016. The casino project is in partnership with the Poarch Creek Indian Tribe from Alabama.

**RURAL NEVADA**

**Ash Meadows National Wildlife Refuge** in the Amargosa Valley, about 90 miles from Las Vegas, opened a visitors center in 2015. Interactive exhibits on area wildlife, including the rare desert pupfish, can be found here.



**The Elko Convention & Visitors Authority** completed a 29,000-square-foot expansion to the Elko Conference Center in late 2015. The expansion added 19,000 square feet of meeting space; in total the Conference Center has 80,000 square feet, with 30,000 square feet of meeting space and a 913-seat theater.

**Holiday Inn Express and Suites** opened in September in Pahrump. The 104-room property has a pool, fitness center and in-room Wi-Fi.

The **Battle Mountain Band of the Te-Moak Tribe of Western Shoshone Indians of Nevada** broke ground in August 2015, on a new casino, hotel and travel plaza in Battle Mountain. The project will include a 150- to 200-room hotel, 200 to 300 gaming machines, a convenience store and two fuel islands, one for big rigs and one for smaller vehicles. The project is expected to be completed in December 2016.

**NATIONAL MONUMENTS**

**Basin and Range National Monument**, a 700,000-acre monument in Lincoln and Nye counties known for desert valleys rich with prehistory and recent history, was established in July 2015. Managed by the Bureau of Land Management, Basin and Range currently does not have a visitors center or facilities. Those interested in visiting should contact the BLM.

**Tule Springs Fossil Beds National Monument**, about 20 miles north of the Las Vegas Strip, was established in December 2014. The 22,650-acre monument has sites that represent geological periods from 200,000 years to 3,000 years ago. Currently there is no visitors center or facilities at this National Park Service-managed monument, but those interested in visiting can find information on the NPS website, nps.gov, then searching in Nevada in the "Find a Park" field.






## Day 1

**RED ROCK CANYON, GOODSPRINGS:** Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area (NCA), 17 miles (27 km) west of the Las Vegas Strip, is popular for hiking, bicycling and rock climbing. A visitors center explains the area's geologic and natural history, and a 13-mile (21-km) scenic drive offers several trailheads. Red Rock Canyon NCA also encompasses Bonnie Springs Ranch, a family-friendly destination with horseback rides and more, and Spring Mountain Ranch State Park.


Finish the day with a trip to Goodsprings, about 48 miles (77 km) southeast of Red Rock Canyon. The town's claim to fame is the storied Pioneer Saloon where, in 1942, actor Clark Gable waited for three days to hear the fate of his wife, Carole Lombard, who had died in a nearby plane crash.

## Day 2

**LAUGHLIN:** Hotel-resorts line the Colorado River in this small gaming town 102 miles (165 km) south of Las Vegas. Lounge by the river, rent boats or Jet Skis, or explore such area sites as Big Bend of the Colorado State Recreation Area, Black Mountains and Lake Mohave.

### Day 3

**BOULDER CITY, HOOVER DAM, LAKE MEAD:** Constructed in the 1930s to house workers building Hoover Dam, Boulder City is one of two Nevada towns where gaming is illegal. The town, 26 miles (42 km) southeast of Las Vegas, is home to the Nevada State Railroad Museum, Boulder City, and the Southern Nevada Railway, which offers excursion rides. Hoover Dam, considered one of the country's engineering marvels, is a short drive from downtown Boulder City. Lake Mead, created with the construction of Hoover Dam, is accessible at Boulder Beach.

### Day 4

**VALLEY OF FIRE, LOST CITY MUSEUM:** Valley of Fire State Park, 52 miles (84 km) northeast of Las Vegas, is famous for its red sandstone formations and petroglyphs (ancient rock art). Learn about the park at the visitors center, and explore area trails. Depart through the park's eastern entrance, and head up to Overton to see the Lost City Museum, which preserves artifacts from Pueblo Grande de Nevada, which was partially submerged by the creation of Lake Mead in the 1930s.

### Day 5

**DEATH VALLEY NATIONAL PARK:** About 120 miles (193 km) west of Las Vegas, Death Valley National Park straddles Nevada and California. Get the lay of the land at the Furnace Creek Visitor Center before exploring Badwater Basin, Devil's Golf Course, Artists Palette, Zabriskie Point and Dante's View. The park is open year-round, but some services may be limited in the summer months.

Downtown Las Vegas exudes retro-funk from the cool neon at the El Cortez - Las Vegas’ longest-running hotel and casino - to the old-fashioned malts, with prices to match, at the 1950s soda foundation of Tiffany’s Café.

Soak up some history with a stroll through two of Las Vegas’ most celebrated museums, the Mob Museum and the Neon Museum. The Mob Museum is housed in the former federal courthouse where mob trials took place. The Neon Museum is an outdoor collection of vintage neon signs spanning many decades of Las Vegas’ casino history.

Several mid-century-modern neighborhoods have withstood the test of time and reemerged as the place to live the Vintage Vegas dream.

Paradise Palms, once home to Rat Pack stars and mob kings such as Dean Marty, Frank “Lefty” Rosenthal, Johnny Carson, and Debbie Reynolds, is a community of 1950s lime green and sky blue single-story homes near the Las Vegas National Golf Course, then known as the Stardust Country Club.

**RETRO DIGS**

You can deck out your home in midcentury décor or find that perfect piece of retro art in this funky shop along “Antique Alley” southwest of downtown. Shops include Retro Vegas, Vintage Vegas Antiques, Glam Factory Vintage, Lost Vegas Antiques, and Sin City Pickers, just to name a few.

**DRINK AND DINE**

Atomic Liquors, a 1950s bar named for the time when patrons watched atomic blasts far off in the Nevada desert from the store’s roof. The Rat Pack and Smothers Brothers were said to have ended their nights here, and Barbara Streisand even had her own seat, which has been restored and is on display.

The Golden Steer has served its famous steak dinners to droves of Golden Age celebrities, including Natalie Wood, Nat King Cole, Joe DiMaggio, Elvis Presley, and Marilyn Monroe.

The Bootlegger Italian Bistro doesn’t look vintage on the outside - its modernized Tuscan exterior south of McCarran International Airport belies the depth of history found inside its stone façade - but history runs deep here, as evidenced by the walls covered in snapshots of celebrities who have dined on Mama Marie’s authentic Italian fare. Marie’s daughter and restaurant owner, former Nevada Lt. Gov. Lorraine Hunt-Bono, often takes the stage with her showbiz husband Dennis Bono to entertain patrons and share a hint of Las Vegas’ glamorous past.





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

## Day 1

**PYRAMID LAKE:** About 50 miles (80 km) northeast of Reno is a vast desert lake within the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Reservation. Pyramid Lake Scenic Byway, on the southwest side of the lake, is the only national scenic byway completely within an American Indian reservation. To the northwest is the Dunn Fish Hatchery in Sutcliffe; tours are available in the spring. On the southern end of the lake is the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Visitors Center in Nixon. Viewable from the lake shore is Anaho Island, home to one of the largest colonies of American white pelicans in the United States.

## Day 2

**VIRGINIA CITY:** Step back in time — about 150 years — when you enter Virginia City, 26 miles (42 km) south of Reno. Wooden sidewalks, saloons, Mark Twain artifacts and a whole lot of fun await in this town, which was featured in the '60s TV series “Bonanza.” A narrated trolley tour is the best way to learn the history of the town before spending the day shopping, taking old-fashioned photos and sidling up to a genu-wine saloon bar. The historical V&T Railroad offers excursion rides from May through October.

## Day 3

**CARSON CITY, CARSON VALLEY:** Carson City, the state capital, is 31 miles (50 km) south of Reno, making for an easy day trip from the Biggest Little City. Tour the Capitol building; the Nevada State Museum, Carson City; and the Nevada State Railroad Museum, which runs diesel or steam trains on weekends and some holidays May through December. Those interested in the city's history may want to take the Kit Carson Walking Tour, a self-guided walk through the historic downtown district.

About 15 miles (24 km) south of Carson City are the towns of Minden and Gardnerville in the Carson Valley. These bucolic communities are marked by ranches, antique shops and Victorian homes. Check out the Corley Ranch in October for the Pumpkin Patch Harvest Festival or visit Jacobs Family Berry Farm in mid-summer to early fall for fresh produce. Learn more at the Carson Valley Museum and Cultural Center, or plan ahead to visit the Dangberg Home Ranch Historic Park, accessible by guided tour.

## Day 4

**LAKE TAHOE:** Described by Mark Twain as the "fairest picture the whole earth affords," Lake Tahoe is the largest alpine lake in North America. About 37 miles (60 km) southwest of Reno, Lake Tahoe's north shore is anchored by Incline Village, which boasts two golf courses, a ski resort and a lakefront hotel. On the south shore, the town of Stateline draws crowds with its casino-resorts, Heavenly Mountain Resort and Edgewood Tahoe golf course.

In the summer, visitors enjoy beach time at Sand Harbor State Park and Zephyr Cove Resort, as well as hiking on the Tahoe Rim Trail and bicycling on the Flume Trail. In winter, Lake Tahoe becomes a skier's paradise, with Mt. Rose-Ski Tahoe, Diamond Peak and Heavenly ski resorts easily accessible from Reno.

Lake Tahoe's two main destinations - North Shore and South Shore - are easily accessible from Reno and Carson City, and are thriving with activity and entertainment year-round.

#### **NORTH SHORE - 36 MILES (58 KM) VIA I-580 AND S.R. 431**

The north shore is anchored by Incline Village, an upscale mountain hamlet boasting its own ski resort, Diamond Peak, two golf courses, a range of accommodations, and sunny stretches of sandy beach. Visitors staying at the Hyatt Regency Lake Tahoe in Incline Village can rent kayaks and other water toys from the hotel's private beach. The entire property - beach and pier included - are Wi-Fi equipped, but don't spend too much time on a laptop when you have the blue expanses of Lake Tahoe at your fingertips.

