BIENNIAL REPORT.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF STATE ORPHANS' HOME,
CARSON CITY, NEVADA, January 18, 1903.

To the Honorable the Legislature of the State of Nevada:

GENTLEMEN: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 1485, Compiled Laws of Nevada, the undersigned, Directors of the State Orphans' Home, herewith submit their report and that of the Superintendent of the Home, for the years 1901 and 1902.

The Home is now, and has been since the last report, under the management of Mr. J. Josephs and wife, who are, respectively, Superintendent and Matron.

The children are comfortably clothed and abundantly supplied with good and wholesome food. They are kindly treated, and two teachers are employed in their education, which consists of the branches usually taught in the public schools of the State.

On the morning of July 4, 1902, the main building of the Home—a wooden structure, a regular fire trap—was discovered to be on fire in the upper part of the building. The fire is supposed to have originated in a defective flue. This fire was unfortunate, and still it was a fortunate thing. Had the fire occurred in the night, or in severe cold weather, in all probability there would have been considerable loss of life. As it was, not a person was injured.

There was scarcely any provision for fighting fires. There was very little water, if any, to be had. The building was so very inflammable, and so arranged that when a fire was once under headway it was about impossible to have stopped it, even if well supplied with plenty of water and apparatus.

It was several days before the adjuster for the insurance company arrived to adjust the loss sustained, and it was July 24th before the Board decided to advertise for plans for a new building.

On August 14th three plans were submitted by as many architects, and described by them. Each, when asked the question, gave it as his opinion that the building could be erected for about twenty thousand dollars.

The members of the Board carefully studied the plans; they were in doubt about the cost of a building constructed according to any of the plans not costing more than they felt authorized to spend.

They finally secured the services of a practical builder to examine the plans and report upon the probable cost of a building constructed according to any one of the plans proposed. He reported, and declared that a building constructed according to either plan could not be built for nearly twice the amount the Board felt justified in spending.

After much study and thought the Board decided to reject all of the plans presented, reduce the size of the proposed building somewhat, and again advertise, which was done on September 22, 1902.

On October 6th—the time the plans were to be examined—only one plan was submitted for examination.

The several members of the Board made suggestions where they thought improvements could be made, and the architect submitting the plans was given ten days in which to perfect them, draw up the specifications, and make the necessary blue prints.

These were prepared and submitted, and the Secretary instructed to advertise for bids for the construction of a building according to these plans and specifications.

At the time set for opening the bids not one had been presented.

The Board discussed other plans, but the season was getting so late that it was not deemed advisable to do anything further before the meeting of the Legislature.

Upon examining thoroughly into the matter it is found that a building large enough to accommodate one hundred children will cost far more than the Board felt justified in spending, and we are of the opinion that not less than thirty-five thousand (\$35,000) dollars should be appropriated for the erection of a new building at the Home.

There was received from the insurance company the sum of \$10,080. Out of this there has been expended the sum of \$2,185 81 in preparing the remaining buildings for the comfort and care of the inmates, also in wages for removing the ruins of the burned building, for getting out stone for a new building and hauling the same, a large quantity of which is now on the grounds.

There is now left in this Insurance Fund \$7,894 19, which would provide funds for the furnishing of a new building, and perhaps something left over.

The Board in their judgment think that at least \$30,000 will be necessary for the maintenance of the Home for the years 1903 and 1904. The prices of groceries, provisions, clothing, meats and fuel have greatly advanced since the last meeting of the Legislature, and it will require considerable more for the support of the institution than it has during the past two years.

In addition to the above amount there will be needed an appropriation for the payment of the teachers' salaries.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT.

To the Honorable Board of Directors of the State Orphans' Home:

I herewith submit to you the biennial report of the Home, its management and expenses for the years 1901-1902:

THE HOME AND ITS HISTORY.

A number of States in the Union claim a priority in the establishment of an orphans' home entirely maintained by a State, and in order to establish our right to that claim I refer to the Act for the erection of a State Orphans' Home and providing funds for the same, approved March 3, 1869, as well as the date of the completion of the building and the date of the admission of the first children.

We hope that all institutions of this character throughout the United States, as well as those who gather information appertaining to the same, will place us hereafter where we rightfully belong—as the first State in the Union to maintain a home for the orphans from the public funds.

In accordance with the provisions of the Act, the building was completed and accepted, and on the 27th day of September, 1870, the Directors of the Nevada Orphan Asylum, situated at Virginia City, Nevada, were notified that all orphans in their charge would be received at the State Orphans' Home, Carson City, Nevada, October 1, 1870.

On the 28th day of October, A. D. 1870, the first children were admitted to this Home.

The total number of children admitted since the opening of the Home has been 636.

During the thirty-two years of its existence but four deaths are recorded, which healthy condition of the Home speaks for itself, and every boy or girl ever discharged, so far as we have been able to learn, has become the best of citizens and a credit to the State wherever known.

THE FIRE.

On July 4, 1902, at 8 o'clock a. m., fire was discovered in the attic of the main building. The alarm was turned in, but the building was soon burned to the ground.

The Home has never been provided with proper facilities for extinguishing fires except one connection of an inch and a half to a three-inch main. The hose was immediately attached and the water turned on, but there was not sufficient water to throw a stream to the height of the windows of the first story of the building.

Through the untiring efforts of the Fire Department, after being compelled to stretch 1,400 feet of hose to bring a stream of water from the city main to the fire, the building standing thirty feet on the west of the main building was saved.

REPORT OF ORPHANS' HOME.

Seventy-nine children were at that time inmates of the Home. Discipline here was manifest, for the greatest order prevailed and no one was hurt.

REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS

Under your direction the money appropriated by the last Legislature for necessary repairs has been very carefully and judiciously expended.

The barn has been raised two feet and now rests on a solid foundation. New sills and a new floor have been put in, and the entire structure remodeled. A new shed and stable have also been built.

A new floor has been put in the boys' playroom and the entire building painted.

A great number of necessary repairs were made to the main building, which was destroyed.

We again call your attention to the entire fencing of the property, which is in a most dilapidated condition and needs rebuilding.

SANITARY.

The sanitary condition of the Home, owing to the scarcity of the water supply, needs serious attention. The supply is inadequate. During the warm season when it is most needed it is entirely shut off at night.

HEALTH.

The health of the children has been remarkably good, for we have had no serious sickness. The children, as a rule, are vigorous and in robust health.

CASUALTIES.

One boy had the misfortune to be shot through the body with a 32 caliber rifle, which was smuggled into the Home by a boy who had been away on a vacation. The injured boy received the best medical treatment and care, and is now as well as ever.

ECONOMY.

We are compelled to practice great economy, as the amount appropriated to carry on this household will not permit of any waste.

DISCIPLINE.

The discipline of our children will more than compare with any other institution of this character. Their deportment and manners, at home or outside, are excellent.

The tables annexed will show what has been done with the funds intrusted to our care.

An extraordinary number of children have left the Home during the last two years, going either to relatives or to homes which, through the untiring efforts of the Board of Directors, have been procured for them, and wherever placed their deportment and energy has been of such a character that we have been overrun with applications for more of the kind.
