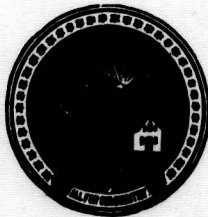

BIENNIAL REPORT.

OFFICE OF THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF STATE ORPHANS' HOME,
CARSON CITY, NEVADA, January 18, 1909.

To the Honorable the Legislature of the State of Nevada.

GENTLEMEN: In accordance with statute, the undersigned, Directors of the State Orphans' Home, herewith submit their report and that of the Superintendent of the Home for the years 1907 and 1908.

The Home is now and has been since the last report under the management of Mr. J. Josephs and wife, respectively Superintendent and Matron, who have endeavored to make the Home a real one for the little waifs that come under their care.

The children are comfortably clothed and abundantly supplied with good wholesome food. They are kindly treated, and teachers are employed to teach them in the branches taught in the public schools of the State.

Since 1887 there has been no instruction given in industrial and manual training for the boys, and they go out from the Home with very little knowledge of work of any kind. They have very little idea of what to do in order to support themselves.

It would be a great benefit to the boys if they could be taught trades of some kind so they could learn to use their hands, and not turned out into the world helpless, as it were, when they leave the Home.

In this respect the Indian children have greatly the advantage, for they are taught trades of different kinds in the schools established by the Government.

Of course it would be an extra expense to provide for industrial instruction for the children at the Home, but its importance is growing every year, and several of the schools of this State contemplate adding manual training to their courses of study.

There has been little or no addition made to the library at the Home since the last report, and there should be some appropriation made for the purchase of books for the children of the Home.

At this time there are nearly ninety children in the Home, and applications for admission to the Home are becoming more frequent.

The great increase in the cost of groceries and provisions of all kinds, the cost of fuel having increased greatly in the last two years, adds greatly to the cost of maintaining the institution.

We think that the request of the Superintendent of the Home for an appropriation of \$43,000 or even \$45,000 should be given earnest consideration. This amount is needed for the maintenance of the Home

for the years 1909 and 1910, with additional appropriations for teachers' salaries and for repairs and painting of some of the buildings.

In this report the undersigned has endeavored to give you the best and most complete picture of the Home as it is today in its various departments.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT.

To the Honorable Board of Directors of the State Orphans' Home.

GENTLEMEN: I herewith submit to you the biennial report of the State Orphans' Home, its management and expenses for the years 1907-1908. It has been arranged in tabular form, showing in detail what has been received, and how the funds entrusted to our care have been expended.

APPROPRIATION AND IMPROVEMENTS.

The sum of \$5,500 was appropriated by the last Legislature for necessary improvements, repairs, and furniture.

According to your instructions the boys' building has been moved to a safe distance from the new structure, which adds greatly to the appearance of the premises. The building has been set on a solid stone foundation. The latest pattern of Douglass closets, automatic urinal, bathtubs and wash sinks have been placed therein. All plumbing and connections have been done in a workmanlike and sanitary manner. An automatic flush tank has been connected therewith, cement floors put in, and forty lockers built in this building.

Six thousand two hundred and fifty feet of cement flooring and sidewalks have been put in. The barn and outhouse received new flooring. Screen doors and windows have been placed throughout the building. A new fence for the entire west side has been put up, and both front and side fence painted.

HEALTH.

The general health of the children has been excellent, although not altogether free from minor ailments, for as many as twenty or more were affected at one time with contagious diseases known as mumps, German measles, tonsillitis, and severe colds, and temporary derangement of the digestive organs; everything was done that could be done; physicians were called, and isolation and hygienic treatment were resorted to. All are now well and in robust health.

THE SCHOOLS

have been presided over for a number of years by Miss Jo Sullivan and Miss Jennie Summers. The usual branches given in the public schools are taught here, and the children, one and all, in their charge show the efficiency of our teachers. The report is herewith annexed:

POPULATION.

It is now thirty-nine years since the Legislature enacted a law establishing a home for the orphans, and up to the time of this report 757 children have been admitted and cared for.

Sixty-three children have been admitted, and 42 discharged since our last report.

We have now 82 children to care for, 47 boys and 35 girls. Their ages range from 2 to 17 years. The highest number of children cared for at any one time during the past two years was 86. Net cost per child, 67 cents per day.

There has been an increase of thirty-five per cent of children admitted during the past two years.

The children have all been well cared for, and supplied with wholesome and the best food obtainable.

ADVISABLE CHANGE.

It is our belief that it would be beneficial to the boys raised in the Orphans' Home of this State if the law were changed so as to make the age when the State can no longer care for them 16 years, instead of 18 as is now in vogue. The realization that he is brought up by the State makes itself manifest, for he never fails to speak of the desire to do something for himself at that age. At such time employment, or a chance for some trade, ought, and should be, procured for him by the Commissioners of the county from where he was sent.

REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS.

All the buildings except the new building need overhauling and painting, and the barn needs reshingling. We are in need of a cellar to keep our perishable supplies, and some machinery for a laundry.

APPROPRIATIONS.

The average number of children maintained is 82, and we do not look for a decrease. It will, therefore, require an appropriation of \$43,000 for the maintenance of the Home for 1909-1910.

In addition to the above amount an appropriation of \$5,000 is required for improvements and repairs, besides sufficient to pay the salaries of the teachers.