In the summer, the Lake Tahoe Shakespeare Festival presents live performances every night of its six-week season. Arrive early to stroll along the beach and share a picnic dinner in the festival's sand amphitheater. Plan your day of outdoor adventure with the North Lake Tahoe Ale Trail, which links water and land trails to breweries and pubs.

#### **SOUTH SHORE - 59 MILES VIA I-580 AND US-50**

The south shore of Lake Tahoe is perhaps best known for the towering casinos of Stateline and the bustling village at Heavenly Mountain Resort. This year-round village features restaurants, shops, galleries, and activities right at the base of Heavenly's ski gondola. Visitors can ride the gondola in the summer months to access seemingly endless miles of hiking trails or to simply take in the staggering view of the lake.

Zephyr Cove on the southeast shore of the lake is a hot spot for renting boats, kayaks, and stand-up paddle boards, or meeting friends during a game of beach volleyball. This is also the launch point for the regal M.S. Dixie II, a southern-style paddlewheel boat that runs sightseeing excursions and evening dinner/dance cruises throughout the year. The beach-lined cove is also a favorite for family gatherings, weddings, and weekend getaways.

Harveys Tahoe casino-resort brings big-name musical artists to its outdoor amphitheater all summer long while neighboring resorts boast comedy and music acts any night of the week. Be sure to visit in July to get your celebrity fix at the American Century Celebrity Golf Tournament held at Edgewood Tahoe. The golf resort's fine-dining restaurant also offers lakeside dining with spectacular sunset views.

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# HIGHWAY 95 — FROM RENO TO LAS VEGAS – THREE DAYS

## Day 1

RENO, FALLON: 63 MILES, (101 KM), PLUS AN ADDITIONAL 12 MILES (19 KM) FOR A DETOUR TO STILLWATER:

Depart Reno on Interstate 80 west and U.S. Alt 50 west to Fallon, one of Nevada’s agricultural communities. Stop at Lattin Farms for fresh produce, fill up on authentic Basque cuisine at the Overland Hotel and learn about the area’s cultural and natural history at the Churchill County Museum. If time allows, commune with nature at the nearby Stillwater National Wildlife Refuge.

## Day 2

HAWTHORNE, TONOPAH, 175 MILES (281 KM): Depart Fallon on U.S. 95 south through the Walker River Indian Reservation, and you’ll see Walker Lake to the east. Take a break in Hawthorne, dubbed “America’s Patriotic Home,” as it houses a U.S. Army ammunition depot. Check out wartime memorabilia and vintage U.S. weaponry at the Hawthorne Ordnance Museum.

Continue on U.S. 95 to Tonopah, site of a major mining strike in 1900. Learn why this town once was called “The Queen of the Silver Camps” at the Tonopah Historic Mining Park and explore the area’s history at the Central Nevada Museum.

### Day 3

**GOLDFIELD, BEATTY, RHYOLITE, GOLDWELL OPEN AIR MUSEUM, BIG DUNE/AMARGOSA VALLEY, LAS VEGAS, 211 MILES (339 KM):** Depart Tonopah on U.S. 95 south for Goldfield. Walk through the streets of this former mining boomtown to check out the old Goldfield High School, where the famous Nelson-Gans boxing match took place in 1906. Peek in the windows of the reportedly haunted Goldfield Hotel, in operation in the early 20th century. As you depart via the south end of town, to the west, you'll see dozens of automobiles planted in the desert. That's the International Car Forest of the Last Church art installation.

Continue on U.S. 95 to Beatty, a lively town on the eastern edge of Death Valley National Park. With watering holes like Happy Burro Chili and Beer, KC's Outpost and the Sourdough Saloon, it's easy to find a local place to eat. Take a short (4 mile, 5 km) detour to Rhyolite, one of the most-photographed ghost towns in the West. As you drive up to Rhyolite, you'll see the Goldwell Open Air Museum, an amazing display of several large-scale sculptures.

Back on U.S. 95, continue south about 29 (46 km) miles to Big Dune in the Amargosa Valley. This 1.5-square-mile sand dune reaches 300 feet above the Amargosa Valley. Your desert adventure is winding down as you head from sand dune to Sin City. Las Vegas is 89 miles (142 km) away.

**SOUTHERN NEVADA LOOP** — EXPLORE THE VALLEY OF FIRE, DRIVE THE EXTRA-TERRESTRIAL HIGHWAY AND CHECK OUT HISTORICAL MINING TOWNS ON THIS ROAD TRIP BEGINNING AND ENDING IN LAS VEGAS. PLAN FOR FOUR DAYS, 564 MILES (908 KM).

**Day 1:** VALLEY OF FIRE STATE PARK AND ALAMO, 150 MILES, (241 KM): Rev your engines in Las Vegas and take off for Valley of Fire State Park. Explore red sandstone formations, hike trails past ancient Indian petroglyphs and track down the sites where scenes from “Star Trek: Generations” and “Transformers” were filmed.

On your way to Alamo, stop at Pahrangat National Wildlife Refuge, one of the few wetland habitats in southern Nevada, for bird watching and hiking. Overnight in Alamo at the luxurious A Cowboy’s Dream Bed & Breakfast or at Windmill Ridge, which boasts a cluster of cozy cabins.

**Day 2:** RACHEL, THE EXTRATERRESTRIAL HIGHWAY, TONOPAH, 160 MILES, (258 KM)

Be on the lookout for UFOs as you drive the Extraterrestrial Highway (Nevada State Route 375). This remote highway is on the northern edge of Nevada Test and Training Range, which houses the mysterious Area 51, reportedly the site of alien autopsies. Stop at the Little A’Le’Inn — you can’t miss it, it’s among the only cluster of buildings you’ll see on this stretch — for a snack and some souvenir shopping.

Continue to Tonopah, site of Nevada’s second great mining boom in the early 20th century. Learn about this history at the Tonopah Mining Park and the Central Nevada Museum. There’s plenty of lodging options in Tonopah, including the stately Mizpah Hotel.

**Day 3: GOLDFIELD, BEATTY, DEATH VALLEY NATIONAL PARK, 94 MILES, (151 KM), plus extra exploring**

Just south of Tonopah is the old mining town of Goldfield. Walk the town to see such storied structures as the Goldfield Hotel and Goldfield High School, where the famed Nelson-Gans boxing match of 1906 took place. Just south of town is the International Car Forest of the Last Church, an art installation of cars half-buried in the desert hills.

Continue to Beatty, your base camp as you explore nearby Death Valley National Park. Stop by the Furnace Creek Visitors Center & Museum to learn about the park's geology and natural history before checking out such sites as Zabriskie Point, Badwater Basin, Devil's Golf Course and Artist's Drive.

**Day 4: RHYOLITE, PAHRUMP, 150 MILES, (241 KM)**

On your way out of town, take a short detour to the ghost town of Rhyolite, a boottown in the early 1900s. As you drive up to it, you'll see the Goldwell Open Air Museum, the site of several large-scale sculptures, including the much-photographed "The Last Supper," by Alfred Szukalski.

Head back to Las Vegas via Pahrump, home to two of Nevada's four wineries, as well as the Spring Mountain Motorsports Ranch, where you can fly over the water via a Jetpack America experience. End your adventure where you started: Las Vegas. You've come a long way, but the fun isn't over: you're in the Entertainment Capital of the World, after all.

**INTERSTATE 80-HIGHWAY 50 LOOP – FIVE DAYS** — GREAT BASIN NATIONAL PARK, THE HISTORICAL NEVADA NORTHERN RAILWAY AND THE “COWBOY CAPITAL” OF ELKO ARE ON THE INTERSTATE 80-HIGHWAY 50 LOOP, WHICH BEGINS AND ENDS IN RENO. FOR PART OF THIS LOOP, YOU’LL BE TRAVELING WHAT *LIFE* MAGAZINE ONCE CALLED “THE LONELIEST HIGHWAY IN AMERICA” — THE STRETCH OF U.S. 50 FROM FERNLEY TO ELY. PLAN FOR FIVE DAYS, 865 MILES, (1,392 KM)

**Day 1:** LOVELOCK, WINNEMUCCA, ELKO 289 MILES (466 KM)

Goodbye, Reno — east on Interstate 80 to Lovelock. In the mid-19th century, this community served as a resting place for pioneers traveling the Emigrant Trail out West. Here, you can “lock your love” in the plaza behind the Pershing County Courthouse, visit the Marzen House Museum or explore the Lovelock Cave archeological site about 20 miles south of Lovelock.

Continue on to Winnemucca, swing by the visitors center inside the Winnemucca Convention Center and stretch your legs on the historical walking tour. Then it’s off to Elko.

**Day 2:** ELKO, LAMOILLE CANYON, CALIFORNIA TRAIL INTERPRETIVE CENTER (MILEAGE VARIES)

Elko is your home base today. Check out the Western Folklife Center, and enjoy the art gallery and small theater showing a 16-minute video about the tradition of cowboy poetry and music. Next visit the Northeastern Nevada Museum, and explore the extensive collection of work by Western writer-illustrator Will James. From Elko, it’s a 20-mile (31 km) trip to Lamoille Canyon, a glacier-carved canyon in the Ruby Mountains with a scenic drive and hiking trails. History buffs will want to check out the California Trail Interpretive Center, eight miles west of Elko on Interstate 80.



