BIENNIAL REPORT

OFFICE OF THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF STATE ORPHANS' HOME,
CARSON CITY, NEVADA, JANUARY 2, 1911.

To the Honorable the Legislature of the State of Nevada.

GENTLEMEN: In accordance with statute, the undersigned Directors of the State Orphans' Home, herewith submit their report and that of the Superintendent of the Home for the years 1909 and 1910.

The Home is now and has been since the last report under the management of Mr. J. Josephs and wife, respectively Superintendent and Matron, who have endeavored to make the Home a real one for the little waifs that come under their care.

The children are comfortably clothed and abundantly supplied with good wholesome food. They are kindly treated, and teachers are employed to teach them in branches taught in the public schools of the State.

Since 1887 there has been no instruction given in industrial and manual training for the boys, and they go out from the Home with very little knowledge of work of any kind. They have very little idea of what to do in order to support themselves. It would be a great benefit to the boys if they could be taught trades of some kind so they could learn to use their hands, and not turned out in the world helpless, as it were, when they leave the Home. Better training of the girls in the science of housekeeping is also imperatively needed. Both boys and girls should have the best training possible to fit them for the practical duties of life and for good citizenship.

In this respect the Indian children have greatly the advantage, for they are taught trades of different kinds in the schools established by the Government.

Of course, it would be an extra expense to provide for industrial instruction for the children of the Home, but its importance is growing every year, and several of the schools of this State have already added industrial training to their courses of study. We strongly recommend that the Board of Directors be authorized to secure for these orphans the industrial training needed, either at the Home or in the public schools of Carson City, if possible. The latter would, of course, be more economical, if the Carson City school authorities put in a plant for the city schools.

While Nevada has provided a beautiful Home for its orphan children, and has made ample provision for their physical comfort and needs, and, in a measure, for their mental training, it will be a positive discredit to the State if we longer fail to give them the training that is essential for them worthily and successfully to care for themselves in the great school of life.

There has been little or no addition made to the library at the Home since the last report, and there should be some appropriation made for the purchase of books for the children of the Home.

At this time there are 88 children in the Home, and applications for admission to the Home are becoming more frequent. We have had as high as 102 children in the Home at one time during the last two years; and the average number maintained for the two years has been 98.

The great increase in the cost of groceries and provisions of all kinds, the cost of fuel having increased greatly in the last two years, adds greatly to the cost of maintaining the institution.

We think that the request of the Superintendent of the Home for an appropriation of \$45,000 should be given earnest consideration. This amount is needed for the maintenance of the Home for the years 1911 and 1912, with additional appropriations for enlarged work recommended, for teachers' salaries, for repairs, and painting of some of the buildings, and for other necessary improvements.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the Honorable Board of Directors of the State Orphans' Home.

GENTLEMEN: I herewith submit to you the biennial report of the State Orphans' Home, its management and expenses for the years 1909-1910. It has been arranged in tabular form, showing in detail what has been received, and how the funds entrusted to our care have been expended.

APPROPRIATION AND IMPROVEMENTS

The sum of \$5,000 was appropriated by the last Legislature for improvements and necessary repairs. It has been spent judiciously by putting in a laundry, a new floor in the boys' building, extra wash sinks and Douglass closets. Extra furniture and school desks were purchased for the accommodation of the increase, and a new fence of 1,200 feet has been put up.

THE SCHOOLS

have been presided over for a number of years by Miss Jo Sullivan and Miss Jennie Somers. The usual branches given in the public schools are taught here, and the children, one and all, in their charge show the efficiency of our teachers. The report is herewith annexed:

HEALTH OF THE CHILDREN

During the last two years the services of physicians were required in a small number of accidental injuries. One boy was run over by a road wagon and sustained a fracture of the ankle, numerous cuts on face and arm, a badly lacerated ear and internal injuries. Another case was that of a boy who, while playing, fell off of a rafter and broke an arm. Another boy fell off of the bars and received a severe sprain of the tendon of the right knee. A number of minor injuries were attended to without calling a physician.

The diseases requiring most attention were three cases of typhopneumonia.

A number of cases of tonsilitis had to be treated. One a case of retropharyngeal abscess was particularly refractive. A number of cases of strumous diathesis, inherited, required the services of a physician. All, however, recovered and are now in good health.

POPULATION

During the past two years the number of inmates increased to over one hundred children, and the dormitories and dining-room proved too small for all to be accommodated. For these reasons the Board of Directors took steps to stop the increase by raising the price for the care of children, and reduced the number by compelling parents who were found to be non-residents of the State of Nevada to take their children from this Home.

The Home has been established forty-one years, during which time 806 children have been admitted and cared for.

Since our last report (December, 1908), 49 children have been admitted, and 42 discharged.

We have now 91 children in the Home, 45 boys and 46 girls. Their ages range from 2 to 17 years.

The highest number of children cared for during the past two years was 102.

Average number of children maintained, 98.

Cost per child per day, less salary of teachers, Superintendent and Matron, 61 cents.

Cost per child per day, including above-mentioned salaries, 71½ cents.

The children have at all times been well cared for, and supplied with the best and most wholesome food.

REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS

From the tabulated statement you will find that over \$1,500 has been expended for necessary repairs out of the maintaining fund, as the amount appropriated was not sufficient and the requirements were a necessity.


All the buildings need attention, the floors in the new buildings need oiling and all the other buildings need painting. A steel water tank of at least 10,000 gallons is wanted, and a modern barn and a cellar for perishable supplies are also needed.

APPROPRIATIONS

A greater number of children have been cared for in the past two years than ever before since the establishment of the Home, and no person can see into the future.

I therefore recommend an appropriation of \$45,000 for the maintenance of the Home for the years 1911 and 1912, and in addition to the above amount an appropriation of no less than \$4,500 for repairs and actual necessities, besides sufficient to pay the salaries of the Superintendent, Matron and school teachers.
