BIENNIAL REPORT.

OFFICE OF THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF STATE ORPHANS' HOME.
CARSON CITY, NEVADA, January 17, 1905.

To the Honorable the Legislature of the State of Nevada.

GENTLEMEN: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 1485, Compiled Laws of Nevada, the undersigned, Directors of the State Orphans' Home, herewith submit their report and that of the Superintendent of the Home for the years 1903 and 1904.

The Home is now, and has been since the last report, under the management of Mr. J. Josephs and wife, who are, respectively, Superintendent and Matron.

The children are comfortably clothed and abundantly supplied with good and wholesome food. They are kindly treated, and teachers are employed in their education, which consists of the branches usually taught in the public schools of the State.

The Legislature of 1903 appropriated \$38,000 for the building of a new Home. Bids were advertised for the building of the Home in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the Secretary of the Board. The contract was awarded to Messrs. Holesworth and Fowler, who were the lowest bidders, for \$36,654, the State to furnish the stone for the building. Before the contract was let the Board was assured by the Prison authorities that the stone would be quarried and prepared for the building by Prison labor. Subsequently it developed that the term of the prisoners who understood dressing stone had expired, and free labor had to be employed, at the usual wages for preparing the stone. This involved an expenditure of \$11,000, which, with an outlay for piping the building for a modern heating apparatus, necessitated the incurring of a deficiency of \$5,000 by consent of the State Board of Examiners, as provided by law.

Your honorable body is expected to provide for the payment of the deficiency, and also make an appropriation for furnishing the Home.

The new Home is pronounced by connoisseurs one of the handsomest and most substantial buildings in the State, and your honorable body is respectfully invited to visit it and see if you do not concur in this opinion.

The Board is of the opinion that about \$30,000 will be required for the maintenance of the Home for the years 1905 and 1906, as the prices of all the necessaries of life are higher than in former years. An appropriation for the payment of teachers' salaries will be necessary in addition to the above.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT.

To the Honorable Board of Directors of the State Orphans' Home.

GENTLEMEN: I herewith submit to you the biennial report of the Home, its management and expenses for the years 1903-1904:

THE NEVADA STATE ORPHANS' HOME

Is now thirty-five years of age, during which time 658 children have been admitted. In the last two years 21 children have been admitted, and 28 discharged; hence you will see that the movement of population has been about the same.

We have now 56 children in the Home—28 girls and 28 boys, 46 of whom attend our school. Their ages range from 22 months to 17 years.

The average number of children in the Home for 1903-1904 was 70. Net cost per child per day, 58½ cents. This shows an increase in the cost per child of 8½ cents per day more than it cost in the years 1901 and 1902. We attribute this increase to several reasons, the main of which is the advance of prices upon all articles furnished the Home, and the inconvenience sustained by reason of the destruction of the buildings and other appurtenances necessary for the most economical management. We can surely state to your Honorable Board that the little ones entrusted to our care have been abundantly and healthfully fed, with the very best and most wholesome food obtainable; they have been warmly and well clothed; they have at all times been surrounded with thorough cleanliness, and we feel assured that it must leave its impression on their habits in future life.

SANITARY.

In the thirty-five years of its existence, and with the number of children heretofore mentioned, raised in this Home, we have but four deaths recorded. We believe that the mere mention of this low rate of deaths is sufficient to convince one and all of the sanitary condition of the Home, and is surely marvelous.

HEALTH.

The health of the children has been extraordinarily good, for we have had no serious sickness. The children, as a rule, are enjoying robust health. The services of the medical profession have only been called when it was deemed advisable. Mrs. John Wagner, M.D., has been invariably called to attend the smaller children, and, when called upon, her services were prompt and attentive, with the very best results.

A. Huffaker, M.D., has been called to attend the larger children. I herewith annex his report, appertaining to his services, and general condition of the children:

REPORT OF ORPHANS' HOME.

PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

CARSON CITY, NEVADA, December 31, 1904.

To the Honorable Board of Directors of the State Orphans' Home.

SIRS: By request of the Superintendent, Mr. J. Josephs, I submit the following report of services rendered to children in the State Orphans' Home during the past two years:

1. I have been called occasionally to see children in the Home affected with minor ailments, such as severe colds, or some temporary derangement of the digestive organs.

2. I attended a number of children in the Home who were affected with a contagious skin disease known as *impetigo contagiosa*. By the careful attention of the Superintendent to the children so affected, with such assistance as I was able to render him, this disease was checked in a comparatively short time.

One child was brought to me with a superficial abscess over the left knee. This, I believe, was tubercular, but a cure was finally effected.

There is nothing else of importance to report. I have always found hygienic conditions at the Home first class. The general health of the children has been excellent.

DISCIPLINE.

The discipline of our children has been excellent, and their deportment and manners, both at home and abroad, compare favorably with any children of their ages.

ECONOMY.

We have been as economical as possible in conducting our household. Every department has been watched carefully, and no waste of any kind is permitted.

REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS.

The entire fencing of the Home property, which is in a most dilapidated condition, needs rebuilding.

The School House, before it is again used as such, needs special attention.

The boys' play-room, which is the two-story frame building saved from the fire, and which has been our living rooms ever since (now two years and a half) needs reshingling, the upper story papering, and the entire building repainting.

Many other things are needed about the premises.

THE NEW HOME.

The new Home is a structure of stone 90 by 122 feet, two stories of 12 feet, and a basement of 6 feet 6 inches in the clear. Its lofty appearance is an ornament to the State and a monument to the liberality of the people of Nevada. The building will be ready for occupancy as soon as it can be furnished.

APPROPRIATIONS.

The average number of children in the Home in the last two years has been about the same as the two years previous, hence we believe that it will require no less than \$30,000 for the maintenance of the Home for 1905-1906.

In addition to the above amount a liberal appropriation is needed for the clearing and filling of the grounds, laying 1,400 feet of sewerage, a team of horses, which can be utilized for doing the work of the Home, as well as for driving purposes, cleaning the artesian well, placing an adequate pump and motor, and many other repairs heretofore mentioned; also sufficient to pay the salaries of teachers.