### Day 3: ELY, 187 MILES (300 KM)


Depart Elko for Ely, a small mining community and home of the East Ely Railroad Depot Museum and the Nevada Northern Railway, a historic railway that offers excursion rides. Explore Renaissance Village, a cluster of cabins decorated to showcase the various ethnic groups that settled in the area, and take in the various murals painted on downtown buildings.

### Day 4: GREAT BASIN NATIONAL PARK, 67 MILES (109 KM) (ONE-WAY)

Ely is home base as you visit Great Basin National Park. Explore the Lehman Caves ecosystem, a marble cave system acclaimed for its rare shield formations; in the warmer months, take the 12-mile scenic drive up Wheeler Peak and hike to the 13,063-foot summit. The park has two visitors centers: the Great Basin Visitor Center in Baker and the Lehman Caves Visitor Center in the park.

### Day 5: TAKE THE LONELIEST ROAD BACK TO RENO, 322 MILES (517 KM)

Head back to Reno on Highway 50, known as the “Loneliest Road in America” since 1986, when a *Life* Magazine article bestowed the highway’s infamous nickname. Get your hands on an official Highway 50 Survival Guide and have it stamped in towns along the way — Eureka, Austin and Fallon among them. Mail it in to the state of Nevada for a Highway 50 Survivor souvenir and certificate.

### CHURCHILL VINEYARDS AND FREY RANCH DISTILLERY

About eight miles (12 km) south of downtown Fallon on U.S. 95 is Churchill Vineyards, the only Nevada winery producing estate white wines, and Frey Ranch Distillery, the state's first commercial distillery. Open by appointment only.

### GRIMES POINT ARCHEOLOGICAL AREA

This Bureau of Land Management archeological site seven miles (11 km) east of Fallon has several petroglyphs — ancient rock art — visible from an interpretive trail. Hidden Cave, just one mile from Grimes Point, is another archeological site and is accessible by guided tour only. Check with the Churchill County Museum in Fallon for information.

### STILLWATER NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

About 17 miles (27 km) northeast of Fallon, Stillwater attracts migrating fowl and shorebirds on the Pacific Flyway, a major north-south route for birds. Interpretive signs on the refuge's hiking trails explain the cultural and geologic history of the Lahontan Valley. Stillwater is managed by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

### SAND MOUNTAIN

Just 25 miles (40 km) east of Fallon, Sand Mountain is a 2-mile-long, 600-foot-high sand dune popular with off-road vehicle riders and sand boarders. The site is managed by the Bureau of Land Management.

### COLD SPRINGS STATION

Highway 50 roughly parallels the old Pony Express, the horseback mail route that operated from 1860 to 1861. See a remnant of a Pony Express station at Cold Springs, about 60 miles (96 km) east of Fallon. The area also has a restaurant, RV park and convenience store.

### STOKES CASTLE

This three-story stone tower on the west end of Austin was built in 1897 as a summer home for mine developer Anson Phelps Stokes. It was used for only a few months before it was abandoned. Today, visitors can view the structure as well as the surrounding panoramic valley.

### TOQUIMA CAVE AND PETROGLYPH SITE

The Toquima Cave campground, part of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest, is about 13 miles (20 km) east of Austin, 12 miles of which are gravel road. Petroglyphs dating back to about 600 to 1300 A.D. are visible from the cave entrance, which is fenced off. Access is via a half-mile trail beginning at the campground.

### HICKISON PETROGLYPHS

This Hickison Petroglyphs campground, managed by the Bureau of Land Management, is 24 miles (38 km) east of Austin. Hiking paths wind by petroglyphs in this area. There also are 24 campsites and picnic facilities.

### GARNET HILL

About four miles (6.5 km) northwest of Ely, Garnet Hill is a designated rock-hounding area managed by the Bureau of Land Management. Visitors can search for garnets and take them home. There is limited camping space, and access to the area is free.

### CAVE LAKE STATE PARK

Cave Lake State Park, about 14 miles (22.5 km) southeast of Ely, attracts visitors with its 32-acre reservoir. Trout fishing, boating, swimming, hiking, camping and picnicking are popular here.

### WARD CHARCOAL OVENS STATE HISTORIC PARK

Just 18 miles (29 km) south of Ely on a well-graded gravel road that may not be accessible in inclement weather, the Ward Charcoal Ovens are a set of six 30-foot-high, beehive-shaped ovens. From 1876 to 1879, charcoal was made here for use in the smelters of the Ward Mining District.

## **HIGHWAY 93** — THE GREAT BASIN HIGHWAY — NEVADA STATE PARKS FROM LAS VEGAS TO ELY - TWO DAYS

THIS HIGHWAY CONNECTS LAS VEGAS TO GREAT BASIN NATIONAL PARK NEAR ELY. SEVERAL OF NEVADA'S 23 STATE PARKS ARE EASILY ACCESSIBLE FROM HIGHWAY 93, MAKING FOR A SCENIC DEPARTURE FROM LAS VEGAS. PLAN FOR TWO DAYS, 344 MILES (554 KM)

### **Day 1:** VALLEY OF FIRE STATE PARK, KERSHAW-RYAN STATE PARK, CATHEDRAL GORGE STATE PARK 237 MILES, (381 KM), PLUS DRIVING WITHIN THE STATE PARKS

Depart Las Vegas on Interstate 15 to Valley of Fire State Park, named for its stunning red sandstone formations. Ponder the park's petroglyphs — ancient rock art dating back thousands of years — before backtracking a bit on Interstate 15 to the Highway 93 interchange. From here, it's on to Kershaw-Ryan State Park.

Nowhere is the contrast of wild and tame as stark as in Kershaw-Ryan State Park. Located in a scenic canyon with a spring-fed pond, Kershaw-Ryan offers an unexpected touch of green in rugged desert landscape. The park has an RV campground, a manicured lawn, picnic tables and a shallow wading pool. Beyond are rugged stone cliffs reaching up to 700 feet and lined with hiking trails.

Continue north on Highway 93 to Cathedral Gorge State Park. Here, explore unusual clay spires and towers carved by erosion over millions of years. Walking trails provide great views of the cathedral-like structures and original picnicking facilities built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s remain in use today. A visitors center provides information about the park as well as six other area state parks.

Overnight in Pioche, Panaca or Caliente.





## Day 2: WARD CHARCOAL OVENS, CAVE LAKE, ELY, 107 MILES (173 KM), PLUS DRIVING WITHIN THE STATE PARKS

If time allows, consider checking out more of the area's state parks: Beaver Dam State Park, Echo Canyon State Park and Spring Valley State Park are in the vicinity. Then it's north on Highway 93 to Ward Charcoal Ovens State Historic Park. Here, six 30-foot-tall, beehive-shaped stone ovens stand sentinel at the base of the Egan Mountain Range. These ovens were used in 1870s to make charcoal for use in the smelters of the Ward Mining District.

Continue on to Cave Lake State Park, which showcases a glistening, high-elevation lake in the Schell Creek Range. Hikers, anglers and adventure junkies are drawn to Cave Lake all year round. Just far enough off the main highway to get away with a little mischief, the lake also is home to the offbeat Great Bathtub Boat Races, also known as Cocktails and Cannons for the drinks and random cannon-firing that happen July 4 weekend.

Overnight in Ely, a mining town and home of the historical Nevada Northern Railway. From here, plan a side trip to Great Basin National Park, about 67 miles (108 km) east of Ely.

## NEVADA'S STATE PARKS

NEVADA'S 23 STATE PARKS SPAN ALL CORNERS OF THE SILVER STATE, AND OFFER UNLIMITED ADVENTURE AND ACTIVITIES. Berlin-Ichthyosaur State Park

**Berlin-Ichthyosaur:** This park is a curious blend of history.

Berlin was an 1890s mining town adjacent to an ichthyosaur fossil site. Visitors can tour the ghost town and mill; seasonal tours of the park's Diana Mine and the Fossil Shelter are available.

**Fort Churchill:** Ruins of an 1860s U.S. Army fort are a fascinating backdrop for hiking, biking and camping.

Visitors can tour the fort. Across the highway is Buckland Station, a stop on the old Pony Express mail route that operated from 1860 to 1861.

**Mormon Station:** Tucked into the base of the eastern Sierra Nevada is Genoa. Mormon settlers built a trading post here in the 1850s. The site later was used by the Pony Express and by travelers. Visitors can tour the museum, stockade and wagon shed, as well as the surrounding park.



## Rye Patch Reservoir:


The 22-mile-long reservoir draws visitors for camping, fishing, boating, swimming and, of course, exploring.



## Spring Mountain Ranch:

This western ranch once owned by eccentric millionaire Howard Hughes gives visitors a peek into ranching life in the early 20th century. The park is inside the Red Rock National Conservation Area.

**NATIONAL PARKS** — EVERYONE LOVES A BIRTHDAY, AND THIS YEAR YOU'RE ALL INVITED TO THE PARTY. THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE TURNS 100 IN 2016, AND NEVADA'S OWN GREAT BASIN NATIONAL PARK TURNS 30. THIS IS THE YEAR TO LOG SOME SERIOUS ROAD TRIP MILES AND REDISCOVER AMERICA'S NATIONAL PARKS.



"There are no words that can tell the hidden spirit of the wilderness, that can reveal its mystery, its melancholy, and its charm," said President Theodore Roosevelt, conservationist and founder of the National Park Service. Thanks to his vision and action as president, some of America's most stunning, inspiring landscape is protected and maintained for public use.

Great Basin National Park, the only national park entirely within Nevada's borders, is still a youngster in park-years, designated in 1986 and followed by only 10 parks since then. It is best recognized by the glacial Wheeler Peak, the tallest mountain peak in Nevada, and the subterranean Lehman Caves.

Adventure-seekers can plot a route to the top of Wheeler Peak, best attempted in the late spring and early fall seasons. But you don't have to be Bear Grylls to enjoy the rugged terrain of Great Basin; the paved 12-mile Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive offers access to trail heads, camping, and picnic areas. The Bristlecone Trail is a moderate 5 1/2-mile roundtrip hike to a grove of bristlecone pine trees, some as old as 3,000 years.

Great Basin National Park is on the eastern edge of Nevada, a five-hour drive from Las Vegas. It's often included as a must-see on treks across Highway 50, "The Loneliest Road in America."

On Nevada's southwestern edge is Death Valley National Park, arguably one of the most famous parks in the U.S. With adjectives like hottest, driest, lowest, and names like Furnace Creek, Stovepipe Wells, Badwater, and Devil's Golf Course, one might be surprised that more than 1.1 million people venture into its protected lands every year, many from its eastern border with Nevada.

Pahrump, one hour northwest of Las Vegas, is a perfect base camp for adventuring in Death Valley. From 24-hour casinos and restaurants to new hotels, a JetPack experience, and two celebrated wineries, there's plenty to do in Pahrump after spending a day exploring the natural wonders and oddities of Death Valley.

## NEVADA'S INDIAN TERRITORY — THREE-NIGHT NORTHERN NEVADA INDIAN TERRITORY ADVENTURE

LAKE TAHOE, STEWART INDIAN SCHOOL, LOVELOCK CAVES, PYRAMID LAKE AND OTHER AREAS OF CULTURAL AND HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE ARE HIGHLIGHTED IN THIS ITINERARY BEGINNING AND ENDING IN RENO.



### Day 1: RENO, LAKE TAHOE, CARSON CITY, 107 MILES (172 KM)

From Reno, take Interstate 80 west to Donner Memorial State Park and Tahoe City, both of which showcase the culture of the Washoe (WA She Shu) people and more. Continue on State Route 28 and U.S. 50 to Cave Rock State Park on the southeastern shore of Lake Tahoe (Dao w). Cave Rock (De'ek wadapushand) is one of the most sacred cultural and spiritual sites to the Washoe People.

From Cave Rock State Park, travel east on U.S. 50 to Carson City and visit the historic Stewart Indian School, a federal boarding school for Native American children in operation from 1890 through 1980. Visitors can experience the history of the school through a self-guided cell phone walking tour. Head north on U.S. 395 to tour the Nevada State Museum, Carson City, which features an "Under One Sky" exhibit as well as compelling artifacts from the lives of American Indian leader Sarah Winnemucca and basket weaver Dat-So-La-Lee. Overnight in Carson City.

### Day 2: CARSON CITY, FORT CHURCHILL, WALKER RIVER RESERVATION, FALLON, 152 MILES (244 KM)

From Carson City, take U.S. 50 and Alt. Highway 95 to Fort Churchill State Historic Park. Fort Churchill was established in July 1860 by the federal government following the Pyramid Lake War between American Indians and settlers arriving in western Nevada. From there, take Alt. Highway 95 east to the Walker River Paiute Reservation, the home of the Walker River Paiute Tribe (Agai-Dicutta). There, you can fish or camp at the Weber Reservoir (tribal permit required) and purchase American Indian crafts at the Four Seasons Market in Schurz. From the reservation, head north to Fallon and visit the Churchill County Museum, where you can view exhibits of what life was like for the area's early Northern Paiute (Numu) and Western Shoshone (Newe) inhabitants. Overnight in Fallon.

### **Day 3:** SAND MOUNTAIN, GRIMES POINT, STILLWATER NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE, LOVELOCK, 136 MILES (212 KM)

From Fallon, take U.S. 50 east to the Sand Mountain Recreational Area, an important spiritual area to the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe (Toi Ticutta). From there, travel west to the Grimes Point Archaeological Area to take a self-guided interpretive walking tour through ancient petroglyphs and rock art. From Grimes Point, it's a short ride east (partially unpaved) to the Hidden Cave Archaeological Area. Tours of Hidden Cave are offered to the public on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month by the Churchill County Museum and the Bureau of Land Management, and special tours can be arranged through the museum.

From Hidden Cave, take U.S. 50 and Nevada State Route 116 to the Stillwater National Wildlife Refuge. The Paiute and Shoshone people have lived near these diverse wetlands for thousands of years and the area attracts more than a quarter million waterfowl annually. From Stillwater, follow Nevada State Route 116 and U.S. 50 back to Fallon and shop for American Indian crafts at the Fox Peak Station, then continue on U.S. 95 north and I-80 east to Lovelock. Overnight in Lovelock.

### **Day 4:** LOVELOCK CAVES, PYRAMID LAKE, RENO, 165 MILES (265 KM)

From Lovelock, you'll travel southeast on Lovelock Cave Backcountry Byway to the Lovelock Cave archaeological site. In 1924, archeologists discovered a 2,000-year-old tule duck decoy within Lovelock Cave; the decoy would later become Nevada's official state artifact.

From Lovelock Cave, follow I-80 west and Nevada State Route 447 north to the Pyramid Lake Paiute Museum and Visitors Center in Nixon. At the museum, discover the unique history and culture of the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe (Kuyuidokado) and learn why the Paiute people consider Pyramid Lake and its surrounding landscape sacred. From the museum, take State Route 446 west to the Popcorn Rock Wildlife Viewing Area. Here, you can see area fish and wildlife as well as view the distinctive tufa rock formations that surround Pyramid Lake. From Popcorn Rock, you can enjoy world-class fishing and other recreation (tribal permit required) or take the Pyramid Lake National Scenic Byway and State Route 445 back to Reno for additional days or for your departure from the Reno-Tahoe International Airport.

## NEVADA'S INDIAN TERRITORY — THREE-NIGHT SOUTHERN NEVADA INDIAN TERRITORY ADVENTURE

EXPLORE NEVADA'S AMERICAN INDIAN CULTURE BY FOLLOWING THIS ITINERARY HIGHLIGHTING CULTURAL SITES IN SOUTHERN NEVADA.

### Day 1: LAS VEGAS, PAHRUMP, 78 MILES (125 KM)

Start with a visit to the Springs Preserve cultural institution and the Nevada State Museum in Las Vegas. At Springs Preserve, explore colorful galleries, botanical gardens and interpretive trails through a scenic wetland habitat. On the same campus, the Nevada State Museum offers an opportunity to learn about Sarah Winnemucca, Wovoka, and Dat So La Lee and to learn how American Indians have shaped and continue to shape the history and culture of Nevada.

From the museum, take West Charleston Boulevard and Nevada State Route 159 west to Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area. As many as six different American Indian cultures may have inhabited the area for different purposes throughout the years. While at Red Rock, learn about the region's history at the visitors center and explore trails along the 13-mile scenic loop drive. From there, follow state routes 159 and 160 west to Pahrump to visit the Pahrump Valley Museum. The museum features artifacts from the area's Southern Paiute (Nuwu) people as well as exhibits detailing Pahrump's prospecting, ranching and farming history. Overnight in Pahrump.

### Day 2: AMARGOSA VALLEY, SOUTHERN NEVADA, NORTH LAS VEGAS, 176 MILES (283 KM)

From Pahrump, travel east on Bell Vista Road and north on Spring Meadows Road to Ash Meadows National Wildlife Refuge in Amargosa Valley. The refuge is home to nearly 30 species of plants and animals that don't exist anywhere else on Earth. The Southern Paiute and Timbisha Shoshone people maintain a strong cultural connection to the area.

From Ash Meadows, follow State Route 373 and U.S. 95 to the Corn Creek Visitors Center, part of the Desert National Wildlife Refuge. The visitors center includes interpretive exhibits of the local tribes and nature trails through the refuge, the largest in the lower 48 states.

From there, take U.S. 95 south to the Las Vegas Paiute Golf Resort. The resort is owned and operated by the Las Vegas Paiute Tribe (Tudinu) and is home to three world-class 18-hole courses; Snow Mountain (Nu-Wav Kaiv), Sun Mountain (Tav-Ai-Kaiv) and Wolf (Kwetoo-Unuv).

Continue on U.S. 95 and State Route 157 to the Spring Mountains Visitor Gateway inside the Spring Mountains National Recreation Area. At the visitors center, learn about the area's history and wildlife and see the Paiute Nation Seven Sacred Stones monument, which honors the seven Southern Paiute nations of the region. From the visitors center, take state Route 157 and U.S. 95 south to North Las Vegas. Overnight in North Las Vegas.

### **Day 3:** MOAPA, OVERTON, BOULDER CITY, 146 MILES (234 KM)

From North Las Vegas, take Interstate 15 north to the Moapa Travel Center at exit 75. Owned and operated by the Moapa Band of Paiutes, the center features a large selection of native crafts. From there, follow Valley of Fire Highway south into Valley of Fire State Park. Dedicated in 1935, Valley of Fire is Nevada's oldest and largest state park and is home to magnificent red sandstone and other geological formations. This cultural area, important to the Southern Paiute (Nuwu) people, has examples of rock art dating back thousands of years.

From Valley of Fire, take Nevada State Route 169 north to Overton to visit the Lost City Museum. There, learn about the Ancestral Puebloans as well as the geological and cultural history of the area. From the museum, enjoy a scenic drive through the Lake Mead National Recreation Area along state routes 169 and 167 south to Boulder City. Overnight in Boulder City.

### **Day 4:** LAUGHLIN, HENDERSON, LAS VEGAS, 202 MILES (325 KM)

From Boulder City, take U.S. 95, Nevada State Route 163 south and Christmas Tree Pass (partially unpaved) to Grapevine Canyon within the Lake Mead National Recreation Area. Take an easy ¼-mile walk past boulders and through canyons to see petroglyphs and other evidence of the prehistoric people who lived in this area. The canyon lies at the base of Spirit Mountain, considered a sacred area to the Yuman-speaking tribes of the lower Colorado River. The mountain (known as Avikwame by the Mohave and Wikame by the Hualapai people) plays a prominent role in the religion and mythology of these people as the spiritual birthplace of these tribes.

From Grapevine Canyon, take Nevada State Route 163 and the Needles Highway south to visit the Avi Resort & Casino, owned and operated by the Fort Mojave Indian Tribe (Pipa Aha Macav). Continue on Nevada State Route 163 and U.S. 95 back to Henderson to visit the Clark County Museum. There, explore the history and culture of the ancient Pueblo and more recent Southern Paiute (Nuwu) people and the heritage of Las Vegas. From Henderson, return to Las Vegas for a few more days or fly home from McCarran International Airport.

**NEVADA SCENIC BYWAYS** — YES, THE SHORTEST DISTANCE FROM A TO B IS A STRAIGHT LINE. SURE, DIRECT ROUTES ARE FINE IF YOU HAVE PLACES TO GO, BUT THE ROADS LESS TRAVELED IN NEVADA ARE THE ONES THAT LEAD TO ADVENTURE, DISCOVERY AND RICH EXPERIENCES.

Nevada has a number of state scenic byways, from the lush Lamoille Canyon in the north to the sandstone sights of Red Rock Canyon in the south. Three of the Silver State’s byways — Eastshore Drive in north Lake Tahoe, the Las Vegas Strip at night and Pyramid Lake in northern Nevada —are national scenic byways.

Many of the scenic byways listed in the following pages are near state parks or sections of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest, areas that are fun to explore by hiking trails or a trip to a visitors center, so allow time to soak it all in. Most of Nevada’s scenic byways are near population centers, so on your next trip to Reno, Las Vegas, Elko or Ely, consider a day trip on one of Nevada’s scenic byways.

## LAMOILLE CANYON

Stunning fall colors and verdant spring waterfalls can be seen in Lamoille Canyon, about 22 miles (35 km) southeast of Elko in the Ruby Mountains. Lamoille Canyon, formed by glacial action thousands of years ago, can be explored through the 12-mile (19 km) scenic byway (Lamoille Canyon Road) beginning at the base of the mountain.

Stop along the drive up to view interpretive panels explaining the area's geology and to hike one of the tree-lined trails. Keep an eye out for mountain goats, bighorn sheep and an assortment of birds. The byway ends at an elevation of 8,800 feet at a turn-around area that has a restroom and trailhead. Lamoille Canyon and the Ruby Mountains are part of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest.



### Notes for the road:

- Plan ahead when visiting Lamoille Canyon — the upper portion of the road typically is closed in the winter months.
- Elko is the nearest major city, although the small community of Lamoille is 1 mile from the byway.
- Photo op: the Lamoille Community Presbyterian Church in Lamoille, also known as “the little church of the crossroads” is a popular subject for photographers.

## ANGEL LAKE

### Notes for the road:

- Angel Lake Road is closed in the winter months; check with the Nevada Department of Transportation for road conditions.
- Wells, the nearest city, has RV parks, hotel and motels, as well as a history as a crossroads of the American West. During America's period of westward expansion in the 19th century, Wells was the jump-off point for the California-Oregon trail.

Take in the scenery of Nevada's Ruby Mountains on Angel Lake Road (Nevada State Route 231), a paved road that starts in Wells and heads west, winding up the east side of the East Humboldt Range before ending at the Angel Lake recreation area (8,500 feet). From Wells, plan for 24 miles (39 km) up and back.

Schedule time to get out and explore Angel Lake, a natural body of water that was dammed in 1900 to create an irrigation system still in use today. Fishing is allowed (rainbow, brook and tiger trout), as well as non-motorized boating. Look to the south for a glimpse of Chimney Rock, a rock spire that serves as a local landmark. Here, you'll also find trailheads to Smith Lake and Winchell Lake as well as a picnic area, restrooms and a campground. Keep an eye out for bighorn sheep, mountain goats, mule deer and pronghorn antelope. Angel Lake and the East Humboldt Range are part of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest.

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
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## MOUNT CHARLESTON LOOP

Mount Charleston — officially Charleston Peak — reaches to 11,916 feet, and is part of the Spring Mountains National Recreation area north of Las Vegas. Hiking trails, picnic areas, a new visitors center and Lee Canyon ski resort are found in this area. The Mount Charleston loop incorporates three scenic drives — Kyle Canyon Road, Deer Creek Road and Lee Canyon Road — and is 36 miles (58 km) long.

Begin at the intersection of U.S. 93 and Kyle Canyon Road (Nevada State Route 157), about 18 miles (29 km) north of downtown Las Vegas. Travel west into the mountains, where you'll gain about 3,000 feet in elevation and experience cooler temperatures. Be sure to stop at the Spring Mountains Visitor Gateway (2525 Kyle Canyon Road), which has a visitors center, trail systems, picnic areas and more.

Continue on Kyle Canyon Road to Deer Creek Road (Nevada State Route 158). High in the Spring Mountain Range, this byway twists and turns past pinyon pines and mountain slopes. The North Loop Trailhead, one of the paths up Charleston Peak, is accessible from the west side of Deer Creek Road. Don't forget to stop at Desert View Overlook to take in the sights of the valley below.

Deer Creek Road will intersect with Lee Canyon Road (Nevada State Route 156), which you can take east back to U.S. 95. Enjoy more mountain scenery and views. The Sawmill Trailhead is on the north side of the road.



## VALLEY OF FIRE

Valley of Fire State Park, 50 miles (80 km) northeast of Las Vegas, offers several scenic drives through the area's famous red sandstone formations.

Once inside the park, you can travel Valley of Fire Road, a 10.5-mile (17 km) route from the park's west entrance to its east entrance. This Nevada Scenic Byway travels past Atlatl Rock, where you can see examples of petroglyphs (ancient rock art), including a depiction of an atlatl, a primitive weapon. Continue on to the visitors center, which offers exhibits on the geology and natural history of the park. Further exploration east on Valley of Fire Road reveals the Seven Sisters, a grouping of red rock formations visible from the road, as well as the trailhead that leads to Elephant Rock, a natural formation named for its resemblance to an elephant.

Also check out another Nevada Scenic Byway, White Domes Road, which starts near the visitor center and heads north about seven miles to White Domes, a collection of sandstone formations with contrasting colors. Stops along this route are Mouse's Tank, which includes a trailhead and petroglyph viewing area, and Rainbow Vista sightseeing area.

Entry into Valley of Fire State Park is \$10 per vehicle.

Extend your trip: Depart Valley of Fire via the east entrance and travel north on Nevada State route 169 to Overton to see the Lost City Museum. This state museum preserves American Indian artifacts threatened with submersion by Lake Mead, which formed after the creation of Hoover Dam in 1936.

## RED ROCK ROAD

Red Rock National Conservation Area, 17 miles (27 km) west of the Las Vegas Strip, is easy to access through the 13-mile (21 km) Red Rock Road. This scenic drive begins at the Red Rock National Conservation Area Visitor Center and ends on Nevada State Route 159, just south of the visitors center.

Red Rock Road affords views of red sandstone cliffs and limestone bluffs formed millions of years ago. Multiple parking areas along the road provide access to trailheads and picnic areas. Visitors also enjoy off-trail exploring on the sandstone, especially at the Calico I and Calico II areas, which are popular with rock climbers.

Before embarking on the scenic drive, visitors may want to check out the visitors center, which has indoor/outdoor exhibits explaining the area's geology, wildlife and recreational opportunities. Entry into Red Rock NCA, which is operated by the Bureau of Land Management, is \$7 per car.

Extend your trip: Spring Mountain Ranch State Park, a 520-acre oasis kept green by spring water, is about five miles south of Red Rock NCA Visitor Center on Nevada State Route 159. Walking trails pass by pinion-juniper, black brush and other desert plants. The park's centerpiece is the ranch house, once owned by Howard Hughes. Entry into the state park is \$9 per car.

## LAS VEGAS STRIP

The Las Vegas Strip draws millions every year with its casinos, entertainment, shopping and dining, and thanks to the profusion of LED light displays and neon signs, it's considered a nighttime scenic byway by the Federal Highway Administration.

The 4.5-mile (7.2 km) Las Vegas Strip begins at the intersection of Las Vegas Boulevard and Russell Road and continues north on Las Vegas Boulevard until it intersects with Sahara Avenue.

Start your trip on the Strip a little south of Russell Road, so you can view the iconic "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas" sign. There's a parking lot at the sign (accessible from southbound Las Vegas Boulevard) so be sure to stop for a photo op.

The Strip's ever-changing skyline currently includes New York-New York, which has a roller coaster snaking through the resort's recreation of the Big Apple; Paris Las Vegas, which sports a 541-foot-tall Eiffel Tower; and the Bellagio, fronted by a lake with water fountains timed to operate in coordination with music and lights. One of the newer attractions is the High Roller, a 550-foot-tall observation wheel directly across from Caesars Palace, with its Greek columns and classic statues. Thrill-seekers may want to make a stop at the Stratosphere, a 1,149-foot tower with thrill rides at the top.

The views you take in today are markedly different from what visitors saw in the early 20th century. The first casinos built in the 1940s were smaller than the monoliths that line the famous byway today, but Las Vegas preserves its rich history in several compelling, interactive museums just off the Strip. Those include the Nevada State Museum, inside Springs Preserve cultural institution on Valley View Boulevard; the National Atomic Testing Museum on Flamingo Road; the Mob Museum on Stewart Avenue; and the Neon Museum on North Las Vegas Boulevard.

Extend your trip: The intersection of Las Vegas Boulevard and Sahara Avenue is the north end of the official national scenic



byway, but you can continue north on the Strip for another 2.9 miles — this is the state’s North Las Vegas Strip Scenic Byway. Check out the Neon Museum, which chronicles the history of Las Vegas through its neon signs; the Fremont Street Experience, a five-block entertainment district in downtown Las Vegas; and Old Las Vegas Mormon Fort State Park.





Some of Nevada's best stories can't be conveniently mapped in a single road trip; some adventures take a few tries to complete. You may just have to create a checklist of hot springs to hit over the next several years, or spend a summer staking out your favorite ghost towns, but we'll help you do that.

Over the next dozen or so pages, you'll find roundups of railroads and the best 18-holes in the state, a quick look at shopping, a crash course in wedding planning, and even a peek at the best of Burning Man.

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


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## GET HITCHED IN NEVADA!



Lovers travel from all over the globe to Nevada to take advantage of the myriad fun and unique wedding experiences offered throughout the state. With beachside weddings at Lake Las Vegas or along the crystalline shores of Lake Tahoe, the state offers a wide variety of natural settings for scenic outdoor ceremonies. Get married among desert dunes, with ancient petroglyphs as a wedding backdrop, in a meadow filled with desert wildflowers, or underneath a prehistoric red sandstone arch.

But there is no place like Las Vegas, the marriage capital of the world, to get married. Here, enjoy the vintage, classic charm of dozens of wedding chapels that line the Las Vegas Strip. Chapels range from those with Elvis impersonators and drive-through windows to elegant venues in which the bride walks down the aisle bathed in the glow of Venetian glass windows.

Couples traveling to Las Vegas have many options, styles and price ranges from which to choose. Throw in a photographer, custom floral bouquets, live video streaming and custom cocktails to make the day truly special. Private and chapel wedding planners help couples select or customize a package of services that is just right. Venues include everything from the civil marriage commission to small garden weddings to private venues around the valley to the luxury resort wedding chapels that can get as lavish as the couple wants.

## The Legalities

The nuts and bolts of getting married are simple and open to traditional or same-sex couples. There is no waiting period or blood test requirement, but a license is mandatory. Couples must go to a county clerk's office in the county of choice to obtain a marriage license. Both parties must be present with proper identification. With the license in hand, head to the wedding venue of your choice and exchange vows. The officiant will sign and file the marriage certificate and 10 days later, couples may request the official document showing their marriage (\$15). A Nevada marriage license may be used anywhere in the state. However, after the ceremony, the marriage certificate will need to be filed in the county where the application was issued. The Marriage License Application Fee varies throughout the state, between \$60-\$77.

- Picture identification and proof of age is required.
- Both parties must be over 18 years of age or have parental approval.
- Each must know their mother's and father's full name and state of birth.


Clark and Washoe county offices offer a pre-application on their websites to expedite the process. The Clark County Marriage Bureau is three blocks south of the Fremont Street Experience and is open from 8 a.m. to midnight daily, including holidays. Couples using the online pre-application (go to [mlc.vegas](http://mlc.vegas) to complete) in Clark County and zip in and out using the express window at the main Marriage Bureau in Las Vegas and at the auxiliary locations in Henderson and Laughlin.

A marriage license is not proof of marriage and is valid for only one year. After a couple gets their marriage license, they must make public vows in the presence of a marriage officiant and a witness. Chapels, private wedding venues and wedding planners will be able to provide a licensed wedding officiant to preside over the ceremony.

Friends or family members of the couple who want to perform the ceremony must apply for a one-time Certificate of Authority to Solemnize a Single Marriage Ceremony from the office of the county clerk. These applications must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the wedding date in order to be processed in time for the ceremony.

Some couples from other countries may be required to provide their country of origin with a copy of the marriage license and

an apostille (authentication of signatures) to register a marriage in a foreign country. International tourists will need to contact the Nevada Secretary of State to order an apostille.



The whistle blows and steam unfurls from the engine. The conductor bellows the long-awaited words: “All aboard!” And you’re transported to another era of travel, one of curious settlers seeing new lands beyond the gritty soot of their railroad car, one of legendary holdups and robberies. Trains are as much a part of the Wild West as Billy the Kid. The lore crosses all boundaries: language, geography, and age.

Nevada’s history is told through its miles of rail ties, and through its collection of historic engines and boxcars on display at the Nevada State Railroad Museums in Ely, Boulder City, and Carson City.

The Nevada Northern Railway in Ely offers visitors rides along the same routes that were built in 1905 to haul ore from nearby mines. Walk through the East Ely Depot Museum, restored to its original 1907 appearance, and see original waiting rooms, baggage storage, and offices used by one of the nation’s most important railroads.

Ride the rails behind the 1905 Baldwin Steam Locomotive No. 25 at the museum in Carson City. See the futuristic boat-inspired McKean Car, a national historic landmark and perfectly restored example of a rare self-propelled vehicle that used internal combustion, or the newly restored Glenbrook steam engine, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Relive the early days of Hoover Dam in Boulder City on the Union Pacific Railroad Boulder Branch Line, commissioned in 1931.

Climb aboard this excursion train outside Las Vegas for a trip along the tracks of southern Nevada's colorful past in refurbished and air-conditioned Pullman coaches dating to 1911. Check out the Union Pacific Railroad No. 2314, an official Railway Post Office car that once carried postal employees and mail across the country.

Special events provide ideal opportunities for the entire family to enjoy the historic trains. These trains feature ghosts, outlaws, Santa, and the magical Polar Express.

In every shape and form, Nevada's railroad treasures animate the Wild West for 21st century riders. Welcome aboard!

### Kyle Hot Springs – NEAR INTERSTATE 80 NORTH OF LOVELOCK

Amazing hot springs with a side of mysterious Nevada history? Count us in. Located in the expansive and beautiful Buena Vista Valley, Kyle Hot Springs is nearest the ghost town of Unionville and the larger cities of Lovelock and Winnemucca. Today, Kyle Hot Springs is a hill-top sulfur spring that is a small, but enjoyable spring. Although the specific timeframe is unknown, Kyle Hot Springs was once a mineral bath resort that boasted lodging, hot baths and even steam treatments.

When visiting Kyle Hot Springs, take notice of the remnants of adobe buildings on the way up to the cattle trough. There are some serious photography opportunities to take advantage of in this remnant of Nevada's yesteryear. The springs are about 90 degrees, so they are definitely optimal for summer months. Winter months are still nice, but it may become a little chilly. Also, a strong sulfur odor is present at these springs. Be sure to leave all silver jewelry in the car; if you take a dip in the springs with any silver jewelry on it will not be so shiny afterward.

## Spencer Hot Springs – SOUTH OF HIGHWAY 50 NEAR AUSTIN

A hot-tub-sized dipping pool has been created at the upper spring and is lined with flat stones, offering a very primitive version of a hot tub. The lower spring offers a smaller metal dipping pool where you can regulate the temperature of the water flowing through a small pipe. The water flowing out of the tub continues on its path downhill, creating several smaller pools, giving unique life to the desert. A couple dozen goldfish live in the springs' runoff, calling the warm water home year round.

Several metal fire pits exist near the springs to create primitive camping areas. There is plenty of room to park trailers or set up tents; however, if you do decide to camp, be sure to set up a good distance away from the soaking pools to avoid infringing on others' ability to enjoy the springs.

## Soldier Meadow Hot Springs – NORTH OF GERLACH NEAR BLACK ROCK DESERT


North of the Black Rock Desert and Gerlach lies a remote soaking area, Soldier Meadows Hot Springs. These springs form a hot creek in which man-made dams cause hot-tub-sized dipping pools to form. According to Bureau of Land Management (BLM), the area includes seven semi-primitive camping facilities (parking areas and fire pits), a vault toilet, and trails that lead to the springs. The area also includes a primitive cabin that is available for public use on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Because of approximately 60 miles of dirt road between the Black Rock Desert and the springs, a four-wheel drive vehicle is recommended. BLM suggests people making the trip carry two spare tires. The area is very remote and can be difficult to find, but that's what adventure is all about.

## Rhyolite

One of the most photographed ghost towns in the west, Rhyolite stands guard at Death Valley's eastern entrance, ushering visitors through the passage of time and space and terrain. The mission-style railroad depot gives the town an almost modern look when compared to the stone ruins of a bank, store, and schoolhouse. The famed Bottle House, constructed of nearly 50,000 beer bottles, has been restored and hints at an eccentricity sown through the "Wild West."

## Berlin

Berlin is a ghost town tied by the terrain to its closest neighbor, an ichthyosaur fossil site, and now known as Berlin-Ichthyosaur State Park. The town, adjacent mine, and dinosaur remains are a reminder of Nevada's vast history. Located near the geographic center of Nevada, the fossils tell a tale of life under the sea, of reptilian beasts that swam over what was then the ocean's floor and is now mountainsides.

## Belmont

Historical graffiti in this mountain ghost town marks the decades that have passed and gives a glimpse into the visitors - both welcome and unwelcome - that have entered its domain. An eerie autograph is etched into a doorframe at the courthouse, believed to have been left by Charles Manson in 1969 while he and his "family" hid in the deteriorating court house. Today, the courthouse stands sentinel over the nearly deserted town of Belmont, its ruins crumbling down the hillsides and hidden in the high desert.

## Blair

The Desert Lobster Café in Mina and the ruins of abandoned Coaldale are a few of the signs of civilization before you turn from U.S. 95 on State Route 265, headed for Blair. Essentially abandoned by 1920, today Blair is composed of several stone and cement structures. Rusty combinations of artifacts and old trash speckle the surrounding area, while fragments of fine china can be found in the cracked mud floors. An old wood-burning fireplace and chimney act as the optical centerpiece amongst the walls, which, remarkably, still hold strong after nearly a century of withstanding the elements.

## Hard Luck Castle

Ten miles south of Gold Point on a dirt road is the Hard Luck Castle, a work of art. As you approach the castle, a cylindrical central granite column is visible, decorated with forest-green roofing and an American flag blowing in the breeze. The structure is impossible to miss against the sagebrush backdrop of the desert. The Hard Luck Mine operated from 1897 to around World War II. Because of looting, the mine could not reopen after the war.

It was purchased by a family who decided to turn it into a legacy, beginning construction in 2000. They have nearly completed the four-story, 8,000-square-foot castle, complete with a theater, game room, two kitchens, four bedrooms, and two grandiose pipe organs that fill the walls of the castle.

Tours of the castle are available daily from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Visitors also have the opportunity to sleep in an original miner's cabin. Visitors are encouraged to call ahead for availability and road conditions.

## Como

Gold brought miners to the small town of Como near Carson City in 1860s. Now there's only rubble representing what was a thriving townsite with a bar, hotel, newspaper and post office. Visitors can access the site via a 4WD road out of Dayton, and the payoff is solitude among the stone mill and hotel ruins, which are frequented by wild horses and other wildlife.

Nevada is dotted with ghost towns, each settlement telling the story of the miners, railroad workers, explorers and settlers who answered the call to "go west, young man." You may see the signs of their struggles and triumphs as you, too, go west.

## FROM TEE TO SHINING TEE

NEVADA IS HOME TO MORE THAN 100 GOLF COURSES, NEARLY 60 IN AND AROUND LAS VEGAS, SO THERE ARE PLENTY OF CHANCES TO SWING THE CLUBS. IN THE SILVER STATE, YOU'LL FIND MILES OF FAIRWAYS, SOME ON DESERT COURSES, OTHERS IN MOUNTAINOUS TERRAIN, BUT ALWAYS WITH UNIQUE NEVADA TWISTS.



### Northern slice

Edgewood Tahoe, set on the shore of Lake Tahoe in Stateline, offers stunning views and great golf on a George Fazio-designed course. Challenging yet fair, this course offers four sets of tees, ranging in length from 5,567 yards to 7,555 yards. Edgewood hosts the annual American Century Celebrity Golf Championship in July, and will open a 154-room resort-hotel in 2017.

Other courses near Lake Tahoe are the Championship Course and the Mountain Course in Incline Village on the northern end of the lake. Both designed by Robert Trent Jones Sr., the par-72 Championship Course offers beautiful views. The par-58 Mountain Course is an executive course that's fun and affordable.

LakeRidge Golf Course in Reno, a local favorite, offers a casual weekend diversion on a par-71 course. Its signature hole is No. 15, a par-3 set on a ridge overlooking a lake.

In the Carson City/Carson Valley area just south of Reno, you'll find the Divine 9. These nine courses are within a 40-minute drive of each other, making the area a perfect golf destination. Among this group of courses is the Dayton Valley Golf Club, home to a PGA Tour qualifier since 1995. This Arnold Palmer-designed course offers challenging holes and views of the eastern Sierra. Another Divine 9 offering is the Lakes Course at the Genoa Lakes Golf Club & Resort. Lush wetlands and the winding Carson River bring water into 14 holes of play.

Another area favorite is the Lakes Course at Red Hawk Golf and Resort in Sparks, Reno's neighboring city. This 7,140-yard course sits on natural wetlands and throws in more than 100 bunkers to create a challenge.

## Southern swing

Las Vegas doesn't do anything small, and its golf courses are no exception. From the top-rated Shadow Creek in North Las Vegas to the exclusive Wynn Golf Club on the Strip, the golf experience can be over-the-top. Among the offerings:

Las Vegas Paiute Golf Resort, owned by the Las Vegas Paiute Tribe, offers three courses; its Snow Mountain Course is a favorite with challenges at holes 16, 17 and 18.

Bali Hai, a par-71 course with such features as a par-3 island green at No. 16 and the 468-yard, par-4 No. 3.

Rio Secco Golf Club in Henderson, a neighboring city to Las Vegas, offers a Rees Jones-designed course in the foothills of the Black Mountain Range, as well as the Butch Harmon School of Golf.

Venture beyond Sin City to the mecca of desert golf in Mesquite, about 80 miles north-east of Las Vegas. There are nine courses in this quiet oasis, and the mild desert climate makes it a year-round recreation destination. Among those is the Wolf Creek Golf Club, where the fairways wind through red rock canyons and white sand bunkers; and Conestoga Golf Club, which boasts a scenic 18-hole course designed by Gary Panks.

Bargain-hunters will find nearly every brand they can hope for at one of four outlet malls in Nevada: the Fashion Outlets of Las Vegas, two Premium Outlet centers in Las Vegas, and the Outlets at Sparks.

The Fashion Outlets of Las Vegas are located in Primm, a 40-mile drive from the Las Vegas Strip. Many Las Vegas hotels offer shuttles to the outlets, and the rock-bottom deals at the stores make your trip more than worth it. The outlet center is adjacent to Primm Valley Resort and Casino, one of three resorts in Primm. The three resorts together boast 2,600 hotel rooms, one of the world's tallest and fastest roller coasters, a concert arena, 11 restaurants, and two golf courses.

Premium Outlets has two locations in Las Vegas in the north and south ends of town for convenient access no matter where you're staying. The south location near downtown offers more than 145 stores including Michael Kors, Coach, Calvin Klein and Zales. The north location is bursting at the seams with 175 stories ranging from Kate Spade and Dolce & Gabbana to Tory Burch and True Religion.

If you're staying in the Reno area, you'll want to drop by the Outlets at Sparks, an outdoor outlet center near the Sparks Marina with everything from Express to Old Navy and Adidas. The center is anchored by Scheels All Sports - a mammoth sporting-goods store with a full-size Ferris wheel in the center, two 16,000-gallon aquariums, and hunting and sporting simulators.

On Reno's southern end is The Summit, outdoor lifestyle center with fashions for the whole family, restaurants, a movie theater, and weekly farmers' markets and holiday events.

The best souvenirs you can take home are the memories you make while exploring Nevada's rugged outdoors and pulsing urban life, but when you want serious shopping, Nevada offers global brands and great bargains.

The Depot is a recent addition to the Reno culinary scene. Housed in a 1910 railroad depot, this restaurant, distillery and brewery brings Nevada-grown products to your plate and glass.

Süp keeps it simple with soups, salads, and sandwiches made from scratch daily. They use the freshest ingredients possible sourced from local farms and ranches. Vegetarian and vegan options abound so no one is left out of the satisfaction of a hearty bowl of homemade soup.

Midtown Eats serves up rustic and comfort food for lunch, dinner, and Sunday brunch. Hearty dishes like the bison burger or the falafel flatbread sandwich don't disappoint the hungry patron, while unique starters like fried avocado slices and deviled eggs with kalamata olive tapenade are sure to whet your appetite. Wash it all down with a choice of creative cocktails (lavender gin, honey syrup and lemon? Yes, please!).

## Las Vegas

Minimalist in style with maximum flavor, Mochiko Chicken is an Asian fusion café a short 15-minute drive from the Las Vegas Strip. Dive into the spice with the Sriracha chargrilled chicken bowl, or keep it light with the coconut curry chicken bowl.

There are several burger joints in Las Vegas that can claim to be the best, and we won't even try to decide between them. Instead, here are several that will not disappoint, whether you're looking for a simple old-fashioned burger or a gourmet patty. Bachi Burger, with three locations in the Las Vegas area, puts an Asian twist on the classic burger, while BLT Burger inside The Mirage allows you to choose your own selection of gourmet toppings and sides. The king of culinary mean, Gordon Ramsay, opened his own gourmet burger restaurant inside Planet Hollywood. Burgr makes a statement with a fire-lined wall and omnipresent line at the entrance, but everyone in line knows the wait is worth it. Ramsay never fails, and his Burgr restaurant is no exception.

Whist Stove and Spirits at The District at Green Valley Ranch is an affordable neighborhood restaurant whose price point belies the exquisite caliber of its food. Open 24 hours, diners can try the signature Spanish octopus served with chimichurri, jicama and cilantro, or try the seafood hot pot with crab, shrimp and mussels. Craft cocktails shaken (and stirred) by in-house mixologists seal the deal as a true foodie find.



## Basque

Traditional Basque restaurants dot the Nevada culinary landscape and are concentrated more heavily in the northern end of the state. A Basque meal is usually served family style, so make friends with your neighbors or they won't pass the salad or beans your way. The fare may vary, depending on whether the restaurant leans more Spanish-Basque or French-Basque, but you can be sure there will be at least five courses leading up to your main dish.

JT Basque Bar and Dining Room in Gardnerville is about as down-home authentic as it gets. The large bar welcomes patrons into the family before they're ushered into a dining room that could be in any family farmhouse.

The Star Hotel in Elko is one of the most iconic Basque restaurants in Nevada, as demonstrated by the always-packed dining room and line of cowboys and ranchers on bar stools tossing back picon punches. Be sure to order your steak or lamb "Basque style," which comes with a heaping helping of roasted garlic.

Louis' Basque Corner and the Santa Fe Hotel in downtown Reno keep Reno on the Basque map with their authentic cuisine including sweetbreads and roast lamb. Louis' was featured on the Food Network's "Diners, Drive-ins and Dives."


Not a skier? Not to worry. Heavenly has one of the biggest and baddest tubing hills in the country, named the best tubing hill in America by Fox News.

An award-winning ski school, the Burton Learn to Ride Center, and a generous mix of green, blue, and black runs make this a great family destination for all levels of skiers and boarders.

The nearest hotel resort is the Hyatt Lake Tahoe, which has its own ski retail and rental shop. Oh, it also has a casino, a luxurious spa, and outdoor fire pits. Yes, you can take your hot toddy poolside (heated, with indoor swim-out access!) or lakeside and cozy up around a roaring fire pit and relive your best lines of the day.

Always trust the locals! Mt. Rose-Ski Tahoe is the locals' favorite with 1,200 acres of terrain only 25 minutes from Reno. 


### Don't fence me in

Need a faster pace? Zephyr Cove Resort on the southeast corner of Lake Tahoe runs snowmobile tours into the mountains 9,000 feet in elevation. Tours depart from Zephyr Cove, which offers snowsuit rentals, and include free hotel shuttle transportation.

## Northern Nevada

### NEVADA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

For the serious history buffs, this museum adjacent to the University of Nevada, Reno, is a gold mine of historical manuscripts, artifacts, and collections. Make this your first stop if you want to really set the foundation for understanding Nevada's past and future.

### NEVADA STATE MUSEUM

An underground mine exhibit, a life-size ghost town, the silver service from the USS Nevada, and a working coin press from the Carson City Mint. Yeah, you could spend some time here. The State Museum is in downtown Carson City, an easy walk from the Capitol, the Governor's Mansion, and the Kit Carson Trail walking tour. The coin press fires up once a month and on special occasions, providing a glimpse into early American coin making and the Comstock Mining boom.

### NEVADA STATE RAILROAD MUSEUM

Only a mile south of downtown Carson City is the Nevada State Railroad Museum, a fascinating collection of locomotives, passenger and freight cars, and artifacts from Nevada's railroad past. A working railway encircles the site and provides train rides on select weekends throughout the year. Don't miss the historic McKeen Motor Car or the newly restored Glenbrook steam engine.

## Southern Nevada

### NEVADA STATE MUSEUM

Nowhere is the range of Nevada’s history more prominent than at the Nevada State Museum in Las Vegas. Here you can walk by a sound wall of native animals, muscle a handcar along a virtual track, and round a corner into a room of showgirl costumes and Rat Pack relics. See items from Howard Hughes’ residency at the Desert Inn, or listen to the detonation of nuclear bombs that were tested in the Nevada desert.

### NEVADA STATE RAILROAD MUSEUM

All aboard! The highlight of this railroad museum in Boulder City is the 45-minute ride aboard the Nevada Southern Railway. Restored Pullman cars trek over the tracks that were laid to transport supplies to nearby Hoover Dam. It’s truly a trek through time.

### LOST CITY MUSEUM

The Lost City Museum was built in 1935 by the National Park Service to exhibit artifacts excavated from Pueblo Grande de Nevada, which was soon to be flooded by Lake Mead and the newly constructed Hoover Dam. While the museum tells the story of our American Indian ancestors, its very existence is a testament to the forced migration of people, water and land as immigrants moved farther West.

## Eastern Nevada

### EAST ELY DEPOT MUSEUM

The state’s industrial development through mining and transportation are on full display here in the Depot Building and Freight Barn adjacent to the Nevada Northern Railway. After perusing the mining and railroad exhibits in the museum, buy a train ticket and ride the always fun Ghost Train.

## Opals

The Virgin Valley deep in the northwestern corner of Nevada is not easy to get to, but the payoff is big. Sage-covered valleys, jagged rock cliffs, and natural hot springs await the rugged adventurer. Commercial opal mines welcome visitors to mine their tailings - for a fee - and dig out luminous opals and the rare black opal, found in only two locations in the world (the other is in Australia).

Amateur rockhounds, intrepid travelers, and memory-making families can be found in the mine quarries poring over rock piles in search of the precious gemstones.

The mines that allow digging are Royal Peacock, Bonanza, and Rainbow Ridge. The digging season typically starts in May, and if you go, be prepared for primitive camping and limited services. This trip has all the makings of a true adventure: gravel roads, spotty cell service, and few people.



## Turquoise

Nevada is the second largest producer of turquoise in the U.S., and you can find it for yourself at the Royston Turquoise Mine near Tonopah. Digging sign-ups are at Otteson's Royston Turquoise Mine, conveniently located in the Mizpah Hotel. Group tours are driven out to the mine, and then miners are turned loose with the instruction: "You'll know it when you see it!"

When you return to the Mizpah with your loot in hand, you can pay to have the resident jeweler to turn the brilliant blue stones into one-of-a-kind jewelry. This is the definition of unique... you can bet that no one else in the world will have the same ring!

## Garnets


Just a few miles west of Ely is a small recreation area called Garnet Hill, and it's free to the public, just bring your own hammer. Rock-hounds can look for the deep-red gemstone peeking through weather-worn rocks, or break open rocks to look for the gems inside.

Because Garnet Hill is so close to Ely, it's a fun addition to Ely's other attractions such as riding the Nevada Northern Railway, visiting the East Ely Depot Museum, viewing the cultural homes in Renaissance Village, or taking a day trip to Great Basin National Park. And after chasing your fortune (in fun) at Garnet Hill, you can feel like a real miner when you order a beer at the Historic Hotel Nevada that night with a heavy lump of pay dirt in your pocket.

Every year, as summer turns to fall, tens of thousands of people descend on the desert playa to form Black Rock City, to create and enjoy large-scale art installations and to participate in a grand experiment in creating community.



A WORLD OF ORIGINALS

The Black Rock Desert can also be visited at other times of the year. The Black Rock Desert-High Rock Canyon Emigrant Trails National Conservation Area draws visitors to its playa — an enormous, flat, dry lakebed that once was the bottom of ancient Lake Lahontan. The area, managed by the Bureau of Land Management, also has mountain ranges, volcanic tablelands and the longest intact segments of the emigrant trails to California and Oregon.

The Black Rock-High Rock NCA is very rugged, and high-clearance vehicles with off-road tires are recommended. Visit the Friends of Black Rock High Rock website, [www.BlackRock.org](http://www.BlackRock.org), for more information. The BLM also operates a visitor center from April to October just west of Gerlach, at the entrance to Black Rock-High Rock NCA.

## ODE TO THE ARTS

ART LIVES IN NEVADA, FROM LARGER-THAN-LIFE OUTDOOR INSTALLATIONS TO HIGHLY COVETED EXHIBITS IN MUSEUMS AND GALLERIES.



Check out the Nevada Museum of Art in downtown Reno, Nevada's stage for a variety of traveling exhibits including Maurice Sendak, Frida Kahlo, Toulouse-Lautrec, Andy Warhol, and Picasso. Permanent collections follow thematic lines – Altered Landscape Photography, Art of the Greater West, Contemporary Art, and the Work Ethic – offering a wide range of art and media to even the most casual museum-goer.

Some of the most robust art collections in southern Nevada are found – where else – in casino resorts. The Fine Art Gallery at Bellagio brings world-renowned names like Faberge, Warhol, O'Keefe, and Monet to the glitzy Las Vegas Strip. Picasso can be found at the restaurant of the same name in the Bellagio, and Leonardo da Vinci's life and work is on display at the Venetian.

Nevada and neon just naturally go together, which is why the Neon Museum in Downtown Las Vegas has become one of the most visited art collections in Nevada. Neon signs from Nevada's yesteryear are on display in an outdoor gallery that takes visitors through the history of gaming in the Silver State.

Near the eastern entrance to Death Valley sits the ghost town of Rhyolite, a collection of wood and stone ruins... and a brilliant outdoor

art gallery. The Goldwell Open Air Museum was created by a group of prominent Belgian artists and is anchored by the haunting “Last Supper” sculpture.

Only 72 miles to the north of Rhyolite is the town of Goldfield, where a few holdout residents keep it from becoming a bonafide ghost town. One local artist is putting Goldfield back on the map with his installation of painted cars planted in the desert. This exhibit is known as the International Car Forest of the Last Church, and is a photographer’s dream.



**3 PONY EXPRESS TERRITORY:** The famed Pony Express Route cuts through the middle of Nevada, roughly parallel to U.S. Highway 50. You'll find Great Basin National Park on the eastern edge of this territory, and Dayton, the first gold discovery site in Nevada, on the western edge. [ponyexpressnevada.com](http://ponyexpressnevada.com)

**4 NEVADA SILVER TRAILS:** Ghost towns and played-out silver mines dot the landscape in Nevada Silver Trails. This territory is the largest in Nevada, spanning the state east/west and encompassing Area 51 and the Extraterrestrial Highway. [nevadasilvertrails.com](http://nevadasilvertrails.com)

**5 LAS VEGAS TERRITORY:** The eponymous area anchored by Las Vegas also includes the golf mecca of Mesquite and the river city of Laughlin. [lvtterritory.com](http://lvtterritory.com)

**6 INDIAN TERRITORY:** This is the only cultural rather than geographic territory, and it encompasses the entire state. Nevada is covered with significant tribal lands and cultural sites, and it's these gems that make up the Indian Territory. [nevadaindianterritory.com](http://nevadaindianterritory.com)

**atlatl rock**

An atlatl is a throwing stick or a dart thrower used by ancient tribes to give more force to their darts or spears. It was usually a wooden stick about two feet long with a handhold on one end and a hook on the other end. A slot cut in the tail end of the dart was set against the hook allowing the dart to lie along the atlatl so that both could be grasped midway of the dart by the user.

These petroglyphs were made by ancient tribes. Respect their antiquity. Help preserve them.

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
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
